1. MINUTES of the meeting held on December 11, 1978 wore confirmed and signed.

## 2. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning (Item 2a of last minutes).

## i. Ensement (2ni).

At the request of the Council chairman, conveyed to the meeting by Mr. Pearce it was agreed to defer consideration of the terms of any casement to the next meeting.

Considerable discussion ensued regarding a reported encreachment on to the common in carrying out the development the subject of the easement application.

Agreed that Mr. Pearce should discuss the situation with the Chairman and, subject to the terms of previous correspondence, agree the terms of a letter to be sent drawing attention to the alleged encreachment.

# ii. Current Applications.

Mrs. Crofts reported on applications notified during the month. It was agreed to offer no objection to the following: 78/1202/1857 (extension Tanglewood, Westmore Road); 78/1212/1515 (new access etc. Willow Shaw, Ricketts Hill Road); 78/1211/1753 (extension, 16 Westmore Road). In the case of the last application Mrs. James was advised during a public adjournment that certain matters in which she was interested were more properly the subject of private negotiation.

# k. Speed Limit (2n).

Clark reported receipt of letters from Sir Geoffrey HouseMP, Mr. J. Macfarland and the Council Chairman.

Sir Geoffrey Howe forwar ed a coty of a lotter he had sent to Mrs. James which confirmed that the procedure being followed was the correct one.

Mr. Macfarlane mentioned that the Department of Transport propose to publish now criteria for local speed limits and suggested it might be better to

await publication of these.

publication in the Parish Magazine.

Mr. Owen said he was opposed too speed limit on the following grounds: (1) that it would be a further step towards urbanisation (2) even 30mph was too fast on many Tatsfield roads; (3) the whole issue arcse not because of spood but because of the law regarding parking in restricted areas (4) the read safety record of Tatsfield had not been identified as a problem. During a general discussion all members present appressed their views and, with the exception of Mrs. Crofts, who stressed the need for some restriction on Rickotts Hill Road, expressed themselves as opposed both to any extension of street lighting and to the imposition of a speed limit. During a short public adjournment Mrs. James (who arrived during the debate) spoke in particular of the danger arising from motor cyclists whilst Mr. D. Hayes pointed out that adequate powers existed to deal with careless or dangerous driving and urged peoble to provide information of offences they might witness to the police. Sympathy was expressed with the situation at Ricketts Hill, where it was recognised there was a growing volume of through traffic. It was agreed not to proceed with an am lication for a speed limit on village roads and the Clork was instructed so to inform the relevant authorities and individuals with whom the matter had been raised, including Mrs. James, as representing the putitioners. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman to consult and provide a statement for

#### 1. Dovecote (2r).

## r. Motorway Service Area (4a).

Letter (18/12) from Fr. W.R.C. Carey (Chairman of CATSA) said County Council action, taken without concultation with Tandrilge would not help CATSA case, particularly as it appeared that the facilities in the Foyle service area might be reduced - thus providing a stronger case for a full-blown service area at Titsey Wood.

CATSA would continue to observe a watching brief, but could do little more intil the formal consultative locument was published by the Department of the Environment. - Noted.

## s. Annual Parish Mooting (6a).

Mr. Pearce reported that Mrs. Hallett had confirmed the booking of the Village Hall.

## t. Car Parking, The Square (6c).

Mrs. Player was keeping this matter under observation.

# b. Proposed New Brilloway.

Letter (26/12) from Limpsfield Parish Council forwarded plan of suggested new brilloway north and west of the M25 planned to avoid the necessity of equestrians having to pass under motorway bridge. Clark to express agreement with the suggestion, pointing out that though of probable bonefit to Tatsfield riders it was not in fact in Tatsfield.

Mombers considered suggestions from hr. Open for procepts during the year totalling £1635 (a rate of 0.9p in the £) and also a report by the Glerk on ougstanding consistents. The Clerk reported that current bank balances totalled £88.42.

After discussion the Clerkwas instructed to inform the District Council that the Council estimates that it will require to precept during the coming year the sum of £20h7 (equivalent to arate of 1.1p in the £). This would have the Council with uncommitted funds totalling about £500 to be applied to local purposes.

 MINUTES of the meeting held on January 8, 1979 were confirmed and signed with minor amendments as initialled by the Chairman.

#### 2. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning (Item 2a of last minutes).

#### i. Easement (2ai).

The Chairman reported on correspondence he had had with the District Valuer during which he had expressed his personal opinion as to a suitable figure. The Valuer indicated that negotiations continued and intimated that the Clerk would be informed of progress.

Discussion took place regarding the alleged encroachment on to the common, the Clerk reporting that no reply had been received to a letter drawing attention to this.

Agreed to defer consideration till the April meeting, the Clerk in the maintime to pursue enquiries.

## ii. Current Applications.

a. Mount Pleasant, Biggin Hill).

At the request of Mr. Hunt, the Clark had expressed the Council's opposition to a prepasal to build five two-bodroom houses at 26 Mount Pleasant, Biggin Hill. An acknowledgment had been received from the Planning Officer, London Berough of Browley.

b. Park Farm, Rag Hill Road (78/1223/0/1884). . (Change of use: stable building to pottery). - No objection.

c. Bassotts, Ship Hill (79/29/0/28 (Wasto paper store: lorry maintenance unit)

Following considerable discussion on this outline application, the Clork was instructed to inform the Planning Officer that this Council hopes that before full planning permission is granted it will be possible to see that provision is made for adequate landscaping to screen the proposed building and that careful consideration will be given to the size of the building, especially its height.

## iii. Appeals.

# b. Village Appraisal. (2b).

Mr. D. Hayos (Chairman of Village Appraisal Committee) said 40 people attended the two sessions devoted to the pilot questionaire: in view of the very bad weather a very good sample. The Committee would be studying the results.

The Clerk reported that he had not yet been able to secure proof of delivery of the letter to the owner of Gorsey Down Farm.

After some discussion of the existing position it was agreed to defer further action regarding the stiles.

Mrs. Grofts referred to the damage to the path caused by horse riding and the Chairman invited members to inspect the field with a view to a further discussion.

## d. King Edward VII Memorial Garden (2d)

No details yet received regarding Land Registry entry.

## e. Mnesmmwr Road (2ci).

Mrs. McHugo said she understood notice had been served under the Public Health Act and that the tenant of the piggeries had been given notice. Clark to seekuply to earlier letter sent to Technical Services Officer.

# f. Abandoned Car (2011).

## g. Natice Boards (2f).

Consideration deferred for reports to be made at March meeting.

#### h. Tree Planting (2g).

Lotter (16/1) from Planning Officer thanked Council for information, confirmed that planning permission was not required and said that, following an inspection by the Parks Superintendant the Planning Officer agreed with the scheme. Mr. Payme reported that Mr. Rebinson had agreed the scheme and that application had been made for a grant from the Countryside Commission, which he heped would seen be received.

Mr. Paymo was authorised to proceed with the schome, subject to receiving the grant of 50% of the cost of £466: the Clerk so to inform Gustin Garlans of Trug, Macsaum Read.

## 1. Silver Birches: The Green.

## d. Abandoned Car (2f).

Reported that no action had been taken. Mrs. Player to pursue the matter.

## e. Stiles: Horse Riding (2c).

Subject to completion of the agreements Mr. Payne was empowered to accept the contract for carrying out the work.

The Chairman congratulated Mr. Payne upon his work in this matter.

MINUTES of a meeting of TATSFIELD FARISH COUNCIL held at the United Reformed Church, Paynesfield Road, Tatsfield on Monday, April 9, 1979 at 8.0p.m.

PRESENT: Mr. F.W. Owen (Chairman), Mr. R.W. Pearce, Mrs. M.E. Crofts, Mrs. A.M. McNuga, Mrs. E.M.G. Playor, Mr. H.W. Hunt and Mr. R.F. Payne, with the Clerk (Mr. P.G. Reid), six parishioners and a Press representative.

- 1. MINUTES of the meeting held on March 12, 1979 were confirmed and signed.
- 2. MATTERS ARISING.
  - a. Planning. (Item 2a of last minutes).
    - i. Easement (2ai).

Letter (7/3) from Mr. Collis to Council solicitor said most of the material being used in building had been delivered through his own drive and said common would be re-instated if no agreement was reached regarding access, and entry to now dwelling would then be effected from his own drive.

Letter (22/3) from District Valuer said negotiations continued but so far no offer had been received which he was prepared to recommend the Council to accept. - Correspondence noted.

## ii. Current Applications.

a. Tatefield Working Men's Club (79/243/394).

Flans for this proposal to demolish the existing clubhouse and erect a new club which will provide living accommodation for a steward and incorporate also an underground car park were available. These were inspected by both members of the Council and parishioners present and considerable discussion ensued.

The Council approved the plans in general terms, but the Clerk was instructed to forward the following recommendations and suggestions to the Chief Planning Officers

- 1. To forward a copy of a court order in favour of Mrs. D. Geary made at Reighte Geunty Court on April 17, 1962: to point that the existing building infringes the terms of that order. It also to be pointed out that the infringement is u on Nostmore Green, which belongs to the Perish Council and is managed by the District Council. It would appear that any new building on the same building line would be in breach of the court order (though Mrs. Geary, who was present, indicated that she had no wish to pross the matter, being herself a member of the club).
- 2. To point out that brewers! lerries turning into the club already on occasion have difficulty and have on occasion im inged on the common. The proposal to increase the width of the main building is therefore looked upon with concern as tenling to worsen this situation.
- 3. To emphasise the great importance attached to this development in the centre of the village and t ask that representatives of the Parish Council shoul have the opportunity of mooting the Chief Planning Officer, inspecting samples of the naterials to be used to provide the external finish and discussing all relevant details of the new building. The Chairman, in his capacity as District Council member undertook to follow up the last item with the Chief Planning Officer.

iii. Bramblewood, Greenways (79/260/396).

(Alterations: 1st floor addition: three bedrooms, playroom & bathroom). Clerk to write to Planning Officer asking that the views of adjoining householders should be consulted.

iv. New Applications.

Mr. Hunt was appointed to deal with applications notified during the month, Mrs. MeHugo undertaking to deal with those notified during the preceding week-end.

b. Village Appraisal (2b). and collection

Reported that distribution of questionaires was now almost complete and the response was proving good: Mrs. Flayer said something like 90% and Mr. Hunt about 70% in areas of which they had knowledge.

## c. Abandoned Car (2d)

Mrs. Player reported that this had now been removed.

## d. Stiles: Horse Riding (2c).

Letter (23/3) from Mr. Chittenden promised that four stiles would be delivered to the County Council's Godstone depot and the Council would be told when they were available for collection. The cost would be debitted against the £100 allocated to the Parish Council for footpath expenditure. Mr. Chittenden asked the number of the footpath over Council property on which one of the stiles would be created.

After discussion it was decided not to proceed with a procesal that metal angle arons should be used in putting the stiles up.

Clerk to ask that the stiles be delivered to the Secut Hut at the County Council's

convenience when a vehicle is next in Tatsfield.

Letter also to be sent to Mr. P. Vale informing him of the position, asking if the Scouts will be prepared to help in erecting the stiles and if so what denation to their funds would be considered appropriate.

Mrs. Crofts said the stiles would be placed on Footpaths 19 and 570.

The Clerk reported that he had written to Mr. Stearn thanking him for his visit. In reply Mr. Stearn had promised to provide information of materials to be used in the re-building of the Men's Club when these were available. (Item 3ai of last minutes).

The formal agreement had been received, signed and returned to the Council solicitor for the completion of formalities.

c. Land Adjoining Oak Bank, Old Lane (3b).

Lotter (16/8) from Planning Officer said this application had now been approved. Letter (27/8) from Nr. D. Hayes protested against this decision taken in opposition to local views as expressed by the Parish Council and local residents.

Mr. Dothie said only the Parish Council's objection was placed before the Committee.

  Objection forward to Browley Planning Officer on customary grounds. Acknowledged.

- g. Beechwood Riding School, Cudban Read (TA/79/2895)(Item 2d, minutes of 10-9-79)
  Letter (19/11) from Planning (The per said widing school had been operated under licence for six years and field and been used for horse grazing for many years.
  Permission had been conditionally granted.
- h. Rear of Spindleberry House, Paymesfield Road (79/1116/(0)/1616.

This was an application to build three detached houses with garages. Decided after discussion to register the strongest possible objection on grounds that (1) previous applications regarding this site had been rejected, (2) that it would involve excessive development, doubling the existing density, in what is viewed as a 'green area' well outside that in which, in this Council's view, further building should be permitted.

#### i. New Planning Applications.

Mr. Hunt was appointed to deal with applications notified during the coming month.

#### j. Village Appraisal (21)

Mr. Hayes applogised to the Council and said he would be unable to preset a report on the results of the questionaire until the next meeting.

Clork reported letter (2/11) from Mr. W.J. Collett of Ninehams Road saying he had heard of the questionaire as a newcomer, and wished to express his support for the grading of unmade roads and their topping up with gravel. - Clerk's reply, referring Mr. Collett to Mr. Hayes, approved.

#### k. Stiles (2m).

Chairman to collect stiles from Godstone depot. - Enquires to secure their eraction by volunteers to continue.

# 1. Hall Insurance. (20)

Clerk read reports of Fire Officer as forwarded by Mrs. Hayes and Chairman said much of the work specified had already been carried out.

Clerk pointed out that the Fire Officer's certificate would be needed before the insurance company were prepared to quote for further increase in public liability cover.

# m. Crown Road (2p).

The Chairman reported on correspondence he had conducted with Mr. P. Leslie and a long discussion ensued. It was generally agreed that it was desirable to reinstate Crown Road to permit particularly that it can be used as a footpath and bradle way throughout, including access from Tatsfield Green. Mrs. Crofts asked that her objection to its use as a bridleway should be recorded. Clerk to investigate method of securing 'easement' to permit part of common to be used as a bridleway leading to Ricketts Hill. Footpaths Committee further to consider detailed application of proposal.
