"Police, Please!"

"Be quick - some kids are stealing my stuff!" We watched in amazement that first night of the August riots, as people walked through the smashed shop windows of Tottenham and helped themselves, as the Police stood and watched. I have always admired the police but they sometimes puzzle me.


A few years ago, if you'd come up our close, you might have seen a police car and an ambulance outside our house. The two (women) drivers went to the same church as us. The police woman's patch was Terriers and Totteridge and she said our road was the best place to pick up radio signals. The ambulance driver was in between (non-999?) calls. We had a nice chat and a coffee. But I thought it a bit odd and felt sorry for the worried neighbours.

Years before that once a year in September we had an enrolment evening for adults' evening classes at our centre in Kingshill Road. By the end of the evening there were thousands of pounds (mostly cash), to be taken to the night-safe. I had arranged a police escort. The two officers discovered their car had a puncture. An hour later we set off, with them on my tail, as they hadn't heard of "Lloyds Bank, Desborough Road". I lost them in Green Road and never saw them again!

During the was I had two uncles who were policemen. Jack was not my favourite. (I soon learned at Christmas get-togethers never to beat him at Draughts!) Humourless and mean, he enjoyed donning his Special's uniform twice a week in the later years of the war and doing a night patrol on foot in the Terriers / Totteridge area. Rowan Avenue was his homeward track so he had a key to our house where he enjoyed a "short" period of rest and refreshment. There was no contact with the police station. A good job there were (are) no criminals in the Bowerdean area!

My other uncle (Arthur) was a regular policeman in London during the Blitz. He was a jolly man and I loved listening to his stories of the people's bravery. - like a man found in his bombed house, playing his trumpet. He refused to move until he'd reached the last verse! Arthur was a "real" policeman! Our latest minister is a retired policeman. Like Arthur he is full of compassion and efficient. He speaks of his Liverpool days and involvement in solving crimes. My first and latest policemen - and the present local community officers - have restored my faith in the Police. It was some of those years between who tested it. My advice still is, "If you want to know the time , ask a policeman!" (If you can find one....)

News from Wycombe and Westminster - Steve Baker MP

Since the last issue of Terriers and Totteridge News was published, it has been announced Wycombe Hospital now has a new hyper acute stroke service, to serve patients across Buckinghamshire and East Berkshire. The new unit offers intensive care, rehabilitation and therapy for three days following a stroke -a vital element in ensuring positive outcomes for patients. The service offers 24 hours, seven days a week access to Thrombolysis, which ensures patients have access to a life-saving injection that is used to disperse blood clots, reducing damage in the early stages of a stroke. The Hospital Trust is also developing a stroke supported early discharge service which will allow some patients to receive intensive support and therapy in their own homes instead of hospital. I am delighted Wycombe residents will have access to this top-quality service.

Another change to NHS provision locally is the merger of the Primary Care Trusts in Bucks and Oxon (the body which commissions services both at community and hospital level). This is an interim measure, pending the establishment of clinical commissioning. I am hopeful this will lead to less duplication and more efficiency, which in turn should allow more money for patient treatment.

You may like to know I hold regular meetings with the local police, to discuss policing issues in the constituency. If you have views on police priorities you may like to get involved with your Local Neighbourhood Action Group -a police body which has been established to allow the police to liaise with residents. Details can be obtained from your local policing team on 0845 8 505 505. I am also in touch with the Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator and give what support I can to the group's community efforts. If you have views on policing matters, including the proposed elected Police Commissioners, I would be pleased to hear from you.

I have had many meetings with local business groups, individuals and companies. I am particularly keen to do whatever I can to see the growth of business – and especially small businesses - in the area. A series of business breakfasts and expos have been held and I will be working with colleagues to take forward the best of these initiatives.

As your MP, the majority of my time is spent in Westminster scrutinising and voting on legislation and holding the Government to account. On 12th July I joined other MPs to highlight the difficulties faced by constituents with the rise in car fuel prices, part of a campaign called Fair Fuel UK. We have asked the Chancellor to reduce the duty on petrol and diesel. I know the issue of filling the family car is a priority for many people. It is clear the cost of fuel means that other family spending - such as on food - is reduced. Cutting or freezing fuel duty might actually mean increased revenue for the Treasury, as more people could afford to fill their tanks; this in turn would help the Government to tackle the deficit faster.

As always, I am pleased to hear from constituents whether they have views on national or local political issues. Digital Switchover - Are you ready?

The switchover to digital terrestrial television is coming soon to the High Wycombe area! Many areas of the country have already switched over with neighbouring Oxford changing this month (September). The switchover for us is due to take place in April 2012. After that date your old television if it does not already have a Freeview 'Tuner' or a box attached will no longer receive television broadcasts.

For some people buying a Freeview box will be all that is required but for many this may also need an upgrade of the aerial to get a good Freeview signal. Digital TV works very differently to analogue. With analogue you can get fuzzy pictures due to a poor signal but with digital its all or nothing. If the signal is not good enough therefore you will not be able to receive digital TV.

So what do you need to do? Start planning for the changeover now. Contact a local retailer to find out what equipment you need and how to connect this to other devices such as a hard disc recorder, DVD recorder etc. If your signal is not good enough contact a local aerial installer who will be able to advise and fit a replacement aerial and system allowing you to continue to enjoy your favourite TV programmes around the house.
