The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

The Div. Highways Surveyor wrote that he was seeing into the matter.

A letter was received from the Salvage Officer R.D.C. informing the Council that it was proposed to hold a Book Recovery Drive from the 29th Jan to 12th February, 1944. That all books would be scrutinised by a Committee & divided into three classes:-

(1) Books suitable for re-stocking blitzed Libraries.
(2) Books suitable for the Fighting Services.
(3) Books for re-purposing. He suggested that the P.C. would greatly assist in making a success of the Drive by undertaking to provide & run the Depots in the Parish.

The Head Master wrote that the School would co-operate with the Council, and that the School could be used as a Depot.

The Clerk reported he had received posters from the Salvage Officer that day put them up in the most likely places in the Parish, & that the Salvage work was now under-way.

Alleged Footpath. The R.D.C. forwarded letters from Messrs F.G. Merides,

Ricketts Hill to J. O'Reilly, & J. D. Adams, protesting against the stopping up of an alleged footpath across the field from Ricketts Hill to the beginning of Kemsley Road. After considerable discussion the Clerk was instructed to inform the R.D.C. that the footpath in question was what is known as a "trespass path" and was never recognised as a "Public Right of Way".

The previous tenant - Mr Miles, & the two or three former tenants, have on a number of occasions stopped up this path at the Ricketts Hill end,

and it was invariably broken through, or a gap was made at other points through the hedge.

As to the question of a "swing gate" mentioned by Mr Meridew — this gate was made ~~for~~ a woman who had it put up for convenience in moving cattle to & from this field of which she was the tenant — this happened some years back, probably 50-60 years ago, & relatives state that there was no footpath at that time. The path was stopped before & after the coming into force of the 1932 Rights of Way Act by Mr Miles, & people have been warned not to use it etc.

MARCH 1944.

Minutes of the proceedings of a Parish Council meeting held at the School on Wednesday the 15th March, 1944.

Present.

Mrs W. M. Laslett, Dr Cope, Messrs Bee, Elbourne, Hardy, Maynard, Rev W. E. Goudny & the Clerk (T. Kelly).

The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

The Clerk reported that 1400 Books & 1400 Magazines were collected by the School children, and 150 Books by the Women's Institute.

The Clerk was instructed to write a letter of appreciation to the Headmaster, & Women's Institute.

A letter was received from Mr C. Gooding, Gorsey Down Farm, requesting the Council to approve of his "stopping up" a portion of this road at its lower end, at a point near Col Wyatt's garden, as a temporary measure to prevent his cattle straying — He explained that owing to the shortage of barbed wire he was unable to do the necessary fencing along the road, he would however, provide two gates to enable pedestrians to use this roadway.

He agreed to remove the obstructions at the end of the Wat when wire would be available.

After discussion it was ^{unanimously} agreed to approve this arrangement — but as a War-time emergency only.

The Clerk to inform Mr Gooding that he must put up a "Notice Board" at both ends indicating that it is a "Temporary Fence".

With reference to the R. D. C^o letter of 11th Jan. 44 asking for the views of the P. C. on this matter, the Clerk read letter sent, which was in accordance with instructions given in Min VI 24-1-44.

A letter was received from Sir Lawrence Shrub, Secy. Footpaths Presⁿ. Society, pointing out what really matters is

whether or not a path has been freely used by the public as a right of way for the statutory period of 20 years, and not whether it is marked on Ordnance Maps.

A letter was sent to the Secretary informing him that the Parish Council was aware of the limitations of the evidence of Ordnance Survey Maps on the subject of R. of Way.

The P.C. cannot support the claim to this particular

Alleged path for the following reasons:

(1) This alleged path has been stopped many ^{times} during the past 20-30 years, and the claim to "free use" of the path fails.

(2) The Council is in possession ^{of Maps} going back for at least 80 years which consistently show no path, but on the contrary show that in by-gone days the need for the "short cut" did not arise.

(3) Hence from (1) & (2) above, the alleged path is not an ancient one, and in modern times its use has always been opposed by the tenant farmers.

The Secy replied stating that "When a path is modern in origin it is impossible to produce evidence of dedication, or of 20 years unchallenged use by the public it is hopeless to advance a claim to it."

A letter was read from the Chief Regional Fire Officer, Tunbridge Wells informing the Council that it is regretted that no action can be taken at this juncture to supply static water to cover isolated fire risks, as this would establish a precedent whereby all rural areas would have to be supplied with water cover where natural supplies were considered inadequate. He is taking up the matter of the rusted hydrant with Fire Force Commander to give attention to this matter.

Arising out a question at last years meeting, the Rev W. G. Gurney said he had looked up the regulations—Children could play on the Greens, but not to erect goal posts or other obstructions, & that Greens were now under the control of the Sanitary Inspector at Oxted.

D. Cope suggested that notice of Parish Council meetings should be put up on the Notice Board. It was agreed that this would be done.

The Chairman explained that Mr Gooding, Coseydown Farm had asked the Parish Council to approve of his stopping a portion of this road, to keep his cattle from straying, as owing to the War-time conditions he was unable to obtain barbed wire to fence this road. He had provided two gates for the use of pedestrians, & at the end of the War would remove the obstructions.

The P. Council approved this as a War-time arrangement only. He would be asked to put up Notice Boards, at each end informing the public that this was a "Temporary Fence".

Mr Maynard proposed a vote of thanks to the Chairman. This was seconded & carried unanimously and the meeting terminated.

He invited the co-operation of the Parish Council & suggested that a Sub-Committee be formed ^{President} in the Parish with a view to organising a Children Sports Week, & other Social events.

The Sub-Committee should consist of representatives of Women's Institute, Home Guard, Civil Defence, Sports Organisations, and Savings Group ^{SECRETARIES} ~~Secretary~~.

The various events would have to be self-supporting, and Prizes be in the form of Savings Certificates & Stamps.

After discussion it was decided to form a Tatefield Sub-Committee as suggested. The Clerk was instructed to write to the various organisations & ask them to appoint a member to this Sub-Committee, and suggest that a preliminary meeting might be held at the Schools on Thursday 4th May, 1944, at 7 pm.
