The chairman gave a summary

the past year. The Council had ~~attempted~~

& Rustmore Greens but the District
Council had refused to hand over
their powers to the Parish Council.

The Parish Council had requested
the District Council to appoint two or
three Members of the Parish Council
on the Greens Committee.

The allusion was made for the first time at last.

Attention was drawn to the large number of empty houses, & it was however hoped that by drawing on the reserve fund there would be no immediate increase in the Rate.

Finger Posts

Mr W Hutton said that the lettering of the finger-posts had not been carried out according to the agreed by the last annual Parish Meeting, although changes had been made the wording was in certain cases misleading.

The Chairman said the Parish Council had reported this to the District Council & doubtless the matter would be attended to.

Mr A Skelton referred to an accident that had occurred some months ago near church stile in which a motor van had been assisted out of a dangerous position by the District & County Engineers. He moved that the following Resolution be sent to the District Council:- "The attention of the Parish Council having been called to the unusual quantity & thickness of the fence which we are informed has been caused by a collection of men & horses & collyars brought & the West Ham laundry lorry.— We should like to know

It is of course presumed that
adequate compensation for damage
has been paid to your Council also
for the use of the Council's engine for
pulling out the fence.

We take this opportunity of
asking that if one of the Council's
engines are in the vicinity we shall be
in order in seeking its use in similar
cases.

Mr Duddy said that before
the proceedings commenced
he wished to make a statement
with reference to the letter which
as he had personally announced
he had opened

The letter had been addressed
by Mr Brown to the Chairman &
& the Claimant the right to both
open the letter & moreover to retain
possession of it in his capacity
as Vice-Chairman. He had been
challenged by the action & he
asked the Parish Council to
state their attitude in the matter.

Dr H. H. P. said that Mr Duddy
had a long time ago handed the
letter to him. He understood that
the letter had been read to the
Parish Council. There was nothing
personal in it & nothing that
should be hidden. He now
produced the letter & Mr Duddy
read it aloud.

Mrs Parsons & Birch agreed that there was nothing of particular importance in the letter & they failed to see why it had not been produced before.

In reply Mr. Hetherwick. Mr Duddy said he had acknowledged the letter.

In Kilshaneck does he was not sure of the legal position. Suggested that the Dist Council Clerk should be asked to state the law on the subject.
