2 Matters Arising

a) Ref 2a: B Gas - On advice from Service Engineer, agreed that usual white meter box should be installed on Hall wall, free of charge, which would incorporate pipe. B Gas had also promised to remove telegraph pole from field and improve hadge bank. Clerk to report various complaints of subsidence from pipelaying in Borough, Goatsfield and Ricketts Hill Rds. b) Ref 2b: Bus Services - Timetables had now been issued and displayed.

Clerk to photocopy more copies of No 23 timetable.

c) Ref 2c: Tree planting - English Woodland to be asked to replant Massacaur corner as far as possible according to plan; also to stake trees on Green (for approx £20) if TDC do not complete work. It was agreed that Mr Payne should ask TDC Direct Works Unit to quote for maintaining the various areas of PC controlled land (separate quotes also for Village Hall planted areas and Pond clearance); quotes also to be obtained locally if Hr Payne received any suggestions.

d) Ref 2e: Clackets Green - No definitive information had been found; Clerk to write to SCC Highways asking them to investigate apparent encroachment.

e) Ref 2f: Police liaison - Chairman to attend meeting on future of Liaison Groups on 22.1. It was suggested that more localised groups would encourage interest and attendance with perhaps an annual meeting at a wider level; also direct mailing about meetings to targetted groups such as Youth Clubs.

f) Ref 2h: Possible enforcement - It had proved impossible to arrange a meeting with the owner of Franklyns; since the question of the intrusive bollards had exercised the Co without success from 1984, it was agreed to let the matter rest. Smokey Mountain still to be investigated.

Ref 5: Noticeboard at bottom of Ricketts Hill - no planning permission reard; Clerk to seek householder's permission to site in hedgerow and

obtain quote from Mr Bishop.

Age of School Transfer

Official documents (which had had to be requested from SCC) had been circ with Agenda. Dr South summarised Tatsfield's two options: to become an Infant School for ages 5-7 with a school roll around 85 on the edge of viability; or to become a Primary School for ages 5-11 with space available for expansion although still small within category. Council expressed itself wholeheartedly in favour of the second option for the long term wellbeing of the village. THE STRUCTURE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN ENGLAND

This response to the Consultation Paper was approved by Tatsfield Parish Council at its meeting on June 10th 1991.

UNITARY AUTHORITIES

- 1 Tatsfield is situated in the northeast corner of Tandridge District, on the border with Kent and the London Borough of Bromley.
- We believe that our existing District council is the appropriately-sized body to provide most services for Tatsfield and its residents and that the present boundaries of the district should be maintained.
- 3 We believe that the present county administration is too remote. County Hall is actually in the London Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames, outside Surrey, and far removed in local peoples' thinking from this part of the county.
- 4 If there are to be unitary authorities in Surrey, we believe that they should be based on the existing districts. This would serve the purpose of relating the structure of local government more closely to communities with which people identity. It would also clear up the confusion in peoples' minds (and reduce administrative complications) arising from the fact that some existing responsibilities are shared between the county and the district.
- 5 It is clear to us, however, that in the event of a move towards unitary authorities, effective arrangements would have to be made for existing county responsibilities such as policing, education, highways and transportation. If it is decided not to introduce unitary authorities, there still needs to be some rationalisation of the distribution of responsibilities between counties and districts in relation to planning, highways and waste etc.

PARISH COUNCILS

The Consultation Paper states the government's belief (para 32) that there may be a case for enhancing the role of parish councils, especially where a new unitary authority covers a wide area. We believe this case exists, irrespective of the size of the area, but that parish councils should not merely provide a further layer of local government

as soon as another is removed. It would be unfortunate if the streamlining of the upper tiers of local government were to provide a gap which would then be filled by parish councils whose increased responsibilities would mean more formalities and more bureaucracy leading to a growing remoteness from the community. One advantage of the existing level of activity in parishes is the relative informali of the proceedings at council meetings. This includes the practice Tatsfield since 1955 of allowing a "public five minutes" every hour, for parishioners to raise matters of concern.

- 7 Une of the most important issues at the parish level is planning it is here that much controversy can arise over decisions at the district or county level which appear to disregard local conditions.
- We propose that parish councils should be given opportunities to argue their case at meetings of the local planning authorities where is known that their views are at odds with the recommendations of planning officers. The opportunity for a parish council representati in addition to the ward member or the district council to speak planning committee meetings would allow committees to discuss the application fully and to ensure that they had taken the views of parishes into account.
- Similar arrangements should apply to highways matters, licensing for goods vehicle operators, waste disposal etc. The principle should be that parish councils should have the right to be consulted and, it they disagree with the action proposed by the relevant authority, the they should be entitled to a hearing before that authority makes its decision.
- 10 Footpaths and bridleways are rights of way matters where parish councils are likely to have reliable and relevant local knowledge. We propose that highway authorities should delegate to parish councils powers to create rootpaths and bridleways, and to divert them where objection has been lodged. Extinguishment should remain the responsibility of the highway authority.
- If we believe that in this way the decision-making process should not be slowed down significantly. Farish councils might be asked to most more frequently in order to respond to consultations effectively.
- 12 Parishes should not be granted the power of veto. This would del decisions. Introduce an extra layer or responsibility, and be an invitation for political parties to make further inroduce into parish politics.

3 Planning

a) MSA: It had been agreed that 'Clacket Lane' was the correct spelling and TDC and DTp had been so advised.

b) Low Cost Housing: Chairman reported on a letter received by all Councillors from Mr Gordon Reeve concerning the use of land opposite Westmore Green. Council's view was being sought on a proposal to make the land available for a group of 8-10 houses for low-cost rental by local people; this would utilise private finance and advantageous loans from the Housing Corporation but be independently managed by a Housing Trust or Association; this in turn would be run by professionals for a 10% management fee; local bias could be built into the scheme. The Chairman pointed out the history of the site which was in the Green Belt and had been rejected for development by TDC, by Inspectors on appeal and by the North of the Downs Plan. This was endorsed by other councillors who also mentioned that TDC owned a site in Lusted Hall Lane which would be more likely to be used for such a scheme. Mrs Boadella wondered whether a land-swop could be effected between the two sites to take advantage of the private finance available. This was thought unlikely and Mrs Player highlighted the current difficulties over finance experienced by the Housing Corp. From the floor, Mr Hayes noted that already a knock-on effect from the Golf Course was being experienced as Mr Reeve had noted the difficulty of access to the land now, which would affect any alternative plans.

c) Surrey Structure Plan: The new Plan, to cover the period up to the year 2006, was in circulation, comments to be sent by 21.11.91. Meanwhile a public meeting was scheduled locally for Weds 30 October at 8.00 pm

at Oxted County School.

d) SCC Draft Golf Guidelines: In circulation, comments by 20.11.91. It was noted that TDC considered that these were too vague and too late; Chrmn had highlighted the section dealing with ancillary development.

e) Planning legislation: A letter had been recd from the Minister for Housing & Planning, via MP, Sir Geoffrey Howe in response to TPC's queries about 'twin-track' planning applications. The Minister appeared to favour twin-tracking as an aid to speeding up the planning process, although suggesting that the 2nd application should not be allowed the present concession of a 20% fee. The reply had been copied to the E Surrey Parishes Liaison Group. During public 5 minutes Mr Hayes, who had initiated the enquiry while on the Council, commented that he was not aware of any unreasonable delay in processing planning applications, certainly by Tandridge, and that twin-tracking seemed to favour development rather than presuming against it.

- f) Dumping in Goatsfield Road: Clerk reported on a meeting between the owner of the site, Mr Maddison and officials from SCC, TDC and TPC from which it became apparent that the present situation had arisen from initial mishandling of the planning application. However, a licence was still needed for the final tipping of top soil across the site; TDC were to advise SCC of the minimum depth read so that load numbers could be specified. Licence application should be dealt with on 7 November and if granted would probably be limited to 6-8 months with deliveries allowed only between 10-5, Mon-Fridays. It was expected that the site could be finished in Spring 1992 but an application for extension could be considered if necessary. No dumping was allowed on site at present and Mr Maddison was advised to make the entrance boundary secure against illegal tipping.

4 Highways and Rights of Way

a) FP diversion: TDC had sent advance notice of proposed diversion to FP21 to take it around the edge of the field at Church corner rather than across the middle, thus avoiding a fairway planned for the new golf course. Several Councillors from their own experience disagreed with the landowner's contention that the diversion would only add 79 seconds to a walk along the footpath and there was unanimous agreement that the Council should object strongly to the proposed diversion of this ancient and popular footpath, particularly when it had been the subject of a diversion order only last year.

b) FP obstructions: Following to be taken up with landowners - FP21 hedgerow obstruction (Mr Beck); FP23 overgrown access (Mr Goldsmith).

Noted that KCC had been very prompt and helpful over FP330.

c) Bridleway obstructions: Following to be reported to local authority - diversion of bridleway across Lusted Hall Farm to where it becomes B463 near Beddlestd La. (Bromley); blockage of B27A entrance from Clarks Lane across Tatsfield Court Farm (SCC).

d) Highway repairs: Enquiries to be made of TDC why potholes in Westmore Road pavement next to PO not included when recent road repairs done, also pothole on W Road side of The Parade. Since the area was dangerous inicy weather Clerk also to enquire whether a guard rail could be erected along W Rd next to, and at 90° from the PO wall.

e) Speed restrictions: Concerns about speeding in Paynesfield Road were again aired and it was agreed that the police might be asked to do

'spot' checks during their programme of visits.

f) Public Enquiry into reclassification of Bridleway 28: There were 6 objectors to SCC's intention to reclassify as a BCAT (Byway Open to All Traffic) largely because of fears of attracting 4WD enthusiasts and possible access to the MSA. Enquiry to be held in Tatsfield's Parish Room on 28/29 January 1992.

g) MSA Access: It was agreed that if monitoring of local roads usage by MSA construction traffic were to take place, results would need to be set against a data base of pre-construction traffic flows. Clerk to obtain guidance from SCC Transport Unit and a private traffic consultant with a view to a traffic census being taken as soon as possible. Mr Biswas agreed to co-ordinate the project; volunteers to be sought through the Parish Magazine.

h) Unadopted roads: Mr Payne reported that SCAPTC was still waiting for a reply from NALC on the initiative taken by TPC, and will follow up.

i) Maesmaur Road: A parishioner remarked that cars seemed to be parked on all available verges at the far end of Maesmaur Road but a neighbour to the property in question said she had no objection.

j) Church Lane bend: A large field entrance had been cut in the hedge right on the dangerous 90° bend - Clerk to enquire of TDC.

- a) SCAPTC Councillors' Seminar, 16.11: Mr Biswas gave a brief resume of the three main topics which had been covered, namely Budget & Finance, the Surrey Structure Plan and County Transport Policy. It was noted that TDC had a Poll Tax collection rate of 84% of 67% for the South East generally; and that no new major road developments were envisaged and that there were widespread objections to the proposed widening of the M25.
- b) N Downs Action Group, 28.11: M25 again the main topic; DTp proposing use of bunds and fences as noise absorbers as trees unproven (!); decibel level of 62 had been recorded on The Ridge at Woldingham; compensation for widening was planned for over 1Th houses between Js 6 & 8. Mrs Maddison further reported that co-ordination of approach had been discussed and it was thought that TDC was the best focus. Mr Biswas advised attendance at any forum discussing the matter.
