From the 6<sup>th</sup> April 2016, it will become compulsory for all dogs in England and Wales to be microchipped and their details up-to-date on an authorised database.

It is every owner's worst fear to find their beloved pet lost or stolen and there is on average over 250,000 animals reported lost in the UK every year and a microchip dramatically increases the chances of being reunited with lost pets.

Breeders will be required to microchip puppies from eight-weeks-old before they transfer to their new keeper after which it is the new owner's responsibility to change the registered keeper's details.

The new law will be enforced by police and local authorities who will be issued with microchip scanners. A short period of time will be given to anyone caught with a dog that isn't microchipped after which a £500 fine will be issued for non-compliance.

Microchipping is a simple procedure performed by a licensed and trained professional such as a veterinary surgeon or nurse. A needle is inserted into the scruff of the neck and a small rice grain-sized implant is injected under the skin. To get your dog microchipped before the deadline, please contact the practice to make an appointment on 01494 443075.

## From Westminster to Wycombe - Steve Baker MP



Defence of the realm is the primary purpose of government. Without peace, strong borders, law and order, civil society and freedom cannot flourish. I believe everyone is equal before the law, and should be treated without fear or favour. There have been a number of local stories in the news recently which have shown this is not something about which we should be complacent.

It was announced in the last few weeks that High Wycombe has been selected as one of nine new areas to receive assistance to tackle gang and youth violence. I am advised we do not have an entrenched gang problem here in High Wycombe, but welcome this intelligence-led preventative work and think High Wycombe will benefit from tailored

support from experts to better understand the nature of gang-related violence and exploitation, identify opportunities for collaborative working and share effective ways of tackling local challenges.

Buckinghamshire County Council has recently agreed to a number of recommendations to prevent child sexual exploitation in Buckinghamshire. These recommendations have the potential to be a real step forward in the prevention of this evil criminal activity. I welcome the commitment of the Council to these new measures, and whilst the report itself focuses on prevention, we must also consider the wider issues of detection and prosecution. I stand ready to assist the Council, the police and other institutions in the protection of children.

I am in regular contact with the Superintendent at High Wycombe police station, and we discuss issues to do with crime and disorder in the constituency. In early January, I met Francis Habgood, the new Chief Constable, and expressed my confidence in Thames Valley Police. There will be elections in May this year for the Police and Crime Commissioner, and I hope you will participate and vote for the candidate of your choice.

I know the railway line runs very close to houses in the eastern part of High Wycombe, and a number of constituents have been in touch about noise from trains. I have raised this directly with both Chiltern Rail and Network Rail, and have been told 13 freight trains pass through the High Wycombe section of track each day. I am waiting on a Freedom of Information request to see how this has changed over the last two years and will then decide what more can be done. If you have thoughts on this please contact me. At the same time, I want the best possible service for rail users in Wycombe, and know many constituents use Chiltern Railways to commute to work. In the autumn Chiltern Railways began running a new service to Oxford, which has meant changes to the timetable but has also led to questions about punctuality. I have raised this directly with the Managing Director of Chiltern Rail. Details of the questions raised at the meeting and Chiltern Rail's response will soon be on my website (stevebaker.info).

## News from the County Council

The bad news is that there has been a large reduction in grant this coming year from central Government which has led the County Councils cabinet proposing a council tax increase of 3.99%The Council wants to keep key services as robust and viable as possible especially for our most vulnerable residents. The rising costs of looking after our ever increasing numbers of elderly has caused the government to allow council to raise council tax by an extra 2% to pay for this each year as well as the 1.99% already planned. I think this is very unwelcome at this moment in time ,but in the light of the big cuts in our usual grants from government there is little choice for the Council if it is to continue its key services. The Council has gone out to public consultation and the results showed an increased concern regarding services to vulnerable children and adults. It seems that most councils in the Country are facing similar difficulties. However in keeping with the wishes of residents from the consultation the Council aims to commit £15m to its Highways maintenance budget again this year.. After all the rain we have had this Autumn and Winter I am sure that this is necessary.

You will remember me writing about the work my select committee has done in conducting an inquiry into child sexual exploitation which is a most horrible crime and is still happening in Wycombe as well as other areas in Buckinghamshire. The police have done a great deal to fight this and the select committee presented its report recently to Cabinet with almost all of the recommendation we made being accepted. It is important that the signs of this happening to young girls and boys are recognised and reported immediately. The full report is published on the County Council website.

I am sure that we all worry sometimes about our memories! In Bucks over 6,500 residents have been diagnosed with dementia and the Alzheimer's Society have been awarded a contract for a new service to start on April 1<sup>st</sup> which aims to offer 1-1 support for individuals and their carers, from their early concerns about memory loss , through diagnosis to planning for the future. This has been commissioned by the County Council and the Bucks clinical commissioning Groups so that early concerns can be quickly identified and support given promptly if required .

Spring is nearly here and the snowdrops and crocuses are in bloom at last. Even although there have been few nights below freezing Winter does seem to have been long and we all look forward to brighter days which will soon be here. I am sorry to be the bearer of grim news this time but it is part of my responsibility to inform. I hope that soon the economy and all that goes with it improves for us all.


