Minutes. The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

Ploughing of Footpaths. A letter was read from the R. D. C. enquiring what footpaths, over pasture land, were ploughed up since the outbreak of War?

The Clerk was instructed to inform the R. D. C. that two paths were ploughed up, as follows:-

(1) Across Church Field - leading from the Church to Chestnut Ave. - O. S. Parcel No. 171. To inform the Council that Mr W. Robinson had a notice served upon him by the Surrey War Agricultural Committee to plough this & that the path is not stopped or diverted.

(2). On north side of Budham Rd. - O. S. Parcel No. 60.

Only a portion of this field has been ploughed & about 25 yds of the path, etc.

Arising out of complaints about this cesspool Mr Sliffe informed the Council that the matter was in hand, & a way had been found of getting over this difficulty.

It was agreed that a sum of £45 would be required

for cesspool 1942-3, to meet the P.C. requirements for 1942-43.

Salvage of Rate Books. A letter was read from the S. C. C. as to the disposal of Rate Books, etc. for wash paper. The Clerk informed the Council that all the old Rate Books had been sent to the R. D. C. in 1926 for safe keeping. (See page 149, opposite)

(2) Bus Service to Tatefield: - Arising out of correspondence between Mr McDonald & the L.P.T.B. as to the advisability of diverting the Croydon-Westham service via the Village, Ship Hill, & Church Hill Road. The L.P.T.B. turned down his suggestion & Mr McDonald now asked the Parish Council to take the matter up with the Transport Board etc, & pointed out that a petition signed by over 50 people had been sent to the Board. Mr Groundy pointed out that most people would very much appreciate an early bus that would enable them to get another connection at Warlingham. After further discussion it was proposed by Mr Bee & See^d by Mr Laslett "that the Chairman should personally place the case before the L.P.T.B." Cassied

The question of Mr J.S. Chairman's absence from the Council meetings over a period of some months was discussed, & it was agreed to defer this matter until the next meeting of the Council.

Mr Mc Donald, Tatefield Cottage, Cottages Ricketts Hill, again wrote to the Council on the subject of Bus facilities — including a petition from 150 signatories — He maintained that the arguments put forward against the use of the proposed Ship-Hill — Church Hill route — via the Village were not convincing etc. That the concession made by the L.P.T.B of an early bus at 7.45 am benefited only a few people — The Chairman pointed out that 12 people travelled by this bus that morning & that the number would grow, especially when the basic petrol ration ended in June.

After a long discussion it was decided to defer this matter until the Chairman had an interview with Mr Mc Donald — it was agreed that this question should be brought up at the next meeting.
