## ANNUAL PARISH MEETING. MARCH 1954

Minutes of the proceedings of the Annual Parish meeting held at the Bakery on Wed. March 17th, at 8 p.m.

To present Fourteen parishioners were present, including seven Parish Councillors.

Minutes The minutes of the last Annual Parish meeting were read and confirmed.

Chairman's Summary The Chairman gave a Summary of the work done by the Parish Council during the past year.

Broken Milk Bottles Mr. Drayes drew attention to the number of milk bottles which were left lying about, and then broken. They were becoming a real menace. The Chairman said that the Parish Council would see what could be done.

Bus Service to Oxted Mr. Brazier did not think that a week-day service would be much in demand, but he thought a number of Nonconformists in the village would make use of a Sunday service about 10.30, returning between 12 and 12.30, to go to their church at Oxted.

Coronation The Chairman then gave a review of Coronation activities in the village, and expressed the wish that "Young Tom" who had made the Bonfire would make a speedy recovery from his recent accident.

Proposed by Mrs. Hodgson, sec. Miss Knight that the Headmaster & staff of the School be thanked for their co-operation in making the Village celebrations such a success.

Carried unanimously.

Mr. Black then gave some news about the projected Village Sign, which was to be a permanent memorial of the Coronation. Nearly £40 had been collected; visits had been paid to inspect signs erected by other villages; and various designs had been submitted. The design by Mr. Abrahams, a parishioner, had been accepted, and Mr. Abrahams had generously agreed to waive all fees. The design would be set in a framework of wrought iron, and the local authority had agreed to its erection on ~~the~~<sup>Westmore</sup> green, opposite the White House. The top of the design incorporated the Gresham Grasshopper. It was hoped that the sign would be unveiled on May 30th, Coronation Sunday anniversary.

Building Mr. Mayes asked for information about the Green Licences & Belt, and building licences for vacant plots in the vacant plots. Mr. Hodgson, Godstone R.D.C. representative for Tatsfield said that there was no general objection to building where amenities allowed, but there was no liking for opening up new areas. "Infilling" or "rounding off" of existing building areas was allowed. Questions of sanitation & traffic had to be taken into account. One particular objection was any area not to be included in the Drainage Scheme, as every additional cesspool added to the burden of the rates. As regards compensation for loss of value in building plots owing to denial of licences to build, he reminded those present that a Bill was now before Parliament, which might clarify matters.

Old Lane Mr. Mayes asked whether a ridge could be made at the entrance to Old Lane, which would direct the overflow during heavy rain, into the ditch, as under

present conditions, water sometimes rushed down the Lane, and some considerable damage had been done in the past. The Chairman promised to see into the matter.

Bushes on The green Proposed by Mr. Drayes, sec. Miss Kelly, that Godstone R.D.C. be asked to remove the bushes on the Green. These were increasing in size, and in number, every year. Carried unanimously.

New Council Houses In reply to a questioner, Mr. Hodson said it was unlikely that any new Council houses would be built until the new main drainage was installed.

School report Mrs. Brazier, Vice-chairman of School managers, and one of the representatives of the Parish Council, said that ~~matter~~ the tone of the school was still continuing to improve, & the general report was satisfactory.

Vote of thanks A vote of thanks to the Chairman, & Parish Councillors was proposed by Mr. Brazier, sec. by Mr. Drayes and carried unanimously.

carton, paper or other rubbish so as to create or tend to create a litter.

P.C. Insurance A letter was read from Surrey County Ass. of Parish Councils saying that the matter of Insurance & 3rd party risks would soon be discussed at the Executive Committee Meeting. Regarding stiles, much depended on whether they had been put up to suit the farmer's convenience or the public's. In the latter case the highway authority, presumably, must accept responsibility.

It was agreed to seek quotations from two insurance companies, regarding Third Party Risks for one roadside seat, the allotment gate & 250 yards of barbed wire fencing of the allotments, and 3rd party risks in general.

Coroner's Court The Clerk read a letter from Oxted Parish Council indicating their intention of not proceeding further with their request for a Coroner's Court nearer than Sutton, & enclosing a copy of a letter received by them from the Home Office. This said that the Secretary of State found no grounds for action on his part, as the Coroner was at liberty to choose his own site for his Court, as an independent-judicial officer.

Building Bye Law The Clerk said she had received a copy of the most recent Bye laws of the R.D.C. area.
