

# Highcrest students praised by Dragons' Den star for Portugal pitch

Eight students from The Highcrest Academy had to pitch to a star of TV's Dragons' Den as they battled for the right to be flown to a dream business trip in Portugal. The plucky Year 12 pupils were asked to present to a

panel which included Nick Coleman - an entrepreneur who won a £70,000 investment on the hit BBC 2 show for his company, Snaffling Pig.

The event at the end of April was organised as part of a programme called Bridge to Employment (BTE), run by healthcare giants Johnson & Johnson in partnership with Highcrest. The two winning contestants, whose names have yet to be revealed, will be flown to Portugal as Student Ambassadors at a Johnson & Johnson flagship business conference later this year.

Rob Evans, Careers Lead at Highcrest in High Wycombe, said: "This was a challenging and rigorous selection process. The students had to do a presentation on "Brand Me" - that is, they had to identify the skills they had developed from the BTE programme, how those skills would help them in the future and what made them special/suitable for attending J&J's corporate event in Portugal as a student ambassador."

Nick Coleman, whose Berkshire-based company specialises in pork snacks, was part of a panel with Mr Evans and Young Enterprise's Jackie Bryant. He said: "I was really impressed with the way the students presented themselves. Having done a pitch myself in a Dragons' Den scenario, I know full well how daunting this kind of presentation can be. For them to be able to present themselves so well at such a young age was a joy to see." Mr Coleman also delivered an insightful presentation on his experiences as an entrepreneur, how his business/brand developed and his secrets for success.

Rob Evans added: "It was a privilege to take part in this event. I was hugely impressed by the way our students rose to this challenge and demonstrated all the skills they had honed during the BTE Programme. They really slayed the dragons with their great business skills."

Neil Ashcroft, Business Unit Director at Johnson & Johnson, said: "J&J is proud of our mentoring programme which aims to inspire students to reach their full potential at school and to consider a career in healthcare and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). The Dragons' Den challenge really showcased how far The Highcrest Academy students have come since starting the programme, growing in confidence and feeling ready to take on their next challenge, whether that is in further education or employment."

#### **Summer Parasites**

With Summer fast approaching and the weather warming up, we're seeing an increase in pets suffering from tick infestations. Tick numbers are particularly high in countryside, urban parks and other areas of dense vegetation, especially where there are sheep, deer or even hedgehogs. The main problems associated with ticks are their ability to transmit diseases, such as Lyme disease, along with the potential irritation they can cause.

Once a tick finds a host, they will latch on, burying their mouthparts into the skin. At first, ticks are quite small and may be difficult to detect, but as they feed, they become bigger and bigger before finally dropping off the animal to start the next stage of their life cycle.

The best way to prevent ticks is to use an effective treatment prescribed by your vet or vet nurse. But if your pet does fall prey to a tick, never try to remove it unless correctly using an effective 'tick remover', as infection can develop if the tick mouthparts remain within the skin. If you feel unsure or uncomfortable about doing this yourself, your veterinary nurse will be happy to assist.

Unfortunately it isn't just ticks that your pet needs to be routinely protected against. Other parasites such as tapeworms and roundworms are common and easily transmitted from animal to animal through their poo and can even pass to humans. Fleas are also easily passed on and can infest the home reaching peak numbers in the warmer months. Finally, lungworm is a major concern for dogs with this potentially fatal parasite becoming more widespread across the country. ### Wycombe Half Marathon



### From Westminster to Wycombe -Steve Baker MP

I know how much people value the services of their local pharmacy. I was therefore pleased that amongst various consultations being undertaken by our local NHS a recent one on medicines saw doctors, pharmacists, carers and patients alike come together to discuss how to ensure

people receive the medicines they need in the most effective way possible. Members of the public told stories of leaving hospital with large numbers of drugs without knowing how to take them effectively, and others of storing drugs and equipment which kept arriving unnecessarily each month on repeat prescription. There is an increasing trend for pharmacy professionals to undertake reviews for patients to ensure they know how to take their medicines correctly, and to avoid one drug counteracting the effects of another.

At this meeting medical professionals underlined the importance of returning unused and expired medicines to pharmacies, but also stressed prescriptions should be checked before leaving the pharmacy as it was possible to reallocate any unwanted items at this stage, but not once they had left the premises. The local NHS' policy on medicines continues to be developed, and if you would like to contribute to the debate please let me know and I will pass on your comments to the relevant people or go to <a href="https://www.letstalkhealthbucks.nhs.net">www.letstalkhealthbucks.nhs.net</a>

In recent months I have attended some great local events, and this is one of the privileges of being an MP. Each year my wife and I attend the Gang Show put on by local guides and scouts, and it is always a pleasure to see the children enjoying taking part and combining new material with old Gang Show favourites. I also attended the annual dinner of High Wycombe Round Table, another pillar of our local society, bringing people together whilst supporting charitable causes both locally and nationally. The May Fayre on the Rye organized by the local Catholic church was blessed by brilliant weather this year and was another great success.

At the end of April I visited Red Kite Community Housing to learn more about its plans for three innovative new companies. Twenty11 will see homes rented based on a person's ability to pay and gives access to services designed to encourage independence and community involvement, whilst the establishment of a new property company (Edenmead) will build homes for sale with the profits subsidising other homes for low rent. A third company, Pennvale, will provide estate agency services including a lettings agency, which will manage market rent and affordable homes and offer a trusted service to both local landlords and tenants. I am excited the Twenty11 model will be the first of its kind in the country, and will hopefully help people to have an affordable home of their own.

### Working to help keep vulnerable people stay in their home

Helping vulnerable people to stay in their own home and avoid homelessness are top priorities for the council. The Private Sector Housing Renewal policy which covers all

mandatory and discretionary financial assistance was agreed at a meeting back on 12th March 2018.

The District Council continues to develop ways of helping residents with housing issues and was one of a small handful of local councils to be praised for its initiatives while reducing costs to the public purse. Healthy homes on prescription allows medical or social care practitioners to refer patients for simple, fast-tracked housing solutions to support independent living at home. This could for example include a stair lift or central heating system.

By preventing hospital admission and GP attendances the NHS is already saving £53,476 and social care £132,984 annually.

### Son fundraises for hospice in memory of the father he never met

The South Bucks Community Hospice was deeply touched by a fundraising gesture from a son in memory of the father he never met. Now, it is appealing for others to follow in his footsteps by becoming 'Hospice Heroes'.

Rob Cavanagh, 23, took part in a gruelling obstacle race in Kent recently as a fun challenge along with six friends. But he decided to use the opportunity to fundraise for The South Bucks Community Hospice as his way of saying thank you for the help the charity gave in 1994

to his late father, David.

"As a group of friends, we decided this challenge was something we were going to do. and I thought it was a really good opportunity to do some fundraising by asking people to sponsor me. I have never given anything back to the hospice for the help they gave to my dad and I thought it was a great chance to do that."

Rob never met his father, who died aged 36 from pancreatic cancer. David was looked after at the hospice, then at Pusey House in High Wycombe, in 1994. The hospice has since moved to Butterfly House in Kingswood Place, High Wycombe. Ben O'Keefe, Community Fundraiser for the hospice, said: "This is a wonderful gesture from Rob and we are humbled by the fact his gratitude for the help given by hospice staff endures after all these years. We are enormously grateful to him for still thinking of us and for donating this money to help other patients with life-limiting conditions."

Rob, a former pupil of Wye Valley School in Bourne End, lived in Terriers until a year ago, but has moved to Slough where he now works as an apprentice for Mars. He and his friends, who called themselves Tribe Warriors, took part in the Spartan Race South East Sprint and Super Weekend challenge on April 7, completing the course as a team in three hours and nine minutes. The course featured a series of challenges including climbing up a rope, carrying a bucket with weights in it and throwing a spear at a target - with a penalty of 30 burpees for missing. "We were absolutely shattered and were all complaining the next day." he said. "But we all really enjoyed it to the point we are signing up to do more of them."



# Local healthcare trust appoints first lead humanist chaplain in the NHS

Lindsay said: "I am delighted to have been appointed as lead chaplain and look forward to working with our multi-faith and belief team. Together, I know we can ensure people are able to receive the spiritual, pastoral and religious care that is right for them. We want patients, their families and staff across the Trust to know they can come to us for support in their time of need, irrespective of faith or non-religious beliefs."

Carolyn Morrice, Chief Nurse for the Trust, said: "Following a robust recruitment process we are pleased to have appointed such an outstanding, forward thinking and experienced candidate. Lindsay's appointment confirms our commitment to providing a chaplaincy service with individuals' choice at its heart, catering to all our patients, visitors and staff regardless of faith, denomination or religion, including those who have no faith or religion."

Chief executive of Humanists UK Andrew Copson said: 'We're delighted to see Lindsay appointed as the first humanist to lead a chaplaincy and pastoral support team. Our research shows that non-religious people want to be able to access pastoral care in hospitals that is provided by likeminded individuals and Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust's move is a big step towards making that a reality."
