# News from Bucks County Council - Val Letheren updates us on her work.....

The long awaited resurfacing and traffic calming of the roads and pavements in Green Road will be starting on August 14th and should be completed before the schools go back. Geralds Road is due to be resurfaced in October although at this stage it will just be the road. I am trying to get the remaining pavements resurfaced with local area funding. Do let me know if you think there is a need for a grit bin in your area as I have been warned that we could have a hard winter ahead! I can apply through my councillors community leaders fund. I understand the ones we have put in have proved useful.

I am no longer the Cabinet member for Children, but am now Chairman of the Select Committee for Children's services - a bit like gamekeeper turned poacher! However members of the public can address my committee regarding issues affecting children and I will be happy to advise on the procedure.

We shall be running two special inquiries by this group, one on looking at if our young people are ready for work when they leave school, and the other looking at why the gap in Bucks between the high achieving young people and the low achievers is greater than in other areas of the country and why. Both very interesting subjects and we shall be speaking to interested parties to gain evidence and hopefully make appropriate recommendations to the County Council at the completion. Do let me know if you feel you have special knowledge regarding these subjects which could help.

### News from Wycombe and Westminster Steve Baker MP



I often receive letters from constituents about treatment they have experienced at both Wycombe and Stoke Mandeville hospitals; some people praise the care they have been given but all too often I hear about urgent care failures which are frankly not acceptable. It is for this reason I welcomed the recent report by Sir Bruce Keogh, Medical Director of the NHS Commissioning Board, following his investigation into death rates at Buckinghamshire hospitals along with others across the country. Sir Bruce has now placed Bucks NHS Trust in special measures and has agreed a plan with the hospital authorities to bring about significant improvements within a few weeks. I will be watching closely how these changes improve the care given to my constituents.

One point that is often overlooked is that Wycombe Hospital is the regional centre for heart and stroke care. If anyone is suspected of suffering from a heart attack or stroke and dials 999, the ambulance will take them directly to Wycombe, shortcutting the normal A&E procedure. Two of the biggest killers are treated locally.

In August, I was asked to appear on Radio 4's The World At One to give my views on the Governor of the Bank of England's policy on interest rates. I said I thought it was not a good idea to try to buck the markets, and that by using forward guidance to anchor both inflation and interest rate expectations the Governor was pursuing a more active monetary policy. I know low-interest rates are helpful to those with large borrowings (either a mortgage or other credit) but they are very detrimental to those who live on fixed incomes, such as the retired, who have seen the value of their savings diminished by such policies.

As I write this, the main concern at Westminster is the vote on Syria. Everyone is appalled by the use of chemical weapons on innocent civilians but Syria is currently in a full-blown civil war. Great caution is needed in international relations, and as a previous serving RAF officer I am very wary about committing British troops to a campaign which is not clearly defined. What is needed in Syria is a ceasefire and a peace conference; the British Government should be working towards peace not using war as a punishment. This is why I could not support the vote in the Commons at the end of August. I should like to thank all constituents who contacted me prior to the vote to give me their views, which I took very seriously.

### What's Going on in Girlguiding?

All the local Girlguiding groups have been busy over the summer term. There have been lots of outdoor activities including walking in the woods, BBQ's, pond dipping, having water fights, kayaking and dragon boating. Groups have been away on holidays, the Brownies near Wendover and the Guides on an overnight to Chessington World of Adventures.

Guiding is great fun for both girls and leaders, but it also encourages teamwork, resourcefulness, organisational skills, independence and there are many opportunities for learning.

### **Brownies Science Lab**

1st High Wycombe (St. Andrews) Brownies have been very busy over the summer term earning their *Science Investigator* badge. This was the first badge that I've organised entirely myself as a trainee leader, so it was an exciting and fun learning experience on both sides.

**Colourful chemistry**: the girls learned about acidity by testing household substances (lemon juice, yoghurt, toothpaste and washing powder) with homemade red cabbage indicator; making predictions about which would be the most acidic, testing the substances and watching the colour changes, and then seeing whether their predictions were true.

**Explosive excitement**: homemade vinegar and bicarbonate of soda volcanoes taught the girls about chemical reactions and how the formation of carbon dioxide causes bubbles, while making a wonderful mess into the bargain.

<u>Green fingers</u>: the old favourite "runner bean in a jar" went down a treat with the girls learning what plants need to grow. The girls were very keen to see the fruits of their labour and (most of) the beans made it planting stage.

**Fact finding**: a new "treasure hunt" style game got the girls learning about famous scientists past and present (from Isaac Newton to Stephen Hawking), and of course we did not miss the opportunity to teach them about women in science (such as Florence Nightingale and Marie Curie).
