Minutes of the proceedings of a Parish Council Meeting held at the School on Monday 4th January, 1943.

Bus Route 403.

Main Bus Stop at the main bus stops in Croydon was again discussed.

Croydon.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the L.P.T.B. and request that conductors may be empowered to ask for & accept long distance passengers before those going only short distances — and further to ask who is responsible for bus queues being maintained at the main stopping places in Croydon — whether it is the public, bus authorities, or the police?

And to point out that it has been observed that when the bus arrives at the head of the queue the file of people break up & those at the end of the file double round & succeed in boarding the vehicle before those at or near the head of queue etc.

Footpath - John's Road to Manor House.

The Clerk was instructed to write & draw the attention of Mr Miles, Godfrey Down Farm, to that portion of the path adjoining his Cove's garden which is in a very bad condition owing to his cattle walking over it etc, and request that he put the path in a passable condition for pedestrians who use the highway etc.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Clerk R. D. C. and report the condition of the guttering & down pipes from the roofs of 1, 2, & 3, The Parade, also the roof of large iron shed at back of P. O. adjoining Westmore Road, and to point out that people using the footpaths around these premises are, in wet weather, subjected to a regular shower bath of rain water from the roofs, especially in front of the P. O. & Kiosk, and request that this matter be seen to by the appropriate department etc.

Bus Route 403. A letter was read from the L.P.T.B. which stated that it was not possible to discriminate between passengers travelling short or long distances — no power to select their passengers. With regards to queues & boarding vehicles in proper order — the responsibility devolves upon the public, & is governed by "The Regulation of Traffic (Formation of Queues) Order dated March 16th, 1942 made by the Ministry of War Transport

After discussion — The Chairman suggested that copies of the correspondence with the Transport Board be sent to the Ministry of War Transport, to enquire how queues can be controlled where buses arrive at the stopping places &c. This was agreed to & the Clerk was instructed to act accordingly.

With regards to Priority for long distance passengers, Mrs Laslett proposed & Mr Hardy seconded "that the Clerk write to the Clerks of the Parish Councils for Westerham, Brasted, Sundridge, & Chevening, & ask if these Councils will consider taking joint action with other Councils on this question of priority for Route 403?" CARRIED.

The Chairman gave a summary of the work done by the Parish Council during the past year, mentioned the loss sustained by the Parish through the death of Mr W Coker Sliffe who had given unstintingly of his leisure time & service to the interests of the Parish, & the R.D.C. Also the Council had lost another valued colleague in Mr Chapman who, owing to pressure of business was forced to resign.

Among the questions put to the Chair were the following:-

(1) Miss Palmer asked why nettles & other weeds were not cut before seeding, causing damage to gardens & the surrounding land adjoining the Common?

The Chairman replied that each year application is made, in good time, to have the grass & weeds cut, there is always a difficulty in getting labour to do the work at the proper season.

(2) Mr Geary wanted to know what provision has been made for playing fields etc. — The land behind the Westmose Cottages was available before the War, but is not so now, provision has been made for a playing field on some acres of land adjoining Tatesfield Road.

(3) Mr Hastwell asked if the Dist-Council would clean out the drain in Old Lane so as to prevent flooding by the storm water from the main roads & damage to roadway?

The Chairman said that Old Lane was not an adopted Rd. & the Highway Duty would not accept responsibility. The frontage owners would have to clean out the drains & repair.

VII Bus Route 403. The Clerk reported that he had written to Westerham, Brasted, Sundridge & Chevening enquiring if they would take joint action to get Transport Board to give priority to long distance passengers?

Westerham & Brasted were not in favour - for reasons stated. Sundridge was in favour, while Chevening did not reply.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Sundridge Council inform them about letter received from Regional Transport Commissioner, London, ~~informing them that~~ under the circumstances, set out in the letter, the Ticefield Council decided not to proceed with the joint action ~~set out~~ in previous letter to them, & to return thanks mentioned for the offer of help.

As no reply had been received from Mr. Miles as to the repair to this footpath - the Clerk was instructed to write to the Div'l Highways Surveyor stating the facts & condition etc of this path, & request him to take the matter up wth Miles.

R.D.C. and the Red Cross Agric. A letter was received from the Clerk R.D.C. asking Red Cross Agric. that the Parish Council should make an effort to start Fund. Organise a Victory Garden Week, or Garden Show to help an appeal made by the Red Cross Agricultural Committee.

After discussion the Clerk ^{was} directed to write to the R.D.C. inform them that the P.C. very much regretted it would be unable to help in this appeal, and to point out that Tatsfield Gardening Society was dissolved for the duration of the War, That its members or patrons have either joined the Forces or are otherwise employed on War Efforts. Further inform the R.D.C. that the residents of Tatsfield have during the War made special efforts - through weekly collections, Sales, & in other ways subscribed towards this Fund.

The P.C. consider that in view of the immense amount of work & time required to organise such Shows, & the fact that the majority of the residents would not be available to help preclude the idea of making ^{it} a success.

Sugar Loaf", South Croydon, which will enable
passengers to queue separately, & instructions have
been given for the work to be proceeded with, &
when this stop has been segregated, no further
difficulty should be experienced in the
breaking of the queue. He further points out
that passengers could, as an alternative, board
the bus at West Croydon where some accommo-
dation is always available, or Tatsfield passengers
might proceed to Sanderstead Station where they
would probably find accommodation on the Tatsfield
bus &c.

Fencing Allotments. It was agreed that Mr C. Cuttish be asked to repair the fence round Allotments as best as he can - for the present.

Fire Risk in parts of the Parish. Mr S. Whinnett (Senior Warden) wrote drawing the Council's attention to the risk - in the event of a fire occurring at the Church or Adjoining cottages, pointing out that the nearest hydrant was at the bottom of Church Hill which was so far away that the Tractor Pump could not be used.

He suggested that the P.C. use its influence to get the Water Board to install a hydrant opposite the Church Cottages.

After discussion it was decided to defer this matter to the next full meeting of the Council.

Contracts of local authorities. H. of H. Circular letter No. 2835 - Pointing out that in present conditions it is wasteful to invite tenders for goods which are controlled, or in respect of goods where competition leads to unnecessary use of road or rail transport etc.

Cutting down trees. The question of people felling & removing trees from this Green was deferred till the next meeting.

Tatfield Green. The question as to whether an earlier hour for the P.C. meeting should be fixed was deferred to the next meeting to discover the feeling of the majority.

Miscellaneous. The miss-spelling of Biggin Hill Bigginst, and likely changes in Parish Councils deferred to next meeting.

Fire Risk in parts of the Parish. The question of "Fire Risks" & the provision of Hydrants in certain parts of the Parish was discussed at some length. Among the suggestions made were the following: - (i). Cheaper to apply for extension of hose. (ii). Chairman pointed out that no matter how small the pump is we have to apply to the N.F.S. (iii). Mr. Hardy pointed out that there were other parts of the parish worse off - e.g. Parkwood Road, Mr. Robinson's farm etc. (iv). Dr. Cope suggested the Council's (R.D.C.) attention be drawn to the Church & Cottages as they are not covered, etc.

Mr. Hardy proposed & Dr. Cope seconded "that the attention of R.D.C. should be drawn to various isolated spots in the Parish which are unprovided against Fire risks" (e.g. Robinson's Farm, Parkwood Rd etc.) Carried.

The Clerk was instructed to send the Senior Warden's letter to the Clerk R.D.C. & request that this matter be attended to.

Cutting down Trees on Tatsfield Green. The Rector reported that the people concerned have had permission from the Sanitary Inspector to cut down & remove certain trees from this wood (probably dead trees).
