Touch down in Wycombe to learn how to play American football



Residents can enjoy all the excitement of the US Super Bowl in High Wycombe without any of the physical clashes the sport is renowned for.

Flag Football, a non-contact version of American football, is being played every Thursday evening at John Hampden Grammar School - and is open to all over-16s of any sporting ability for iust £2 each.

The sessions, running from 7-8pm, are being coached by Buckinghamshire Wolves American Football Club. The evenings are organised by Leap, the Sport and Activity Partnership for the area, on behalf of Buckinghamshire County Council's Active Bucks project. "We're offering all the fun of American Football without any of the hits," explained Leap Director Mark Ormerod.

"This is a great opportunity for people to learn about this fantastic game which is becoming more and more popular in the UK. National Football League (NFL) fixtures will be taking place at Wembley Stadium and Twickenham later this year, so here's your chance to really find out more about this fascinating sport first-hand in High Wycombe, What's more, initiatives such as this are wonderful in that they work for all levels of ability and are suitable for people who are not necessarily fantastic at sport."

Coaches from the Buckinghamshire Wolves - based around Beaconsfield - will be in attendance at the sessions at the school in Marlow Hill. There is no need to pre-book because people can simply turn up and join in.

Flag football is a version of US and Canadian football where the basic rules are similar to those of the mainstream game. But instead of tackling players to the ground, the defensive team must remove a flag or flag belt from the ball carrier.

Mr Ormerod added: "Leap's message for 2017 is that people in Bucks need to be more active for the sake of their health. This is a fantastic way to look after your health and have fun."

South Bucks Hospice

More volunteers needed as Hospice prepares for new era

Volunteers are being urged to come forward to help patients with life-limiting conditions as South Bucks Hospice prepares to move into a stunning new £4.8m building.



The charity is on course to move later this year into a 15,000 square foot three-storey property in Totteridge, High Wycombe. However, more volunteers are needed to carry out various functions which support the care services.

Dee Baverstock, South Bucks Hospice's Volunteers Co-ordinator, explained: "We have a great team here but we still need volunteers everywhere. We are looking for drivers, gardeners, collection boxes collectors, receptionists, and people who simply are good at meeting and greeting. "You don't have to have any special medical expertise to volunteer, because all skills are welcome and can be used by us for the benefit of our patients."

Former nursery nurse Elaine Merrilees is one such volunteer who says that helping out at the charity has benefited her by enriching her life. Elaine, 57, a mother-of-three from Hughenden Valley, has volunteered at the hospice as a day services assistant for four hours every Tuesday since April 2015. "I have made a lot of friends here among staff and patients and do feel I have made a difference," she said. Now Elaine urges others to follow her example. She added: "If you are thinking about volunteering then give it a go because there are so many opportunities".

By the middle of 2018, it is projected that 650 to 800 people a month will be using the new hospice building.

People can volunteer from as little as two hours a week.

From Westminster to Wycombe - Steve Baker MP



Those who are interested in Brexit will know the House of Commons has conferred on the Prime Minister the authority to trigger Article 50 of the Lisbon Treaty, which starts the process of leaving the EU and, as I write, it is currently being debated in the House of Lords. When we leave the EU, we will remain the same outward-looking, globallyminded, flexible and dynamic country we have always been. Great Britain is open for business. This is a new chapter for Britain and there will be both opportunities and challenges ahead. But because of the decisions this Government has taken, the British economy is fundamentally strong and will continue to be strong as we negotiate our departure from the

EU. Employment is at a record high - and the budget deficit has been reduced by almost two thirds. The UK grew faster than any other major advanced economy in 2016, and the Bank of England upgraded its forecast for UK growth in 2017. As we move into a period of negotiation with the EU, there may be some adjustment as the economy responds, but the UK is well placed to deal with the challenges, and take advantage of the opportunities, that lie ahead. As experienced international trade negotiators have told me, our prospects are bright.

As well as making a success of Brexit, the Government has a plan to build an economy that works for everybody. At the Autumn Statement, the Chancellor set out how we will continue to bring down the deficit and live within our means, provide support for our economy through investment and job creation, and go further to help ordinary working people with the cost of living. I look forward to further announcements in the Budget on 8th March.

Recently I asked my wife to photograph a huge series of potholes when we were driving around Handy Cross so that I could report it to be filled [http://transportforbucks.net/ report-it-pothole.aspx]. A few days later I was pleased to learn the Secretary of State for Transport had announced additional funds for road repairs.

Buckinghamshire has been allocated 4852,000 for its pothole fund, which is over and above the sums already announced for 2017/2018 to help repair our local highways.

In April, every NHS trust will have a legal duty to charge overseas patients upfront unless they can prove they are eligible for non-urgent care. The Government has no problem with overseas visitors using our NHS as long as they make a fair contribution, just as the British taxpayer does. The Government aims to recover up to 4500 million a year by the middle of this Parliament, which can then be reinvested in patient care.


St Albans Half Marathon

How you pay for Parking has changed

From Saturday 25th February the way motorists pay for parking in council run car parks changed. With the exception of The Swan and Easton Street Multistoreys parking will be on a pay and display basis.

The ANPR system has been removed due to restrictions on access to data from the DVLA. This is despite positive conversations the council had directly with DVLA about using ANPR in its car parks. The government has been working on a package which includes wider ANPR usage in the public sector but there is currently no clear timetable when this will be introduced.

In the meantime please remember that in most council car parks in the town to pay and display a ticket when you park your vehicle.

How to Organise your computing - Today there are many options and each of us has different needs. Here I provide a simple overview of different devices and where they may be best put to use.

Tablets & Large Smart Phones - These devices work well for internet browsing, simple emails or texting type applications. They are good for running personal applications such as music, maps, games, camera & photos. They are not good at office type jobs where typing or printing is the main task. For rigorous internet research a laptop is better.

Chromebooks - These sit in-between Tablets and Laptops. Unless you have a specific reason to use one, I suggest sticking to either a Tablet or a Laptop.

Laptops & Desktops - These will do a similar job of work. Clearly laptops are portable, while desktops need more space. Desktops are preferred in a work situation. Be careful when buying new laptops as many do not have removable hard drives or even batteries. Some makes such as Lenovo have issues.

Where to Purchase?- Unless you know a reliable source, I would strongly suggest you purchase from a top resource such as John Lewis and not from the large retail chains, as these do not always provide good advice or products but concentrate mainly on low price. Setting up new devices - This is paramount to your success! The manufacturers set up your new device for *their marketing needs*, most settings will need adjustment to make

Reaching out

Fifty years ago Bob Dylan sang that "the times they are achanging". For many people those changes were to be welcomed. Half a century on, we can sing those words again, with equal truthfulness but without the same confidence that the changes that are happening will bring us to a better place. People are feeling vulnerable. Accept-

ed ideas and ways of behaving are under attack. Those whose job it is to uphold the rule of law are lambasted as "enemies of the people" simply for doing their job. People who have come to power promising to end the lies of politicians are themselves lying with a much greater brazenness than any of the people they criticise. People are beginning to think again about the ancient question, "What is truth?"

Two thousand years ago the foreign governor of a small country under military occupation asked that question of a man who had been brought before him as an enemy of stability and a threat to the established order of things. The governor asked the question, but did not wait for an answer. Under pressure from the mob gathered outside his headquarters, he gave it what it asked for. He condemned the man to death, however reluctantly, and let someone else, a convicted terrorist or a "freedom fighter" depending on your perspective, go free.

Christians believe that the answer to the governor's question was standing before him. The man he condemned to death, Jesus of Nazareth, reveals truth; he is truth. By his self-giving and his acceptance of the death suffered by the lowest criminals, Jesus reveals the truth that there is no situation so desperate that God is not part of it, even when God appears nowhere to be seen. By his resurrection, Jesus reveals the truth that there is no situation that God cannot transform.

During the weeks of Lent, the people of St Francis invite all who share a concern for truth to explore the truth that Jesus reveals, the truth of the God who is totally committed to humanity in love and compassion, however we may name him, the God who suffers with us and for us. That is why, each week from 1st March until the middle of April, St Francis Church will again be offering a series of "**drop-in quiet days**", space for anyone who wishes to explore the truth of God's love for them. Each **Thursday** up to and including 13th April the church will be open from Morning Prayer at 9.30 a.m. until Evening Prayer at 5.30 p.m. for people to read, to pray, to be still, to light a candle, to rest consciously in God's presence. You don't have to commit to the full day. Simply drop in for as long or as short a time as you can spare. There will be resources available to help visitors use that time. People will be around to offer guidance or to answer questions, but they won't force themselves on visitors uninvited.

Each NAG usually identifies three key priorities for the policing team to address with the assistance of the community.
