

Terriers Evening W.I.

In December we celebrated our actual 50th birthday. We were regaled with Christmas stories and poems by Peggy Batchelor who amazed us with her energy especially as we learned she was 95. We heard alternative versions of the 12 days of Christmas. It had never occurred to us how inconvenient all those gifts were particularly a load of messy birds.

In January, Mrs Patience told us about the lives of women and girls in India, focusing on the work of Joe Homan who set up Boys Towns and subsequently Girls Towns in order to give the Street Children a home and education, therefore a better chance in life.

Many of you will be familiar with the sight and sound of the Air Ambulance. In February, Len gave us some insight in to its operation. It was launched in 1999 with a £14 million donation. The funding gradually dried up and the Government were unable to help. The service is now funded to the tune of £124,000 per month by sponsorship and fund raising. They attend, on average, four road accidents a day and save lives by being able to reach the victim within the Golden Hour, the first hour after the accident. Remember them when you pass a clothes recycling point for the Air Ambulance or a donation box. It serves our local areas.

At this meeting we were told that a day had been set aside to raise awareness of the Country Women Worldwide Association which is affiliated to the W.I. It strives to help women accross the globe. There is to be a world wide sponsored walk Initially it was hoped to link the walks but this proved too difficult so it is hoped that for 24 hours women will be walking somewhere in the world to celebrate this event.

It has been back to school for some of us, to be precise school dinners. To help the school where we meet and the W.I. to get to know each other, four of us at a time have shared a school dinner with four pupils and a teacher. This has been a truly delightful experience. The children have been good company and have looked after us very well. We even enjoyed the dinner!

Local News Round Up (2)

450 Years and Counting

Living in High Wycombe, you will almost certainly have seen two things: the Royal Grammar School's imposing 1960s brick and glass building on the corner of Hamilton Road and Amersham Road, and the ruins of the Hospital of St John down on the A40. Did you know these two buildings are related?

In 2012, the RGS celebrates its 450th birthday. Way back in 1562, Queen Elizabeth I signed a Royal Charter enabling the provision of a Grammar School for the young men of the Wycombe area. The arches you see on the A40 were where the school was then situated. The Hospital of St John had long since been taken over as a school house and had been providing education for a small number of boys in its rooms. 1562 marked an official turning point for this small school and from them on, the numbers have grown to almost 1400 boys, both boarding and day pupils. The Victorian building you now see nestled behind those ruins also housed the school, in early Victorian times before then being used by John Hampden and now as commercial offices. In 1914 the masters and pupils migrated up the hill to a beautiful red brick building on land formerly owned by Lord Carrington with a clock tower donated by Coningsby Disraeli. The rest, is history.

Now in 2012, and at the vintage age of 450, the RGS is celebrating its history and is hosting a series of events for all to enjoy, whatever your connection with the school or the local area. Beginning with a free lecture by Olympic broadcaster Philip Barker in March, the current 'master', staff and pupils welcome you all to a gala year. From family fêtes to balls, concerts, car shows and talks – get involved!

New Footpath set for Public Enquiry

A new public footpath which would be created by a Definitive map Modification Order looks set to be decided at a public enquiry. The path between Windsor Drive and Sheraton Drive has been a private pathway since the estate of flats was built back in the 1970's. In recent years the pathway has been secured by a gate and this led to an application by a Sheraton Drive resident for an order. The order is supported by a number of residents in Sheraton Drive, Amersham Hill Drive and Arnison Avenue.

However, T & T News understands that ahead of the deadline for objections on 3rd February 2012 a number of residents, flat owners and the freeholder of the land made formal objections to Buckinghamshire County Council. The order was made on 25th October and advised to interested parties on 7th December 2011.

Both objectors, who if the application goes through will have a public path across their gardens, and the applicant and supporters now have a further wait until the issue is resolved. Meanwhile the path remains closed to public use.



During Lent the parish of St Francis is supporting the work of Parkinson's UK, raising funds for research and raising awareness of this condition. Anyone who would like to know more about how they can help is asked to contact Canon Tony Dickinson in the first instance.

During these weeks there will be a number of special events and services. On Saturday, 17th March, at 4.00 p.m. in the Church Hall, Messy Church will pay tribute to St Patrick, with messy play, and craft activities leading up to a short celebration of the Saint and ending with a shared meal. On Sunday, 18th March we keep Mothering Sunday with a service for all ages at 10.00 a.m. This will be followed on Monday, 19th March by a celebration of fatherhood at 8.00 p.m.

On 1st April we will begin our main celebration of Palm Sunday with a procession from the Church Hall. This will be followed, not by our usual service for all ages, but by a retelling of St Mark's account of the last days of Jesus's life. There will be a special session of "Club Francis" in the Church Hall for children aged 3-13. This reaches a climax on Thursday, 5th April when we commemorate The Lord's Supper with a service at 7.00 p.m. This act of worship takes place in the context of a meal, so booking is essential. Friday, 6th April is Good Friday. Instead of our usual pattern of worship there will be a special Messy Church in the Church Hall, beginning at 10.00 a.m. Those who prefer a more traditional way of marking this most solemn day are invited to share in The Last Hour at 2.00 p.m.

On Saturday, 7th April we prepare for Easter with a Vigil in the Church Hall at 8.00 p.m. On Easter Day itself we begin with a sunrise service at 6.00 a.m., after lighting the new fire we shall hold a candle-lit procession. This will be followed by a simple breakfast and an Easter egg hunt for children and young people. At 10.00 a.m. there will be a service for all ages.

Surrounding all these special events the routine life of the church continues, with the Julian Meeting for meditation on the first and third Monday evenings, Keep Fit in the Church Hall on Tuesday afternoons during school term, the simple bread and cheese lunches for Christian Aid in the Church Hall on Fridays during school term, a walk in the countryside around Wycombe ending with a pub lunch on the first Saturday of each month, the monthly Sunday pub lunch at "The Terriers", mid-week services Wednesdays at 10.00 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

We shall hold our Annual Church Meeting on Sunday, 22nd April after the Parish Communion (around 11.30 a.m.). This will be followed by a Parish Lunch. On Monday, 23rd April we shall celebrate **St George** with a special service at 8.00 p.m.

On Sunday, 13th May Christian Aid Week begins, and collectors will be going out from many of the churches in our town, including St Francis, to collect money to support the world's poorest people. In the middle of that week on Thursday, 17th May we keep Ascension Day with a special service at 8.00 p.m. and on Saturday, 19th May, Messy Church at 4.00 p.m.

On Sunday, 27th May Christians celebrate the gift of God's Spirit at Pentecost. Members of St Francis will join more than forty other congregations for a special celebration "Love Wycombe", at 11.00 a.m. in the town centre. This will follow a simple said Communion service at 9.30 a.m.
