News from your local churches....

An autumn invitation From St Francis Church, Terriers

The summer holidays have passed all too quickly (and damply!) and life is returning to its regular routine. Exotic visitors on their way to or from the Lambeth Conference have passed through Terriers in July and August, reminding us you shouldn't believe everything in the newspapers or hear from the lips of broadcast journalists. The Church of England and the world-wide Communion of which it is part are alive and well, despite the best efforts of secularist militants to write it off.

Accordingly, people in Terriers and Totteridge are warmly invited to "come to church" on Sunday, 5th October, to thank God for the life of St Francis of Assisi in the church on Amersham Road which bears his name. Old and young will be welcome, whether at the traditional Prayer Book service at 8.00 a.m. or the Parish Communion at 10.00 a.m., when the church choir and the children of the junior music group will combine to lead our praises. Refreshments will be served afterwards and there will be an opportunity to view an exhibition about the life of the local church, to meet old friends and to make new ones.

Before then, on Sunday, 14th September, "Club Francis" will open its doors with a grand launch party in St Francis Church Hall, Amersham Road. The club will be open every Sunday at 10.00 a.m. (except the first Sunday of each month) for young people aged 3-13. Music, craft and drama will be among the items on the menu.

There will be Prayer for Healing with the laying on of hands and anointing for those who wish, at the 10.00 a.m. Parish Communion on Sunday, 14th September (Holy Cross Day). On Monday, 22nd September, a new venture, "Question Time", has its first session at 8.00 p.m. in the Vicarage. This is an opportunity for all those with questions about God, faith, any aspect of the Christian life in 21st-century Britain, to explore them with others who are on the same journey. On Saturday, 27th September, our traditional Harvest Supper will take place in the Church Hall. Harvest Thanksgiving follows the next day. Val Evans will be our preacher. As usual, we will be collecting tea, coffee, soap, cereals, tinned food, razors, soap, toothpaste, etc., for Whitechapel Mission's work with street people in London's East End. There will also be a retiring collection for the charity "Farm Africa".

Underpinning all this activity with serious study, members of the congregation will be taking part in "The Big Church Read" in September and October, as they read and reflect on the book "Tokens of Trust" by Archbishop Rowan Williams of Canterbury. This introduction to basic Christian belief is being made available to church members (and any others who are interested in learning more about the faith which has formed much of British culture over the centuries) at the special price of £8.99.

Wycombe Neighbourhood Policing Team clamp down on speeding and anti-social drivers

A series of operations by neighbourhood policing teams to target speeding and anti-social road users in Wycombe has resulted in fines and seized vehicles across the district. The crackdown came after residents in Amersham Hill, Terriers, Bowerdean and Totteridge neighbourhoods identified speeding and anti-social use of vehicles as their main concerns.

Local NAG's (Neighbourhood Action Groups) identified Green Road, Lucas Road, Totteridge Lane, Hicks farm Rise and Hilary Road as the focus for a Speed Indication Device (SID). This is a non-threatening way of encouraging drivers to observe the speed limit for the benefit of community safety and quality of life.

The neighbourhood policing teams, which are dedicated to tackling crime and quality of life issues in Wycombe, have successfully targeted speeding and anti-social drivers by carrying out the following actions:

- Since June, Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) have conducted 25 SID operations in Bowerdean & Totteridge and 29 in Amersham Hill and Terriers.
- 2. The Neighbourhood team continue to work along side Roads Policing and Special Constables to enforce speed limits in the area. A number of drivers have received a £60 fine and three points. Others have been reported to court or arrested for offences such as driving whilst disqualified.
- In excess of 25 vehicles have been seized for offences including driving without insurance or driving in an anti-social manner. Other drivers have been warned, which may result in further seizure.
- Road safety signs have been put up in Amersham hill and road markings have been repainted in Green Road so as to furether improve safety.
- PCSOs organised a poster competition with students from Highcrest School to raise road safety awareness within the community. Students (aged 12 and 13) submitted entries in order to win prizes including a Nintendo WII which was donated by John Lewis.

The neighbourhood policing team continues to identify and address the current community problems and concerns. If there are any issues you need to discuss then contact the team at Wycombe Police Station via the non-emergency number 08458 505505.
