Can adopting a more Positive Attitude change your life?

I believe all of us deserve to be happy. Different things make each of us happy, and sometimes we don't fully know or remember what those things are. I have personally made the journey from being miserable and depressed to being happy and valuing life in all its simplest forms, and I know that such transformation is possible and is easier to achieve than you may think.

There are a lot of interpretations of what positive attitude is, and I would like to explain what I mean by it. I know from my own experience that it is possible to train your mind to consistently focus on positive pieces of information and put less focus on the negative ones. I received the following feedback from a participant of my recent Positive Attitude Workshop: "the exercise helped me to recognise that my life is meaningful". What changed for this person between the beginning and the end of the workshop was their perception. Our perception is critically significant when it comes to having a positive attitude.


Another important component of having positive attitude in my opinion is understanding how we get personal power and there is a great philosophy that is at the heart of this. 20% of our problems come from the outside world, and 80% of our problems originate within us. If we can address those 80%, our life will change beyond recognition.

The third important component of positive attitude is about being constructive. Being happy and being problem free are two separate things. It is about being constructive, in the right way, at the right time, when it comes to dealing with problems.

Our perception, taking personal responsibility and being constructive are the three very important components of positive attitude, and this is what I teach during my workshops.

Policing & Neighbourhood Watch Update

The winter months are traditionally the time that crime, in particular burglary increases. Helped by the cover of darkness thieves can more easily break into unsecure homes. Ensuring you are not a victim by taking some simple security measures such as ensuring all doors and windows are secure, a light left on, alarm set if you have one and nothing outside such as a ladder will all make another property more attractive than yours.

In Totteridge & Bowerdean the current neighbourhood priorities are:

- 1. Theft from and of Motor Vehicles
- 2. Anti Social Behaviour
- 3. Drugs

In October this area also saw a rise to six burglaries. Hillview and The Quadrant were the hotspots for three instances of Motor Vehicle crime. Bowerdean Road, St Hughs Avenue and Hennerton Way meanwhile were all areas of Anti Social Behaviour.

In Terriers & Amersham Hill the current neighbourhood priorities are:

- 1. Anti Social Behaviour
- 2. Drugs
- 3. Parking

Anti Social behaviour has been a particular problem around Wellesbourne Crescent and Kingshill Grange and is currently a high priority area for local Police patrols.

Parking has particularly been an issue on Green Hill whereby cars and other vehicles are completely blocking the pavement making it hazardous for pedestrians.

A "Have your Say" meeting is currently been planned. Two venues have been identified as Wycombe Library or Kingshill Grange.

Work is due to start on the new hospice on the site of the former Kingswood School in January 2015. The planned duration of the construction is two years with the new hospice expected to be ready for use in 2017.

The project was given a welcome boost from a legacy of £1.8 million but there is still substantial fundraising still to do. As with all building projects costs are rising and undoubtedly there will be hidden extra costs that will need to be covered. Many people in the local community have already purchased a paving stone for the butterfly walk and these funds will be ring-fenced for the pavers and their words of hope.

The final cost of the new hospice which will bring world class day care services is expected to be around £3 million. There is still therefore the challenge of raising a further £1 million and then there will be the cost of fitting out the building. On top of the building work there will on-going costs and services to cover.

News from Westminster to Wycombe - Steve Baker MP



Readers of Terriers and Totteridge News will know the local health service is my top local concern. I have spent many hours speaking-up for local people and trying to get the services they would like at Wycombe Hospital. One issue which drives people towards using emergency hospital services and A&E is the difficultly they often encounter with getting an appointment with their local GP. To make sure people get the best service and treatment possible from GPs the Government has given power to the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to examine GP

surgeries and to ensure they are effective, responsive and caring.

In November, the CQC issued it Intelligent Monitoring Report of GP practices in High Wycombe. Each practice has been categorised into one of six bands for inspection, with those in Band 1 requiring the most urgent attention. Five practices in the town were placed in band 6, which is good, with the Kingswood Surgery in Hollis Road rated as 4. The CQC highlighted concerns at this surgery over patient involvement in their own care, the time it took to be given an appointment and the satisfaction over opening hours. I'm sure the staff at the practice will be working hard to address these issues and will want to give everyone the best care possible. However, I feel findings such as these only underline my view that there should be a casualty unit staffed by GPs at Wycombe Hospital where people can simply turn-up and be seen out of normal hours and given the treatment and reassurance they need.

Turning to my work in the House of Commons, I should like to tell you about a debate I led on money creation and society. When I was preparing for this I was amazed to learn the subject had not been discussed in Parliament at any length since 1844 when Robert Peel was Prime Minister under Queen Victoria. The subject appeals to MPs from across the political spectrum: my debate was supported by Caroline Lucas (Green), Michael Meacher (Labour), David Davis (Con) and Douglas Carswell (UKIP). Many people are wondering if our economy is working as it should, and the Prime Minister recently spoke about the world's experiment with quantitative easing, which has now ended in the UK and the USA, but which is continuing in Europe and Japan. He will be ministering in Terriers for about a year, following a curacy in Datchet and some time in the diocese of Oxford's partner diocese in the Church of South India. He is settling in very well to his new role and brings a range of gifts and experience from both his previous parish and his career before ordination.

News from St Francis New readers begin here:

The parish church of St Francis of Assisi in Terriers is a well-known feature of the Wycombe skyline. It was designed by the eminent 20th-century architect Sir Giles Gilbert Scott and is generally reckoned to be among his finest designs for a parish church. However, its exposed position at the top of Amersham Hill means that it has suffered greatly from wind and rain in the 84 years since it was built. In the autumn of 2012 the first phase of a major programme of restoration was completed. This involved extensive repairs to the church roof, as well as



significant improvements to the gutters and drainage system. Since then the congregation has been raising funds and applying to grant-giving bodies for the finance to enable work to start on Phase 2. **Now read on**:

Church life at St Francis has been in something of what the playwright Sean O'Casey once described as "a state of chassis" since the end of July when contractors moved in to begin work on Phase 2 of the Restoration Project. For the past three months the church building has been closed and the congregation has been worshipping in the Church Hall, sharing space with the many other local groups and organisations which use the Hall as a venue. During their absence, the interior of the building has been transformed by Novus Property Solutions, under the direction of architect Tony Mealing of GMTW. This work has been carried out with the help of a generous grant from The Heritage Lottery Fund (St Francis is a Grade II* listed building) and funding from The Bucks Historic Churches Trust as well as local fund-raising by members of the congregation and the occasional gifts and legacies from well-wishers who were shocked to discover this fine example of 20th-century church architecture on English Heritage's "At Risk" register.

Despite this generosity, the church has had to dig deep into its modest financial reserves in order to complete the project. Any readers of "T and T News" who would like to contribute to this work are asked to contact the vicar, Canon Tony Dickinson, at St Francis Vicarage in Amersham Road.

At the time of writing, work on the downstairs rooms (principally the choir vestry and sacristy) has been largely completed; the work of stripping out and replacing damaged plaster in the sanctuary and choir area has been carried out successfully, and the whole church has been redecorated. Steps have also been taken to reduce the impact of storms like those of last winter, when torrents of rain, blown by gale force winds into the tower, found their way into the body of the church. Plans for the renewal of the church's lighting are awaiting formal approval but preparatory work for their installation is almost complete. When all this work has been completed, and a thorough clean undertaken, the congregation will move back into the building. At the time of writing, this is scheduled for mid-December, and members of the congregation are looking forward already to welcoming Christmas visitors in their own building, with the ravages of 80 years' weather repaired and the interior of the building restored to something like its state in the 1930s.

New members sought for fundraising group

New members are being sought for a group of fundraisers who support lain Rennie Hospice at Home, part of Rennie Grove Hospice Care.

The charity is extremely lucky to receive support from a number of groups who organise their own events to raise funds. The High Wycombe and Amersham Fundraising Group is now keen to find new members to help their team.

This group was formed in 1992 by Ted Collins who wanted to continue fundraising for the charity after choosing it as his charity of the year when he was mayor of High Wycombe. He raised an impressive £65,000 during his year in office. He remains chair of the group which has a regular and varied programme of events which have raised in excess of £500,000 to help fund the charity's hospice at home nursing service.


