Income Tax on rent for Allotment Land.

The Clerk reported that the Audit of Parish Council Accounts took place on the 19<sup>th</sup> June, 1940.

The Auditor raised the question why Income Tax was not deducted from the rent (£4 per Acre) at its source - He was informed that this had never been done as it was assumed the Titsey Estate paid this Tax. The Auditor instructed the Clerk to write the Estate & ascertain if this was so.

The Estate replied that they were unable to trace on the demand notes from the Collector that the Estate had been charged with I.T. on the Allotment ground & suggested an enquiry to

The Collector at Redhill.

The Collector replied that there was no charge under Schedule "A" for 1939/40.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Collector expressing the Council's desire that he should settle with the Titney Est. the future procedure for payment of I. Tax on the Allotment Land at Tatefield & acquaint the Council with the result.

~~Fire Protection~~ Mrs T. J. Watson A letter was read from Mrs Watson suggesting that Men & Women Should be trained in the use of the Stirrup pump & also the housing of these pumps etc.

The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr Easter, Surveyor, R.D.C. enclose Mrs Watson's letter with the hope that he can make use of her Watson's Services.

Roadside Verges & Banks The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr Wilkes & draw his attention to the grass on Verges & Banks especially Church Hill Road, Rag Lane, Franklyn & Woodlands Comets, & to point out that these roads are particularly bad & dangerous for Traffic etc.

Water - Alternative Supply A letter was received from R.D.C. on the question of Alternative Supplies in the event of damage to mains as a result of Air Raids, & requesting the Council to cause a Survey of the Parish with a view to furnishing the Dist. Council with a schedule of the position of any Springs, or Wells in the Parish & giving an indication as to whether Wells are open or have been sealed up.

The Clerk was instructed to furnish this information as early as possible after the Survey had been made.
