### South Bucks Hospice

CEO Tony Hardware has announced that he is to retire after nearly 28 years with the charity. Tony was a key member of the original trust board with the charity founder Edie Pusey back in December 1985. Together with trustees, volunteers and supporters they started fundraising and by 1989 had raised enough to start a home-care nursing team. The team continued with their hard work and by 1994 Pusey House at South Bucks hospice was opened on Amersham Hill. This has been to base of the hospice to date.

The Minister for Care and Support, Norman Lamb recently announced the allocation of  $\pounds$ 60 million of funding for hospices across England to improve the physical environment in which they provide care. The Department of Health awarded 176 grants and South Bucks Hospice received £150,000 towards the build of its new hospice. The addition of this grant has pushed funds over the halfway mark towards the £1 million target.

The Hospice's Spring Fair that was held on 20th April raised over £2000. Children favourite Peppa Pig made an appearance and everyone was in good spirits as the sun shone and the music played. Thanks to everyone who came along to the event.

South Bucks Hospice will be holding a quintessentially British Garden Party on Saturday 8th June 2013 between 2pm and 5pm in Knotty Green. One of the hospice's main supporters has kindly donated her garden as a venue for the afternoon. # News from Bucks County Council - Val Letheren updates us on her work.....

Thanks to all those who voted to me to continue to serve you as your County Councillor for Terriers and Amersham Hill. I look forward to working with all residents on issues where the County Council is responsible for a further 4 years. My contact details are below.

Thanks also for the good response we had on the proposed traffic calming scheme we had for Green Road. This was extended for the whole of the road as far as The Ridgeway and the officers are amending the scheme having considered the various ideas suggested by residents to arrive at the most acceptable plan to reduce traffic speed. I have also asked for a 20mph limit to be considered now that the department of transport has eased up on the conditions where these can be installed. I am sure there are other residential roads where this might be appropriate.

I attended a meeting with residents of Highworth Close and the' Living Streets' team who are looking to see what line improvements can be made in the road outside the school to prevent inconsiderate parking in the area around the school by parents. I understand that the School is doing all it can to ask parents to consider the safety issues. While I was canvassing form door to door last month I was pleased to meet many residents and I shall do my best to address the concerns they raised to me.





# News from Wycombe and Westminster Steve Baker MP

Those following news about local hospital services will know Sir Bruce Keogh, Medical Director of the NHS Commissioning Board, is investigating death rates in Buckinghamshire NHS Trust hospitals. I met Sir Bruce recently and chaired a meeting in the House of Commons for all MPs who are affected by similar investigations in their own area, which range from Hartlepool to Colchester. I was impressed by Sir Bruce's understanding and commitment to uncover the facts behind the statistics; his findings will be published in July and I have every confidence his report will be thorough and fair.

I have met Jeremy Hunt, the Secretary of State for Health, to make him aware of the problems constituents face with regards to healthcare in Wycombe. In light of reports of serious urgent care failures at the hospital, scrutiny from both Sir Bruce and the Secretary of State is welcome. I have campaigned at both local and national levels for improved access to quality healthcare for constituents in Wycombe. Local people pay for their healthcare through taxes and they rightly expect a better service than is currently available.


Although I was only 19 when Margaret Thatcher ceased to be Prime Minister, I was sad to learn of her death in April. I grew up with the transformation she delivered in our country and across the world. It was only after a year in Parliament that I began to realise against what odds and opposition she had succeeded. I was honoured to have been one of the 2,000 guests to attend her funeral in St Paul's Cathedral. It was clear from the wide range of nationalities, backgrounds, and political persuasions of those who attended the funeral, that she enjoyed global respect as a stateswoman.

One policy area I know Margaret Thatcher would take a great interest in would be this country's future involvement with the European Union. Those who take an interest in my voting record in the House of Commons will know I have a history of rebelling on European matters, and indeed, signed The People's Pledge for a referendum. This is why I am pleased the Prime Minister has stated he will renegotiate this country's relationship with the EU and allow a referendum vote.

Where possible, I continue to give support to a number of local community activities in the constituency. In April, I spoke at the Neighbourhood Watch AGM held in Totteridge; I saw Wycombe Wanderers play one of their last matches of the season on 27th April when they drew one all with Port Vale; I was the guest speaker at the Round Table annual dinner at the cricket club – this is the third consecutive year I have been invited and, as they keep asking me back, I think I must be saying something interesting! I have also been entertained at the Wycombe Gang Show and by the High Wycombe Choral Society at one of its concerts. Both had singing of a high standard, performed with great accomplishment, but possibly the guides and scouts slightly outdid the Choral Society on sheer enthusiasm.

Zibusiso is one of three employees running a small food-processing centre in rural Zimbabwe. It was set up with the support of Christian Aid partner Dabane Trust and is invested in by local people. Zibusiso's work includes preserving the excess fruits, nuts and vegetables brought in by farmers – ensuring that there is food available for the community throughout the year.

# **Summer in Totteridge & Terriers**

This spring and summer are proving a time of change for the churches in Terriers and Totteridge. At the end of May the congregation at St Wulstan's Catholic Church said farewell to their Parish Priest, Fr Innocent Abonyi, who is moving to a parish in Gravesend (Kent). His last Mass at St Wulstan's was on Sunday, 26th May. Fr Innocent will be replaced by Fr Joseph Udoh, who is, like Fr Innocent, a member of the Missionary Order of St Paul. He arrives at the beginning of June from the parish of Our Lady of the Assumption in Deptford, where he has been Assistant Priest alongside Fr. Eustace Durugbo. Another important change at St Wulstan's will be the ordination of Paul Priestley as a permanent deacon at St Augustine's Catholic Church in High Wycombe on Saturday 20th July. Paul (who is married) will continue in his secular employment at the same time as serving the church and the wider community in Blessed John Henry Newman parish. At the parish church of St Francis of Assisi on 12th May the congregation welcomed The Revd Tim Stacey as their new Associate Priest. He will be working in the parish alongside the Vicar, Canon Tony Dickinson, during the next twelve months.

Amid these changes the life of both churches continues. At St Francis, the next "Messy Church" will take place in the Church Hall in Amersham Road on Saturday, 15th June from 4.00-6.00 p.m. "Messy Church" is a way of being church for families, especially those with young children. It begins with an hour of messy play and craft activity on a theme which is taken up in a short act of worship. It ends with a shared meal. This summer the families of "Messy Church" will be hosting the church's summer Garden Party. This will take place on the afternoon of Saturday, 20th July.

Earlier in the year the congregation at St Francis Church succeeded in raising £2450 to support the work of "Rosie's Rainbow Fund". The Fund was established in 2003, after the tragic death of eleven-year-old Rosie Mayling. While in the John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford, Rosie had decided that, when she was better, she would put on shows to raise money for sick children in hospital.

Following Rosie's death, her parents Carolyn and David, and her sister Ellie, set up Rosie's Rainbow Fund. Rosie's spirit lives on in the work of the fund through its programme of support to families and children affected by illness, disability and bereavement. Rosie's Rainbow Fund supports sick and disabled children in hospital, school and in the community. Its activities include:

Music therapy at the John Radcliffe Children's Hospital, the Royal Berks Hospital, and Stoke Mandeville Hospital;

Massage for parents of long stay & seriously ill children;

Music therapy sessions for special needs children in the community;

Bereavement support for families after the loss of a child;


