Every year, the academy invites three shortlisted charities to pitch to students to show why they should be chosen and Wycombe Food Hub were the successful charity this year meaning the school's fundraising efforts will now be directed to helping the hub over the next academic year.

Trevor Snaith, Chairman of Wycombe Food Hub said: "We are extremely pleased that The Highcrest Academy has chosen Wycombe Food Hub as its charity for this year. We look forward to working together to help those struggling with food poverty and food insecurity across High Wycombe." Last year, around £4,000 was raised for the Youth Enquiry Service through several different events such as non-uniform days, Xmas disco, staff raffles, coast-to-coast staff trek, five-a-side football, cake sales, sponge the teacher and much more.

Lisa Kelly, Youth Enquiry Service Manager said, "The Youth Enquiry Service would like to thank all students and staff for supporting us through 2022 and raising a staggering amount of money that will provide 100 hours of free counselling to the young people in our community." Wycombe Food Hub collects surplus ambient and fresh food, such as fruit, vegetables, dairy, baked goods and tinned products from supermarkets each evening, then make it available to the general public at affordable prices the next day.

Joe Clarke, Assistant Headteacher at Highcrest, said: "We are delighted to have chosen Wycombe Food Hub as our school charity. It's a wonderful cause and one I know that our students will be very committed in supporting with their fundraising throughout the year." The last few weeks have certainly been turbulent for the Government. I am hopeful the appointment of Rishi Sunak as Prime Minister will now see a period of stability. We need to support people through these difficult times. In the recent Autumn Statement the Chancellor raised wages for low earners, increased benefits and pensions by over 10% from next April, offered further direct payments to the least well-off, and gave every household support

with energy bills. An estimated 19 million families and 40 million individuals in Great Britain are expected to see an increase in their income next year.

I know the most pressing issue for most households at the moment is the economy and rising costs. I can understand why. I have been concerned for a long time about inflation. The Bank of England has clearly failed in its 2% inflation targeting; last year the Bank said inflation would be transitory after coming out of lockdown. I made it clear both in Parliament and in the media the result of the Bank's quantitative easing programme, which had indirectly funded the Government response to Covid, could only mean inflation would rise and continue to rise. I knew it would have a harmful effect on ordinary households by making prices higher, eroding the value of savings, and distorting investment decisions.

Most people will be concerned about the projected rise in energy costs. I have always been clear there can be an economically and politically viable path to Net Zero but we need a different approach, reducing emissions while being realistic about what can be engineered at reasonable cost to the British people. We need to think a little less about the targets, and much more about what people can actually afford.

You may have seen I have been appointed as the Minister of State in the Northern Ireland Office. I have a long-standing interest, and friendships, in Northern Ireland so I am delighted to have this opportunity to help promote peace, security and prosperity. My duties will require frequent travel to Belfast for official engagements but I will be principally based in Westminster, so I will continue to attend local events and represent the interests of Wycombe in Government. My constituency office will be open in the West Wycombe Road, High Wycombe and my staff are always happy to discuss any issues which constituents wish to bring to my attention.

May I take this opportunity to send season's greetings to everyone living in Terriers and Totteridge for Christmas and New Year.

Transport for the decade

With plenty of debate around the environment, global warming, congestion and other issues transport looks set for change in the coming years. New cars will be all electric, fuel cell or similar technology by the 2030's and e-bikes and electric scooters are set to become the "norm" with regards to personal travel.

By now we had expected that private e-scooters would be permitted but the decision to extend the current trial to 2024 means it will be a while yet before they are in mass use if that becomes the case. There have been many concerns regarding

these electric powered two-wheelers. They offer a quick and easy way to get around over short distances but their interaction with other motorised users and pedestrians is still the cause of some concern.

Household budgets for many people are severely under strain due to the increasing cost of living. We are seeing the cost of everyday essentials rise faster than average incomes leaving people with tough decisions about how to cover their bills. Whilst the cost of living increase could lead to an increase in crime, equally worrying is the impact crime has on the victim when finances are already tighter than usual. Victims of crime can find themselves anything from a few pounds to tens of thousands of pounds out-of-pocket.

Taking simple measures, such as locking your windows, leaving indoor lights on a timer, double or deadlocking your doors, and having exterior lights on sensors, can significantly reduce your chances of being burgled. If you are going to be away, perhaps you could ask a neighbour to park a car on your drive.

During the winter months we tend to see an increase in burglaries; this is due to a number of factors such as the hours of darkness being used as a cover for intruders to carry out thefts; homes and businesses being stocked up with higher value items and gifts for the festive season and people travelling and socialising leaving their homes vacant. As we rapidly approach Christmas and the subsequent sales, it's important to remain vigilant to scammers who unfortunately look to exploit the goodwill and festive spirit at this time of year.


LATEST SCAM: A number of recent cases have been reported to us of recorded phone messages being received that purport to be from banks, One such call came from Switzerland and another one was from Spain!

They refer to sizeable suspicious transactions that are to be debited to your account that same day. The messages invite you to press '1' if you approve of these transactions, or to press '2' if you don't approve them. It goes on to say that someone will speak to you if you press '2'. These messages are very similar to genuine messages from banks. So, do take care if you encounter them and do feel free to phone your bank to ensure that you are dealing with genuine messages.
