Older children (and active adults) will enjoy the assault course and the unarmed combat display. There will be a coconut shy, golf putting and a number of arena events which include a dance troupe, a display by the minis from the HW Rugby Football Club and another from under 12s footballers.

Refreshments will be available all day and there will be a beer tent. The stalls are always busy and boast cakes, plants, toys, teddies, CDs, books and fancy goods. There will be tombolas, "bat the rat" and a Grand Prize Draw – win £1000.

Back by popular demand this year is the local band **Jus'Chillin**. This popular group, whose members all hail from the Seychelles brought the house down last year with their mix of rock, reggae, blues and jazz. They will be performing during the course of the day and they take requests. The annual May Fayre on Holywell Mead has been organised for over 20 years by St Augustine's Catholic Church on Amersham Hill. Funds raised this year will go towards the building fund for the lift recently installed. This lift now provides easy access from the church to the large meeting room above the church. Various town groups use the "Upper Room": the Brownies and a Mother and Toddler Club are two of the most popular. So no more climbing up stairs with prams and equipment plus we are delighted that people in wheelchairs can now get up there too.

The May Fayre on Monday 4th May starts at 11am and finishes at 4pm. Entrance is from Bassetsbury Lane (there is a commercial fair at the town end – not us). Terriers and Amersham Hill N.A.G.

The recent meeting held over at the Royal Grammar School on Monday 23rd February attracted around 100 local people. The N.A.G. has been concentrating on three top priorities in the area. These were identified by residents as....

- 1. Speeding and anti-social use of vehicles
- 2. Parking
- 3. Burglary

Speeding raised the most comments directed at Neighbourhood Police Sergeant Simon Johnson. Three roads have been identified as having a problem. Totteridge Road has 58% of drivers exceeding the limit while in Green Road it was 45% and Lucas Road 39%. Speeding was also felt by one resident to be an issue on Green Hill where there has been some monitoring of vehicle speeds by PCSO's.

Val Letheren, County Councillor, answered a question regarding speed humps and their effect. At the county council Val's remit includes responsibility for roads and she said speeding around residential roads could not be addressed by simply just installing humps.

Other issues raised included parking. This has been a particular problem along the Hughenden Road and those roads close by. Parking near schools continues to be a problem and the council is working to encourage schools to achieve higher levels in the safer routes to schools initiative.

Burglary contunies to be a problem across the area. A recent one was flagged up in Hughenden Road where it appears the perpetrators are coming through from the houses in Roberts Road. There was concern expressed by several victims of burglary as to how they had been dealt with by Police Officers following break-in's at their homes.
