Mr Ernest Newbridge wrote giving the following extract from a communication received from the Ministry of Health:-

"That approval is given to timber framed houses constructed in 6cm, the sections of the timber for quartering to be not less than 5" x 3" & no part of the external weather boarding to be less than 1" in thickness

The walls should be formed as



roof can be constructed of 2" thick with grooved & tongued joints supporting the beams or purlins & dispensing with ordinary floor joists & rafters.

The frame work must be constructed on proper foundation with a damp course, & any overhanging work must be of framed construction. Roof can be covered with thatch if the houses are properly isolated.

Mr T Vincent, the District Councillor attended the meeting & submitted <sup>copies of</sup> the District Council plans for the new cottage which had been sent to the Ministry of Health for approval.

Mr H Miller asked for the cost & was informed that it would be between £600 & £800.

After a discussion as to the merits of the two methods of construction, i.e. that submitted by Mr Trowbridge & that of District Council, Mr H. D. Hoffman proposed & Mr H. Miller seconded
