Water Supply

From R D Council dated 13 April 72, asking for what purpose the details of supply are required.
Mr A Nicksa said that he had seen a copy of the details at the District Council Office. There were one or two items which he did not consider satisfactory, the item being in particular. The increase charge of from 5% to 8% for consumers would practically wipe out the special expense rate. He strongly urges that the Metropolitan Water Board should be re-assessed with regard to the value of water in the area. It has been reduced by about £20. on the grounds of its not being used much, but from what he gathered the water was frequently in use.

Mr Miller thought the Council should have a copy of the details. It would now be satisfactory to the Ratepayers to know that the Consumers only would pay the water rate. He moves the following resolution:-

The house in Goatsfield Rd has been struck out of the Valuation list & the other two are being placed in a Supplementary list for the same action.

The Parish Council would be glad to know under these circumstances if the house in Goatsfield Rd which is still in occupation can be reassessed & the Rates claimed & payment enforced.
