The Doing Good Together Fund is designed to empower local Co-op site managers, allowing them to direct funds to causes that matter most in their communities.

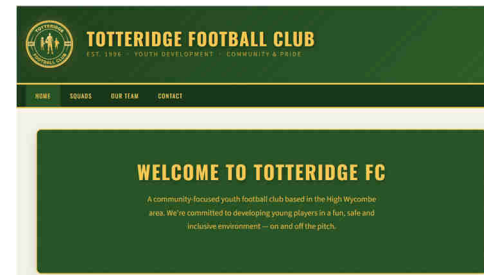
Connor Oliver, Manager of the Hazelmere Co-op food site expressed pride in supporting such an important group that through its work, keeps the community connected and said -

## Cycling in South Buckinghamshire

### Join your local Cycling UK groups this summer

Cycling UK has a number of local groups in South Buckinghamshire:

**South Bucks Midweek group** offers a selection of rides every Wednesday from easy paced, moderate to rides that are faster and longer. Most rides meet at 09:30am from local start points including Wendover, Great Kingshill, Cholesbury and Beaconsfield. A stop is included for elevenses at a local café or garden centre followed by lunch before returning home. There are also coffee Pots on Friday mornings and these include Princes Risborough, Chiltern Velo Café, West Wycombe and Bulbourne.

**Chiltern Cycling** offers led rides and coffee pots on Sundays with the focus on welcoming new members. Rides take place on quiet routes and include a coffee stop with most rides returning to the start point. There is a Zoom social on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday and Clubroom at Little Kingshill on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday 8pm to 10pm (Early July BBQ and no clubroom in August).

**Thames Valley Cycling** group offer led rides in the southern tip of the county and into Berkshire. There are led rides on both Wednesday and Sunday from local start points in Marlow, Bourne End, Maidenhead and Holtspur.

There is something for everyone of all ages and abilities with both pedal bikes and e-bikers welcome. Occasionally there is also a chance to do some off-road riding.

## Computing & Technology

I remember at university in the 1990s reading email on a screen that had only green writing on a black background. In those days, in the computer room, it was possible to mess up your neighbour's email screen by sending a command to their computer. Mr Bailey, in charge of the department's computers, said that to avoid interference, type in a certain command. Mr Bailey remarked, "There's nothing you can do about it, you just have to learn how to protect yourself".



Today, I think that web browser notifications are like that. What are web browser notifications? A web browser is a program used for looking at Internet web sites. Notifications are for users who want to know that a website has changed without having to go onto the website again.

For example, if you read your email on a website like Outlook.com (formerly Hotmail), a notification is a pop-up rectangle on the right hand side of the screen that says, you have a new email. Some shopping websites use Notifications to tell you about their irresistible offers.

Unfortunately, some bad websites misuse the Notifications feature to plague users with false advertising that claims there is something is wrong with their computer. Unless you know you want web browser notifications, turn them off. How:

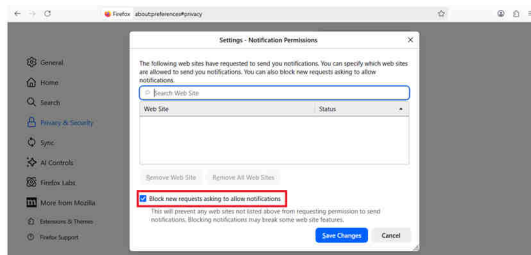
- In Mozilla Firefox: click the three-lines icon in the top right corner of the browser window, then Settings -> Privacy & Security -> Notifications. Tick "Block new requests asking to allow notifications". Click Save Changes.

- In Apple Safari on Mac OS: click Safari menu -> Settings -> Notifications. Untick "Allow websites to ask for permission to send notifications".

- In Google Chrome: click the vertical three dots in the top right corner of the browser window, then Settings -> Privacy and security -> Site settings -> Notifications -> Don't allow sites to send notifications.

- In Microsoft Edge: click the "... " button in the top right corner of the browser window, then click Settings -> Privacy, search, and services -> Site permissions -> All permissions -> Notifications -> Ask before sending: Off.

## Recipe Corner Almond, Olive Oil & Picota Cherry Cake

Makes: 1 X 120cm cake (8-10 slices)

### Ingredients:

-200g ground almonds	-60g plain flour
-1.5 tsp baking powder	-1/4 tsp fine salt
-3 large eggs, at room temperature	-150g caster sugar
-120ml extra virgin olive oil (choose a smooth one)	1 tsp vanilla extract
-1 lemon, zest only	
-150g Picota cherries, washed, pitted and halved	

### Poached Picotas:

-200g Picota cherries, washed and pitted (leave whole)	
-80g caster sugar	-25ml water

### To serve:

clotted cream

### Method:

1. Preheat the oven to 170°C (fan 160°C). Grease and line a 20cm cake tin.
2. In a bowl, combine the ground almonds, flour, baking powder and salt.
3. In a larger bowl, whisk the eggs and sugar for 1-2 minutes until lighter and slightly thickened.
4. Whisk in the olive oil, lemon zest and vanilla. Fold in the dry ingredients until just combined. Fold in the halved cherries.
5. Pour into the tin and level the top. Bake for 50 minutes, until golden and a skewer comes out clean (a few moist crumbs are fine). Cool in the tin for 10 minutes, then cool fully on a rack.
6. Put the sugar and water in a small pan and bring to a gentle simmer. Add the whole pitted cherries. Simmer for 2-3 minutes—just enough to soften slightly and turn glossy. Take off the heat and let them sit in the syrup for 5 minutes. Cool.
7. Slice the cake and serve with a spoonful of clotted cream and a few poached Picotas with a little syrup over the top.

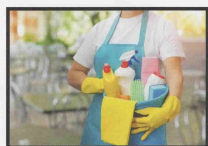

## Proposed new Special School

Buckinghamshire Council failed to obtain funding for a new 152 place Special School in Buckinghamshire for children with social, emotional, and mental health (SEMH) needs. The council provided the governments Department for Education with detailed and powerful evidence which demonstrated the urgent need for the new school. The government has instead offered a much smaller package to expand existing special schools.

## Biodiversity Gain bring new benefits for wildlife

Residents across Buckinghamshire are set to benefit from greener spaces and an improved natural environment as the council reaches a major milestone in its Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG).

Buckinghamshire Council has now secured its seventh habitat bank through a section 106 agreement marking a significant step forward in enhancing the county's natural environment. More than 100 hectares of land across the county are now committed to habitat creation and enhancement.

From Steeple Clayton to Beaconsfield the council's work with landowners is helping to establish a network of high quality places.

## Strengthening Focus on Town Centre Growth

Buckinghamshire Council recently attended the UK Real Estate Investment and Infrastructure Forum 2026 as part of its ongoing work to strengthen the long term focus , delivery and growth of town centres across the county. The forum took place in Leeds between 19th and 21st May bring councils, government, investors and other partners together.

The launch of this will take place in Aylesbury town centre as the first step in a wider approach to apply to other town centres across the county. While no decisions were taken at the event the forum provided an early opportunity to hold discussions and test ideas. Any further proposals will be subject to normal governance, engagement and decision making processes.
