Council Tax represents good value

A recent survey by Thames Valley Police revealed that 58.4% of residents believe the current level of council tax for Police services across the region at £151.27 per for a band D property represents value for money. A further 15.3% responded 'Don't Know' and 26.4% felt it did not represent value for money.

The on-line survey was conducted between 26th January and 3rd February and was e-mailed to over 21,000 residents. Nearly two thousand people responded. Of those prepared to pay an increase 18.5% would pay another 1%, 32.6% would pay 2% and 36.5 would pay 3%. A further 12.4% were prepared to pay more than this.

T & T News receives funding

Totteridge and Terriers News is pleased to announce we have recently received some additional funding for the community magazine. Councillor Joey Foley has made available £560 from his ward community budget toward the costs of publishing the magazine.

The money will be used so we can increase the number of copies printed enabling us to increase coverage in the Totteridge Ward. Currently T & T News has a print run of 3,250 and from our summer 2010 edition this will increase to 3,500 copies. Some new roads will be introduced with this edition following our increase in copies for the Winter edition.

Visitors to the Town Centre could see rapid change

Consultation has been taking place on a draft Local Development Order (LDO) which aims to stimulate businesses by cutting planning red tape. The planned area is the old medieval centre of the town that includes parts of White Hart Street, Church Street, Bull Lane and a small stretch of Oxford Street.

Local Development Orders are a relatively new planning tool which allow for certain prescribed development to take place without the need for planning permission. Wycombe District Council plans to have its Town Centre LDO in place in the spring making it one of the first local authorities to adopt this innovative approach.

The type of premises the order would apply to include A1 (Shops), A2 (Financial and professional services), A3 (Restaurants and cafes), A4 (Drinking establishments), A5 (Hot food takeaways), C1 (Hotels), D1 (Non residential Institutions) and D2 (Assembly and leisure)

Totteridge Community Centre

The new look community centre re-opened its doors on Totteridge Drive on Friday 4th December 2009. The charity set up by a group of residents and chaired by Councillor Foley has spent the last two years working to gain ownership of the land and transform the building into a new Community Centre open for all.

It began at an open meeting early in 2007 attended by both local district councillors who presented those present with the option of either rallying round to save the community facility or allow the former social club owners to dispose of the land probably for housing development. A group of residents stepped forward to offer their personal time and commitment to save the facility. The councillors meanwhile were key to arranging a grant of £49,500 to cover the costs of refurbishment and to bring the building up to modern standards.

It has taken nearly two years to overcome the logistical hurdles and legal complications. The issues were finally resolved by the end of summer last year enabling Wycombe District Council to begin releasing funds of the arranged grant.

Since the opening of the centre a new floor has been completed this year. This essentially completes the internal renovation work and attention will now focus on the outside. The car park has suffered from the weather during the winter and the club plans to completely re-shingle it. Help is needed with fundraising and at a later date no doubt to do the work.
