



Jackie Ward, Chief Executive Officer of South Bucks Hospice, looks back five years ago this month to the official opening of the charity's new headquarters at Butterfly House in Kingswood Park

It's astonishing how time flies because I can hardly believe that it's been exactly five years since we opened our wonderful new Butterfly House building.

Readers may recall we were based for many years at Pusey House on Amersham Road in High Wycombe as well as Cedar Barn in Hazlemere. But we moved in 2017 to bring all of our services under one roof in a more modern spacious environment on the site of the former Kingswood School.

On 5th September of that year, we officially opened Butterfly House with a memorable ceremony attended by trustees, friends and dignitaries. And, I am pleased to say, we have never looked back since – even though Pusey House was an excellent venue, moving to this great building was one of the best things we have ever done.

Butterfly House is spacious and modern and – best of all – gives our patients and their families a warm and welcoming atmosphere, providing help and companionship in their hour of need. Unlike Pusey House, it has a large and easily-manoeuvrable car park – a small point perhaps for some, but vital to those who need easy access to a hospice.

It's worth noting just how welcoming the local community has been to us here – and, thanks in part to T&T News, we have recruited many a volunteer from the immediate area.

Since opening at Butterfly House, we have been able to offer new services such as bereavement listening and been able to run lymphoedema treatment under the same roof as our other care support services. Now, we are looking to widen our services to provide more group activities, such as yoga, breast cancer and

prostate cancer support and advance care planning for those nearing the end of life.

Butterfly House regularly provides day support for patients with life-limiting illnesses. We help people with palliative care needs at any stage of their diagnosis to adjust physically, psychologically, socially and emotionally to their condition. (Cont. p8)



Services for patients include treatment for pain and symptom management, lymphoedema management, counselling, physiotherapy, complementary therapy and a wide range of support groups.

One of the things that strikes me is that patients are always telling us how much they like the atmosphere at Butterfly House. Those seeking care are often apprehensive about what they will find in a hospice – but many are pleasantly surprised by the relaxed and welcoming atmosphere in our spacious building, and they look forward to attending their next visit.

However, I suspect many local people don't know much about us, or have even had a chance to visit us, since we opened five years ago. That's why we are holding an open afternoon for all of the community on Wednesday 21^{st} September from 1pm until 5pm where refreshments will be served and tours will be available.

Parliament has been in recess for the summer, and MPs go back to Westminster on 5th September. The start of the new parliamentary year will be dominated by the result of the Conservative Party leadership election which will see a new Prime Minister taking office along with the appointment of ministers. It is possible a new Chancellor may decide to hold a mini Budget to reset Government fiscal policies.

The opinion pollster, You Gov, tracks people's concerns on a regular basis. At the moment the most important issue is the economy. I can understand why. I have been concerned for a long time about inflation. The Bank of England has clearly failed in its 2% inflation targeting; last year the Bank said inflation would be transitory after coming out of lockdown. I made it clear both in Parliament and in the media the result of the Bank's quantitative easing programme, which had indirectly funded the Government response to Covid, could only mean inflation would rise and continue to rise. I knew it would have a harmful effect on ordinary households by making prices higher, eroding the value of savings, and distorting investment decisions.

We need to support people through these difficult times. I am clear tax cuts are the best way to help so people can have extra money to spend on the things most important to them. It is interesting to see the two leadership candidates for the Conservative Party seem to largely agree with me and have identified tax and inflation as the most important issues in their campaigns. Liz Truss has made clear that she wants to review the mandate that the Bank of England has over interest rates.

Many people will be concerned about the projected rise in the energy caps which will now be reviewed every three months rather than six months, on top of the rise that has already happened. I have always been clear there can be an economically and politically viable path to Net Zero but we need a different approach, reducing emissions while being realistic about what can be engineered at reasonable cost to the British people. We need to think a little less about the targets, and much more about what people can actually afford.

I know many people want to go on holiday, especially as overseas travel has been so problematic for the last couple of years. My staff have been busy helping people obtain passports for travel, as there are currently long delays applying for a new passport or renewing an old one. We can't always promise to be able to get a passport in time but we can certainly promise to try our very best. If you are experiencing problems with the Passport Office please contact the constituency office and we will do what we can to help. I hope everyone had a lovely summer holiday this year whether they were staying in England or going abroad.

Neighbourhood Watch engagement with the Muslim community with in High Wycombe

Local Neighbourhood Watch "NHW" schemes work in a variety of ways that reflect the needs of the local community. This includes: sharing crime prevention advice, supporting vulnerable people and increasing the voice of the community with councils, the police and other organisations.

It has been estimated that the Muslim population in High Wycombe is of about 20,000 to 25,000 people, the equivalent of a moderate sized town within the town of High Wycombe. Consequently, Wycombe District Neighbourhood Watch Association felt it was necessary to take special steps to introduce NHW to so many people.

Representatives of the mosques in Micklefield, Rutland Avenue in Castlefield, Jubilee Road in Oakridge, and Townfield House in Totteridge Road have all signed up as Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators; the same applies to the one Shia mosque.

The Secretary of the Wycombe Islamic Mission & Mosque Trust, which oversees the four main mosques above, has already become a valued member of our committee.

On 5th May, Stan Jones, Chairman of Wycombe District Neighbourhood Watch Association, and Geoff Pegg, its Director of Operations, had a MS Teams meeting with Anisa Shaikh, the new Communities & Diversity Officer of Thames Valley Police in South Buckinghamshire. We talked about our relationship with the mosques and with Dosti, the Asian ladies' group, as well as our crime prevention work.

Stan Jones and Geoff Pegg have also been instrumental in arranging table displays on NHW and crime prevention outside the four main mosques in High Wycombe, overlapping Friday prayers. These table displays began on 23rd July 2010 and, to date, they have taken place on 95 occasions.

A further plan that has developed with the support of the Chairman and Secretary of the main mosques has been to establish NHW 'umbrella' groups for members of the mosques so that they can join NHW, regardless of whether a scheme exists in the roads where they live. The first four of these 'umbrella' groups were established in 2015 and 2017, with the most recent one relating to the one Shia mosque in High Wycombe, whereas the others relate to the much larger Sunni community.
