Wycombe Hospital is close to many people's hearts. I was glad to visit recently and congratulate staff on their accreditation as an elective surgical hub, recognising high standards in clinical and operational practice. Surgical hubs, which are separated from emergency services, are part of plans nationally to increase

capacity for elective care with more dedicated operating theatres and beds. The hubs exclusively perform planned surgery and mainly focus on six specialties – ophthalmology, general surgery, orthopaedics, gynaecology, ear nose and throat, and urology. Hubs bring together the skills and expertise of staff under one roof delivering shorter waits. Wycombe Hospital is one of 31 hubs to date accredited. This is great news for local people waiting for an operation, and I am now working to have a new building on the hospital site.

There is good news on tax and National Insurance contributions for those in employment. From 6th January, the National Insurance rate for employees decreased from 12% to 10%, giving people more money in their wages. Also, taxes for the self-employed will be cut and reformed from April. Class 4 National Insurance contributions for the self-employed will reduce by 9% to 8% and no self-employed person will have to pay Class 2 contributions, saving the average self-employed person £350 a year. I'm expecting there to be more changes to personal tax when the Budget is announced on 6th March.

Getting more people into work and ensuring it remains a key priority for the Government is important for growing the UK economy and managing inflation. Getting more people into good jobs helps raise living standards, gives security and allows people to flourish. The Government recently launched a £2.5 billion Back to Work Plan, helping up to 1.1 million people with long-term health conditions, disabilities or long-term unemployment to look for and stay in work. The scheme also includes benefit sanctions for those who do not take this up.

For those who use public transport there is Government help with fares. On most bus routes the fare has been capped to ± 2 until the end of this year. It's available on Carousel and Arriva buses and might well offer a saving if you were thinking of a day out somewhere, or just to get around the town.

Do you live in an Easy Street?

Guess how many burglaries there have been in Hazlemere and Tylers Green in the last few months? Hint: We are in double figures already!! Easy Street is any street that criminals find inviting due to security and maintenance. Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses and flats. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force.

-Point of entry is gained by using ladders, garden furniture or drainpipes. -Burglars will enter through a bedroom window to gain access to the upstairs. -Jewelry seems to be the main target, however all valuables are at risk.

DISTRACTION BURGLARY: Distraction burglars will pretend to be someone they are not, so it's important you are aware of the common methods used:

-Pretending to be from a care agency, the council or a utility company.
-Seeking help to leave a note for a neighbour or asking for a drink of water.
-Claiming to be in a hurry and needing to get into your home quickly.
-Working in teams, with one person distracting while other searches your home.
