Equity and Law site was developed earlier and now Wycombe District Council is, yet again, looking at planning to build 400 homes on Terriers Farm!

Terriers Evening W.I.

Fields of wheat grown for bread flour, huge grain stores, this is the face of farming in our local area of Bucks today. However, it was very different a hundred years ago when you were more likely to see dairy cows and sheep in the fields... At our June meeting, Bryan Edgley, who has been farming in the area since 1955, explained how he had begun farming at Cadmore End. He and his wife worked hard to restore the farmhouse which confusingly had a preservation order on it (could not be knocked down) and a slum clearance order (was not fit to live in) From the pictures he showed us of the earliest days on the farm it was apparent that the farm workers had to be very strong, capable of carrying over 2cwt. and these loads had to be moved frequently from place to place. Nowadays, however, there is sophisticated machinery to do every task from ploughing to harvesting. The tractors even have sat. navs....Farming has become less profitable and farmers have needed to diversify. Some of their outbuildings have been let to small businesses and various events are held on the farm. Conservation is another buzz word and Mr Edgley has helped to transform Cadmore End Common in to a wildlife haven and a pleasant place to walk.

We had glorious weather for our garden party in July and a good number of members enjoyed a glass of pimms and a members husband who is a chef, cooked a delicious buffet meal. During the evening an attempt was made to answer questions on World War 1 which has been very much in our minds over the past few months.

Kennel Cough - Is your dog at risk?

Most of us are aware of the need to vaccinate our dogs for diseases such as parvovirus and distemper and do so as part of a routine annual health check at the vets. Kennel cough, however, is a disease which is often forgotten about until our dogs are due for a stay at boarding kennels. But it's not just limited to kennels.

Kennel cough is a highly contagious respiratory infection of dogs. It can be caused by a number of different bacteria and viruses which are transmitted between dogs by close contact, such as during stays in kennels, dog shows or training classes, or just contact with an infected dog. The symptoms can range from a persistent, forceful cough to sneezing, a runny nose or eye discharge. Sometimes an affected dog can make a constant noise which sounds like they are choking. Most cases will resolve, sometimes needing a course of antibiotics, but occasionally more severe cases can develop complications such as pneumonia.

It is possible to reduce the risk of kennel cough, however, by having your dog vaccinated annually. At Vets4Pets we encourage people to take this option as part of their pet's routine preventative healthcare regime.

Bucks County Council - On the roads.....

Over the last few months you may have noticed a number of the "dreaded" roadwork's or road closed signs along local roads. Couple that with the inconvenience of temporary traffic lights while work takes place and its easy to question why all this has to happen when all you want to do is get to work, the shops or drop the kids off at a holiday play activity

Many of our local roads are in poor condition with the surface just breaking up into holes and where there is a concrete road construction underneath these have been clearly visible in a number of places. The summer holidays has been a good time when traffic is generally lighter to put some of these defects right. Locally recently Chippendale Close and Windsor Drive have had spray filling repairs as have a number of other minor problem roads. As we go to press with this edition North Road in Four Ashes is about to have further repair works. This secondary road now carries so much traffic through from Terriers to Widmer End, Hazlemere, Cryers Hill and beyond as it's a convenient shortcut and the damage from this is clear to see.

Hopefully when its all done we will have some better roads to see us through the autumn. However, lets hope we have a mild winter as frost, snow and long cold snaps can see all the good work of the County Council soon undone.


The last few months have been very troubling on the international stage. We have witnessed unrest in many parts of the globe including in Gaza and the Ukraine and have also seen the outbreak of Ebola in Africa. I know many of my constituents take a close interest in what goes on in the world and compassionately try to alleviate suffering. I was moved to learn from a recent study that Wycombe residents are among the most generous in the country for giving to charity. I am not surprised as I know many people contribute to worthy causes giving time, money and effort to help those in their immediate community and wider afield.

Parliament resumes in September for two weeks before it goes into recess again for the party conference season. I know party conferences both enthral and bore people in equal measure, but they have been a feature of our political life for many years and I don't see them ending soon. One event I will be participating in at my own party conference is a round-table discussion on patient centred care. I will be happy to update you in the future on what was discussed and whether there are any ideas which we can use for the benefit of our own local health services.

During the early autumn I will also be publishing some ideas I have found to give people access to better and easier round-the-clock emergency care at Wycombe hospital. It is worth remembering that Wycombe Hospital currently treats all stroke and heart attack patients from across the county and parts of Berkshire and is a centre of excellence. I want the NHS to build on this so that any patient can come to Wycombe hospital in an emergency at any time of the day or night and be treated in the most effective way possible. I also would like to draw your attention to an enquiry being conducted by Wycombe District Council into the effects of changes to urgent health care in the town over the last few years. This will be taking place at the Queen Victoria Road offices on 16th October and I do urge anyone with a contribution to make to participate in this enquiry.

Iconic Wycombe building shuts its doors

On Monday 28th July, St Francis Church in Terriers shut its doors to worshippers and visitors for three months while essential work on the interior of the

The church, whose distinctive tower and pyramid spire can be seen from miles away, has suffered over the years from its exposed position. In 2012 English Heritage awarded the Church Council a six-figure grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to enable the church to improve the carry-away of rainwater from the roof of the church and to enhance the drainage system. This year a similar grant has been made to enable the church to make good the damage done to the interior by 84 years of wind and rain battering the building in its exposed position on top of Amersham Hill. Damaged plaster will be hacked off and replaced. Flood damage to flooring will be made good and the church's damp-proof course renewed. In addition, the storms of the past winter revealed new problems of rain penetration into the bell-tower and a number of windows on the south side of the building. These, too, will be remedied by the contractors, Blisworth-based Novus Property Solutions, under the direction of the church's architect, Tony Mealing.

During the three months of closure the church's congregation will continue to worship - in the adjoining Church Hall on Amersham Road. Over the summer, teams from the congregation cleared space for the storage of items that will not be needed before the end of October and moved across to the hall items that were be needed for the congregation's regular Sunday worship, which will be maintained. Canon Tony Dickinson, the Vicar of Terriers, is looking forward to the challenge. "This temporary move" he comments "will remind us that a church is much more than a building, however striking and beautiful it may be. The church is the people of God, gathering to worship around the Lord's Table on the Lord's Day."

The works to be carried out under phase 2 of the restoration project will also enable greater use of the church as a community building and relieve the pressure of demand on the Church Hall, which is itself a prime resource for

Would you know how to spot Child Sexual Exploitation?

That is probably a very difficult question to answer and something that most of us hope we will never encounter. However, it is something that does happen and comes to the forefront in the news from time to time.

On 1st September the Buckinghamshire Safeguarding Children's Board aimed to raise awareness of the problem through social media by generating a "Thunderclap". This is a way of you and your friends showing your support to stamp out sexual exploitation in Buckinghamshire.

It is not always easy to spot the signs. Young people do not usually come out and tell others when something is upsetting them and they may not even realise they are being exploited . Child sexual exploitation is a form of sexual abuse in which a young person is manipulated or forced into taking part in a sexual act, often in return for attention, affection, gifts, money, drugs, alcohol or accommodation.

What you think is normal teenage behaviour could be something more. Knowing how to spot the signs can help them raise the alarm:

- Unexplained gifts
- New friends, boyfriend, girlfriend
- Missing school
