
## Welcome Support For T & T News


Unfortunately Lindsay lost his battle with heart disease in February 2007 and my sons suggested holding an annual concert in his memory to raise money to continue the work Lindsay had started a few years ago with a wholesale music company. Between them they had provided instruments to Ashhill School in Micklefield and the teachers were given instruction how to teach a room full of very young children to play musical instruments in a group situation. It meant that all children had an opportunity to play and not just those whose parents could afford it. All those involved agreed that after a few sessions the children were much better behaved and their concentration levels rose.

We have already had a Jazz evening at a Club in Ascot and a Dinner, Dance and Auction at Hughenden Village Hall to raise money for our big event on 12<sup>th</sup> JULY 2008 at the Wellsbourne sight of BCUC. ## News from your local churches....

# THE MILLENNIUM OF THE BIRTH OF ST. WULSTAN, 1008.

In recent years we have become quite familiar with "millennia" and we, in St. Wulstan's parish, High Wycombe, are celebrating a millennium of our own. It is 1,000 years since the birth of St. Wulstan, Bishop of Worcester (1008 to 1095). Interestingly, he was the only Anglo-Saxon bishop to survive in office after the Norman Conquest of 1066.

Our parish in High Wycombe is named after him because in the year 1076 Bishop Wulfstan – to give him his Anglo-Saxon name – came here to consecrate All Saints church in the town. Bishop Wulstan, known for his holiness and kindness, performed many miracles and among other things ended the trade of Saxon slaves to Ireland.

To celebrate we a have a millennium banner up on St. Wulstan's Church, Totteridge and Bishop Peter of Northampton visited us on January 19<sup>th</sup>, St. Wulstan's feast-day. The whole parish came together for a shared lunch to which ex parishioners from far and wide came and was a huge success.

But the celebrations don't stop there. We don't actually know St. Wulstan's birth date so we have the rest of 2008 to mark both that and his visit here. In May there was a talk in All Saints Church, by Dr .Julia Barrow, of the School of History at Nottingham University, on the life of St. Wulfstan of Worcester. Dr. Barrow is an expert on medieval bishops and has cowritten a book about St. Wulfstan. We will be running a painting competition for children later in the year with the winning pictures of St. Wulstan going up in the Eden Centre new library.

We also have a play called "St. Wulstan – the Saint Who Came to High Wycombe" written by a local retired teacher, being performed by the children of Loakes Park and St. Augustine's Schools in All Saints Church on July 9<sup>th</sup> at 2.0pm. We have two bishops coming to see it; Bishops Peter Nott and Doyle. A jolly hymn to St. Wulstan will be sung at the performance. All Saints, in the centre of High Wycombe, has a very good exhibition about the church and St. Wulstan, with a carved wooden statue of him.

Worcester Cathedral congregation, marking the millennium with special events, has invited us to their Heritage Open Day, focused on our saint, on September 13<sup>th</sup> and we will be running a coach there. So, as you will see, we are really making merry this millennium year!

# **Totteridge Social Club**

Renovation work at Totteridge & District Social club has begun on the exterior of the building, in conjunction with the National Probation Service. The service, which supervises unpaid work by offenders, have been helping at the club since April. Working in the grounds to take advantage of the better weather, the service has undertaken a wide range of work, including completely replacing the fence at the front of the building as well as a new set of gates. The partnership with the NPS is set to continue as more renovation plans are finalised in the coming months. The Thames Valley Partnership donated £500 to the charity to help with materials for the probation service when they are working at the centre. With all the support from the local community, the will of all seems to be that the club should move forward as a community centre.

The Totteridge & District Community Centre Ltd was incorporated in March 2008, and was granted charity status in April. To get the charity off to a flying start, several local councillors have donated money from their ward budgets, which will be used for admin and utility costs moving forward. Unfortunately, there are a number of legal issues to work through before the council funds can be released, the charity is working hard to resolve these. This has delayed the renovation plans, but it is hoped a way forward can be reached in the coming months. In the meantime, there are plans for events at the centre throughout the summer, so look for news of events coming soon – and if anyone has any ideas about events we can hold to raise funds for the charity and the club please get in touch.
