Community Sentencing

Community Sentencing has been around some time. It is however something generally we know and hear little about. It offers an alternative to prison for offenders but can it really be effective? This question and others were recently discussed at the Neighbourhood Watch meeting held at Godstowe School on 13th November.

When an offender is sentenced a number of facts are taken into account by the Magistrate or in the case of a Crown Court case, for more serious crimes, the Judge. The facts can include such things as current circumstances, previous offences and the likelihood of re-offending. If the offence is relatively minor and the person who committed the crime is unlikely to be a risk to the public then a community sentence may be considered. A community sentence is not an easy option and can include one or more requirements such as:-

Unpaid work, Supervision, Curfew, Residence, Drug rehabilitation, Specified activity, Prohibited activity, Exclusion, Mental Heath treatment, Alcohol Treatment, Attendance centre (Not in Thames Valley), Programmes.

The Probation Service oversees all of these requirements. Part of an offenders punishment is to make them look at ways of changing their behaviour and reducing the risk of committing another offence. Protection of the public is of utmost importance and the Probation Service works closely with the Courts, Police and other agencies to ensure this is the case.

The Probation Service also works with those released from Prison under a parole licence. Under parole an offender is allowed to leave prison to serve the remainder of his or her sentence in the community. This can be under some strict requirements and any re-offence or breaking of the conditions can see a return to prison.
