- 1. APOLOGIES were received from Mr. J. Softley.
- 2. MINUTES of the meeting held on March 8, 1976 were confirmed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning (Item 3a of last minutes).

Mrs. Crofts reported on applications notified during the month. She volunteered to examine these notified dueing the coming month.

b. Twinning (3b).

The Chairman reported that a party of six representing the Parish Council visited Vern D'Anjou the previous week-end and were warmly entertained. There were some doubts at the mement about whether the reciprocal visit of a French party to Tatsfield planned to commence on April 29 would take place them.

Following the Chairman's report it was proposed by Dr Hessian, seconded by Nr. Clarke and agreed that up to £20 be devoted from Council funds towards the entertainment of the French party. - Agreed. The Chairman further reported that two football teams from Tatsfield would be visiting Vern D'Anjou over the Easter week-end.

c. Parish Mouting (3c)

Matters arising from the parish meeting were discussed. It was agreed to recommend that the minutes of the 1975 parish meeting and of a special parish meeting during the year which were, by a misunderstanding, not fedmally presented to the meeting should be so presented to the parish meeting 1977.

. i. Dispensing of Prescriptions.

The Chairman having reported on a letter received from a pharmacist who was prepared to help, the Clerk was instructed to enquire whether Mr. R. Watson of the Bakery would be prepared for his premises to be used for the receiving of prescriptions and the distribution of modicines after they had been prepared, it being understood that Mrs. Mackenzie of 27 Shipfield Close was prepared to provide an interim service of this nature.



ii. Village Hall Lettings.

Letter (10/4) from Mr. W. Slatter, secretary to Village Hall
Management Committee discussed the problem of verying charges for hire
on what were described as 'village occasions'. Applicants, it was
suggested, should be advised first to consult the management committee
who would take into consideration any views expressed by the parish
council. The Committee would seek the council's views before
finally rejecting an application.
During a public discussion Mr. M. Wilmot explained the Management
Committee's views in some detail.
The Council agreed to adopte the policy as outlined by Mr. Slatter
and explained by Mr. Wilmot.

iii. Vern D'Anjou Association.

On the proposition of Mr. Hayes, seconded by Mr. Goodchild it was agreed to recommend to the Village Hall Committee that the Tatsfield/Vern D'Anjou Association should be credited with any payment made in respect of use of the hall on the evening of the parish meeting.

iv. Concessionery Bus Feres.

Following discussion of the position arising following the ending of concessionary bus fares for all people on local buses the Clark was instructed to write to the Minister for the Environment (Mr. Peter Shore) drawing attention to the grotesque situation arising in which those living in aljoining areas anjoyed free bus passes throughout Greater London, whilst facilities in the Tandrilge District had been ended: with the result that all people had to pay a fare of 20p to reach the nearest larger community.

d. Church Road/Westerham Road Junction (3f)

Lotter (18/8) from County Council said Titsey Estates ha' agreed to the removal of the beach tree and regrading of the embandment on the inside of the read. This work would be carried out at the earliest opportunity. - Noted, Mr. Hayes registering his view that the work was unnecessary.

Following a suggestion by Mrs. Wilmot during a public adjournment the Clerk was later instructed to suggest to the county council that a replacement tree should be planted at a point which would not interfere with visibility.

e. Village Sign (3h)

The Chairman submitted drawing of lettering to be used, which was approved.

f. Clerk's salary (3n).

Letter (16/3) from District Auditor considered by the Council in Committee. Reporting back in public session the Chairman stated that a resolution confirming that the resolution passed at the February meeting correctly interpreted the intention of the Council had been agreed to with one abstention.

The repost was accepted.

- 2. MINUTES of the meeting held on May 10, 1976 were confirmed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning (Itom 7a of last minutes).

Mr. Pearce reported on applications notified since the last meeting and on recommendations he had forwarded to the District Council. His report was adopted.

i. The End, Westmore Green.

Letter (14/9) addressed to the Chairman sought confirmation that Westmore Green is owned by the Council and that no future building is envisaged.

c. Church Road/Westmore Road junction (7e)

Letter (26/5) from Crunty Area Engineer said site meeting was being arranged with Mr. Pearce. Police and the Area Officer would be representated at the meeting.

Mr. Pearce reported that the meeting had now been arranged to take place on Mednesday, June 16 at 2.0p.m. and it was agreed that the Vice-Chairman and Mrs. Hession should represent the Council at the meeting, their briefing being that the Council agrees that the removal of the tree will not solve the traffic problem at this point.

Letter (11/5) from Chief Environmental Health Officer described work carried out by the Water Authority which it was hoped would effect a permanentisolution.

Further correspondence between Mr. Abraham and the District Council threw doubts upon this and brought the comment from the Environmental Health Officer that it seemed the water was sub-soil water and suggested that the owners might want to consider some form of drainage to

control the flow.

The Chairman reported on his own inspection of the site. After discussion the Clork was instructed to write to Mr. Abraham saying that there seemed at the moment little this Council was able to do, but inviting him to forward any further comments if it is felt the Council can help.



h. Ninehams Road (7c).

Mrs; Crotfs reported that the footpath between Mineha's and Maesmawr Roads was overgrown. Clark to request occupier to cut this back as soon as possible.

i. Crossways Footpath (%p).

Mrs. Player reported that the majority of residents of Crossways desired a footpath and that two occupants were confined to wheeled chairs and would reap especial benefit. Occupants on the south side (where there is a public fodtpath) favoured a path: those on the other side, though less anxious for one would probably be prepared to co-operate Clork to re-open matter with District Council and to ask them to renew negotiations for the laying down of a path, bearing in mind the attitude of frontagers and residents as reported by Mrs Player, who was thanked for her enquiries.

Formal notification received of June meeting.

- 2. MINUTES of the meeting held on June 14, 1976 were confirmed and signed.
- 3. MATTERS ARISING.
 - a. Planning (Item 3a of last minutes).

Mr. Hunt reported on applications notified during the mpnth and representations made on behalf of the Council, mentioning in particular application imrespect of a garage in Grove Road.

In relation to land bounded by Borough Road and Ship Hill he had indicated this Council's support for the erection of a single detached house, but its opposition to alternative plans for a larger number of deallings.

Mr. Hunt's action was approved and his report adopted.

ii. Current Applications.

Mrs. Player was appointed to deal with applications notified up to the September meeting, and Mrs Hession those during the following period.

b. Bus Service (3b).

Mrs. Crofts reported on meeting held at Oxted on June 22 from which it was hoped a service to Oxted would eventually result. A further meeting was to be held. In her view a minimum stay of two hours in Oxted was necessary to make the service reasonably useful to local people.

The Chairman reported that he had had a request for a late service bus on Friday evenings, and this request Mrs. Crofts agreed to put forward. - Mrs. Crofts' report was adopted.

c. Church Road/Westerham Road junction (3c).

The Vice-Chairman and Mrs. Hession reported on a meeting held on the site on June 22, at which they represented the Council.

There was a concensus of opinion among representatives of the police and the highways department that there would be a considerable improvement if the tree was removed, the bank cut away, and some road widening carried out and with these views the Farish Council representatives agreed.

An informal approach was being made to secure the dedication of a small piece of land. - report accepted.

During a public adjournment Mrs. Wilmot again drew attention to the desirability of planting another tree to replace that to be felled, and the Council reiterated its earlier view and instructed the Clerk to express to the County Council the hope that a tree would be planted in a suitable situation.

d. Grass Cutting (3cii).

Letter (7/7) from County Council indicated that cutting of verges etc was now restricted to once a year. Work at Church Read/B2024 junction had already been carried out. - Noted.

e. Hall Insurance (3d).

Detailed contestion from Cornhill Insurance Company discussed and approved with the variation that the company be asked to increase public limbility cover from £100,000 to £250,000. Cover as originally proposed had been accepted by the company as from June 29.

f. John's Road (3e).

Following a further visit Chairman and Vice-Chairman to report to next meeting.

g. Advertised Site (3f)

Mr. Pearco reported that no further action appeared to be called for. It now appeared that the advertisement did refer to the Limes.

h. Scepage, Goatsfield Road (3g).

Further correspondence from Mr. S. Abraham considered. Afterdiscussion the Clark was instructed to inform Mr. Abraham that it appears that the responsibility for further action must rest with the frontagers and suggest that he pursue thematter with this in mind.

i. Minchams Road (3h).

Following reports by the Cherk and Mrs. Crofts and consideration of letter (7/7) from District Council saying matter had been passed to County Council the Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Hines asking for the hedge to be cut back by July 25. If this is not done, Mrs. Crofts to take matter up with County Council with a view to that Council taking action.

j. Crossways Footpath. (31)

Letter (2/7) from District Council indicated that matter would come before a co-mattee meeting in either August or September.

k. The Grooms (3j).

Clark reported that completed deed of gift was returned to solicitors on June 19.

Letter (2/7) conveyed accounts for costs of donor amounting to £161.30 which it was agreed to accept.

Herngement (3ji)

Letter (5/7) from District Council said it was likely to be some time before the information asked for could be supplied. Clark to reply pointing out the need to clarify this Council's legal position and (2) to seek interim cover from brokers in respect of third party liability.

1. Tatsfield Playing Fields Association (3k).

Reported that club representatives met six members of Council on June also that District Council might be making grant of £150. Clerk to confirm that two members of Council will attend next meeting of Association to bear details of proposed work.

m. Administrative Expenses (31).

The Chairman reported on the proceedings of the Council in Committee on June 14 and Mr. Fearce on information he had received.

Resolved by five votes to one in accordance with the recommendation of the Council in Committee to offer an annual payment of £25 to Westerham Farish Council in respect of the allowance made to the clerk whilst present arrangements continue.

n. Clackett's Lane (30).

Following further consideration of County Council's letter of 6/5 the Clork was instructed to inform the County Council that the Chairman and Mrs. Hossion would be prepared to most Mrs. Robinson (Surrey County Council) on a date to be arranged.

o. Footpaths (3q).

During a discussion on car parking in the village centre a copy of a letter sent to the County Council by Mr. S. Abraham was read. This opposed yellow lines as proposed and stressed the desire to retain the rural character of Tatsfield.

Following considerable the Chairman moved a resolution reiterating the decision of the previous Council to seek double yellow lines around the island in the village centre.

Reported that notification had been received that applications in respect of Ash View, Paymesfield Road and Windyridge, Johns Road had been refused.

iii. Telephone Exchange Site.

Mr. Hant reported that he had received a reply from the Property Services Agency to a request to explain why there had been a repositioning of the southern boundary fence. The Agency said this was to enable vehicular access to be obtained from Borough Road and thus enable the site to be re-developed. - Reply noted.

b. Bus Service (3b)

Mrs. Crofts reported that the 9.55p.m. bus from Croydon and also the 23.10p.m. from Monday to Saturday would be running to Tatsfield as from Saturday, October 30. Mo further information was available regarding the proposed Oxted service.

Clerk to write to London Country buses expressing appreciation of the extension of evening services and to stress that when an Oxted service is introduced it is important that it should extend to Ricketts Hill. Copy to Surrey County Council for information.

c. Church Road/Westerhum Road Jumetion (3c).

Letter (6/8) from Surrey County Council said tree would be felled and bank re-graded as soon as labour was available. It was not proposed to proceed with read widening at the present stage, but Clark's lane east of Church Hill was to be brought up to motorway haulage standards and this would enable some further improvements to be carried fut. The planting of a replacement tree would be considered when the tree planting programme was reviewed.

Cherk to seek details of work involved in 'motorway haulage route' proposals and other proposed work and to ask that cutting down of the tree be deferred pending discussion of the new situation revealed.

d. Hall Insurance. (3e)

Letter (22/7) said increase in public liability insurance from £100,000 to £250,000 would cost a further £1 premium. This it was agreed to pay.

i. Fidelity Cover.

Clark reported that the District Auditor had queried whether fidelity cover was included in incurence. Clark had confirmed that this was so in relation to the Parish Council policy and that the village hall treasurer being a qualified accountant it was assumed that his professional status provided adequate guarantee. - Correspondence noted.

o. John's Road (3f).

Chairman reported on interview with Mr. Gillam who did not wish to remove stones putside his property but was prepared to consider alternative suggestions.

Pollowing discussion the Clerk was instructed to write (1) to Mrs. Dodd explaining the position and (2) to Mr. Gillam confirming the Chairman's report and pointing out his legal responsibilities, the position having been pointed out to him.

f. Seepage, Scatefield Road (3h),

Letter (29/7) from Nr. Abroham said he was 'somewhat disappointed' at the Council's abbitude.

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Letter (3/9) from Chief Environmental Health Officer forwarded copy of letter addressed to Mr. Abraham which said there was no evidence of pollution with demestic sewage and no public health nuisance. - Correspondence noted.

g. Nimehams Road (31).

Mrs. Crofts reported. The hedge was cut on July 26 and the County promised a small amount of work as seen as labour was available. Arising from this Mrs. Crofts expressed concern at the long delays in dealing with the adjoining footpath (no 20) and the Clerk was instructed to write to the County Council (copy to Mr. MacFarlane) protesting at delays and asking that the work should be given the utmost priority and also underlining Mr. Entwistle's complaint that he is unable to complete his fence until the work is carried out.

h. Greenwayn Footnath (3j).

Reported that this matter was due to have been discussed at the District Council's Housing Committee mosting on September 9. - Mrs. Player to enquire the current position.

This matter was again discussed when a latter (18/8) was read from the County Council asking for a list of priorities of footway schemes which it was desired should be implemented on grounds of pedestrian safety. The Clerk was instructed to place the facts before the county, stressing the priority which this Council would wish given to this matter.



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o. Travelling Library (3r).

Letter (20/8) from County Librarian read. Mrs. Crofts reported that she had received a precisely similar letter.

After discussion the Clerk was instructed to write pointing out that points made by the Council had not in fact been replied to: that the Council still wished for a stop at Tatsfield Green (which could be provided without extra cost and timed before children left school).

Mrs. Crofts said she would be continuing her own correspondence and would pass letters to the Clerk.

p. Car Parking (3s).

Lettersfrom Mr. S. Abraham (29/7) and from Surrey County Council (30/7) considered. Mr. Abraham suggested that the Village Hall and the Hens' Club contributed to the parking problem and thought the Council should consider Village Hall facilities: the remedy might lie in its own hands. The County Council asked if the Council wished to proceed with the yellow lines in the light of objections lodged by the Freight Transport Association and an un-named individual. The Association thought that in legislating for a minor problem a greater hazard might be caused and spoke of the possibility of greater congestion being created in Paynesfield Road, Ship Hill and Shipfield Vintage Inns Ltd., owners on the Old Ship hotel in a letter dated 12/8 intimated that they did not propose to increase their car parking space. They felt the proposed changes might solve the problem. After monsiderable discussion the Clerk was instructed to inform the County Council that this Council wishes to amend its suggestions and would wish double yellow lines to be laid down only at that part of the circumference of the island site where the words 'No Parking' are now painted.

q. Jubiles Celebrations (9b).

On the proposition of the Chairman it was agreed that all local organisations should be invited to a moeting to discuss arrangements for the celebration of the queen's jubilee with the view to the appointment of a special committee.

Clerk to write indicating this Council's opposition to the proposals subject of the appeal and to reiterate to the Inspector objections proviously put forward,

n. Annual Parish Mooting (6a).

PRESENT: Nr. R.W. Pearce, vice-chairman, presiding, Mrs. M.E. Crofts, Mrs. H.L.G. Hession, Mrs. A.M. McHugo, Nrs. E.M.G. Player and Mr. H.W. Hunt with the Clerk (Nr. P.G. Reid), 13 parishioners and a Press representative.

APOLOGIES were received from Mr. P.N. Owen, Chairman.

1. MINUTES of the mooting held on January 10, 1977 were confirmed and signed.

2. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning (Item 2a of last minutes).

i. Report: Tatsfield Working Men's Club.

Mirs. Hossion reported on applications notified during the month and referred particularly to the outline planning application made on behalf of the Working Men's Club regarding a site facing Westmore Green. The application, which would involve about half the field concerned included parking for 50 cars.

Agreed after discussion that the objection already lodged on behalf of the Council should be underlined as supported by a full Council meeting, it being pointed out that the site was in the Green Belt and an area of outstanding natural beauty.

ii. Permitted Develorment. (2ii).

The detailed letter of 30/12 from the Chief Planning Officer having now been studied by all members a full discussion ensued.

MEMORISS CONNECTED WITH THE DEDICATION OF EDWARD VIL MEMORIAL GROUND RICKETTS HILL / OLD LANE TATSFIELD.

Remembered and recorded here. As it was told to Mrs. Doris Geary of Pond Cottages, Tatsfield, by some of the older inhabitants of Tatsfield who were living in Tatsfield at that time and were present at the Dedication Ceremony.

We were given special lessons in school about Wing Edward VII. That he succeeded to the throne of England when his mother Queen Victoria passed away in 1901. King Edward VII reigned for only nine years and died in 1910 after a brief illness. He was known as Edward the Peacemaker. We were told that his coronation had to be postponed from June 1902 until August 1902 owing to his sudden illness just two days before his coronation day. We said special prayers for his recovery after his operation, which we understood had been the first appendix operation performed. One interesting story told us was that before the Boer War soldiers wore red uniforms but red was found to be too noticeable so khaki was substituted, and that as our soldiers had fought in the war during part of the Queen's reign and also part of the "ing's reign that when the war was over some soldiers were given the Queen's Medal and some were given the King's Medal = while some received both Medals. We were not very well informed of news during the war that was going on in South Africa. Although news was eagerly awaited. With no wireless then, and the newspapers had to be fatched by cycle = on foot = or horseback. Tatafield was in those days rather isolated, but when news reached us that the war was over in May, 1902 celeb-ations were held in Tatsfield, and we can recall dancing in the Old Tin Chapel near "Colegates" House which used to be called "Cold Courts" and Maypole dencing by the schoolchildren on the grass in front of Monk's Cottages by the school, and the school was decorated with flags and red white and blue ribbons. The village school was in those days a Church School and the Parson came to the school and we had a Thanksgiving Service. All the children of the village had to attend school from five years of age to fourteen years, but many boys left school early at 12 or 13 years old to go to work to help the family, those were hard times indeed. In 1910 the top end of Paynsfield Road round "Cowens" Corner and Emily Road "now called sestmore Road" instead of big ruts in these roads they were made up. We thought this was very grand. From London we heard news of "Trippen" and the suffragetts and flights by Teppelin and the Wright Brothers Siplane, but Tatafield remained a quiet country village the Parish Hall was being built and the Sakery in the centre of the village. The men worked long hours for very little money.

The Edward VII Memorial Ground is situated on that piece of land that when approached from Dld Lane and is on the left side of the old rough road that connects Old Lane with Ricketts Hill. The boundary of the Memorial Ground reaches to the boundary of Mr. and Mrs. Winson's land upon which their house is built. This is the house that is reached from the slip road off Ricketts Hill. The main entrance to the Memorial Ground is from Ricketts Hill itself, at the far end of the wood which is on Tatsfield Green.

The <u>Dedication Ceremony</u> of Edward VII Memorial Ground took place on a Wednesday morning. The children from the village school were taken to the ground across Tatsfield Green and on to the ground through the large wooden folding gates = The ground was at that time fenced in by oak posts. There was a terrace and a flat platform made of concrete large enough for the village bandstand. Tatsfield had a brass band then, but the players were all at work. There was also a dwelling that resembled a summer house. Around the ground were Laurel bushes, flowering current Laburnem trees and mock Grange trees. A laid out garden with flowers. There were two water tanks both filled with water and on the patio were brick pillars.

The Rector conducted a short service and the children sang the Hymn "Now thank we all our God" which they had practised in school. The squire addressed us and Mr. Wellaway also. We saluted the Union Jack, and sang the National Anthem and when it was all over we were given the rest of the day off as a helf holiday.

This Memorial Ground was at one time owned by a Mr. White who worked for the General Post Office and lived in Old Lane. Mrs. White was well known for the wedding dresses and christening rotes she made, being a dressmaker. Mr. Kellaway at one time Postmaster General acquired this land and gave it to Tatafield for a Memorial Ground. Mr. Kellaway took a great interest in Tatafield, although he lived in a lodge at the Westerham Heights which is at the top of Westerham Hill. He is now buried in Tatafield Churchyard and has a stone to his memory.

There was quite a few people at the Dedication = The Rector, The Lori of the Manor, who in those days was known as the Squire of Titsey. Mr. Billy Fisher, who had the forge in dmily Road, Mr. Millener, from the cycle repair shop in the dip of Ship Hill who arrived with his three wheeled bike. Aubrey Lee, the village constable who wore his big blue cape feared by many a boy. The Publican and Fanny Gesson, with Lena Lavacombe and Tom Dann.

PRESENT: Mr. P.N. Owen (Parish Council Chairman), presiding. The following members of the Parish Council were also present: Mr. R.W. Pearce, Mrs. M.E. Crofts, Mrs. M.L.G. Hession, Mrs. A.M. McHugo, Mrs. E.M.G. Player, and Mr. H.W. Hunt, with the Clerk (Mr. P.G. Reid).

Also present were Mrs. H. Dunn (Bistrict Council representative), Mr. J. MacFarlane (County Council representative) and 23 parishioners.

MINUTES of the annual parish meeting held on March 31, 1976 and of the special parish meeting held on November 10, 1977 were confirmed and signed.

REPORTS.

a. Chairman.

Reporting on the year'swork, Mr. Owen said an unusual situation arose after the election when there were six new members of the Council. He expressed thanks to Mrs. Crofts (the remaining member), former members and the Clerk for help given to the new members in taking up their task. The introduction of a thrice-weekly bus service to 0xted had been welcomed, though there had been some requests for a longer stay in Oxted. Planning matters had occupied a good deal of Council time. All applications had now to be notified to the Parish Council which had made comments as appropriate. Considerable concern had been expressed at the growing urbanisation of Biggin Hill and representations had been made to Sir Geoffrey Howe, as well as County and District Councils. Parish Councils in the Tandridge District had supported the Council's approach. The District Council had been asked to clarify the area in the village centre in which they were prepared to permit development and a reply was awaited. A footpath had been provided for the use of Crossways Court residents at the Council's request and efforts were being made to improve this acility. An increased rate had been requested from the District Council to enable the Council to meet reasonable demands which made by local organisations and to prevent the Council having to face the alternative of falling into financial arrears or of making a demand on the District Council hich could only be met from borrowed money.

Parking around the island in the village centre had caused much debate and by a majority parking lines had been requested as the only way od dealing with the proble, Following representations by the Council the County library stop near the school was re-instated by reducing the times at other stops.slightly. The twinning with Vern D'Anjou progress satisfactorily and about 60 visitors were expected in Tatafield the following week-end. The re-decoration of the Village Hall had persuaded the Council to enter the Best Kept Village Competition (with special reference to the hall) and it was hoped to make a special effort with the village as a whole, with the co-operation of local residents and organisations, in, 1978. Mr. Owen concluded by expressing his thanks to his solleagues on the Council, the village hall management committee and all others who had helped forward communal life during the past year. His report was adopted by the meeting.

b. Village Hell.

The report of the Village Hall Management Committee, as circulated and filed was presented by the Chairman, Mr. M. Wilmot.

The Clerk reported that no nominations had been received for the management committee, despite an announcement on village notice boards.

Mr. Wilmot's report was adopted and during discussion it was agreed that in future copies of planning application lists should be supplied to Mr. Mubbard for posting at the hall.

c. Primary School.

The Rev. Michael Umain (Rector) presented a report on the primary school. a copy of which is filed with these minutes.
His report was adopted.

d. Village Pond Association.

The reports were adopted.

Comprehensive reports on the work of the Fond Association were presented by Mrs. 1. Clarke and Mrs. D. Geory.
Mrs. Geory detailed a number of proposals made to improve and beautify the pond.
It was reported that the Association which had been voted the remaining funds of the former Residents' Association had £240 in hand.

d. District Council.

Mrs. Duan reported on her work on Tandridge District Council. She reiterated the concern expressed by Mr. Osen as to the urban sprawl extending from the direction of Biggin Hill and deal, among other matters, with problems arising from a judgement of couspool charges.

e. County Council.

Mr. J. MacFarlane reported on County Council matters and stressed the problems caused in Surrey by reason of the reduction of the rate support grant.

PRESENT: Mr. P.N. Owen (Chairman), Mrs. N.E. Crofts, Mrs. E.H.G. Player and Mr. H.W. Hunt, with the Clerk (Mr. P.G. Reid), four parishioners and a Press representative.

APOLOGIES were received from Mrs. M.L.G. Hession, Mrs. A.M. McHugo and Mr. R.W. Fearce.

1. CHAIRMAN.

At the opening of the meeting the Chairman received congratulations upon his election to the District Council immediately after the last meeting.

2. MINUTES of the meeting held on Movember 14, 1977 were confirmed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING.

a. Planning. (Item 2a minutes of last meeting).

i. Current Applications.

Mrs. Player reported on applications notified during the month and on action taken.

11. Flot 129, Kemsley Road.

Letter (7/11) from District Council said this application had been refused. - Noted.

iii. Working Men's Club.

Lotter (21/11) from District Council gave notice of appeal regarding the proposal to build a new working men's club with living accommodation on the south side of Westmore Green. The appeal is to be heard at the Council offices, Caterham on Wednesday, January 25, 1978.

The Council's views baying already been conveyed to the District Council it was desided to defer the question of representation at the inquiry until the January meeting.

iv. New Applications.

Fir. Hunt was appointed to deal with applications notified during the coming month.

b. Westmore Pond (2b).

The Chairman reported that the District Council were not prepared to provide financial support at the level envisaged at the present time. - Further consideration deferred.



c. M25 Motorway Service Area (2c).

The meeting noted the outcome of the successful public meeting held at the Village Hall on Wonday, December 5, 1977, the minutes of which are filed separately and the Chairman reported that the District Council meeting held the previous evening had unsnimously decided to oppose the project. Clark reported on letters received from Surrey menity Council (30/11) and Westerham Farish Council (15/11).

The Amenity Council had asked the Ministry of Transport whether there was 'an escapable need' for a service area at this spot, or in any part of Surrey to serve the M25 and had asked that there should be full consideration and consultation with the Amenity Council and with local amenity interests.

The reports and correspondence were noted, the Chairman commenting that the District Council had received 292 letters regarding the proposals, all but two of which opposed it.

d. Surrey Structure Plan: Village Appraisal (2d).

Mrs. Player reported on the meeting arranged by the Joint Parish Councils Conservation Committee held at Oxted on December 8, at which Mr. Harding (Countryside OfficerO and Mr. Pigram (District Council Planning department)

Decided to hold a special meeting to which representatives of all village organisations will be invited at the United Reformed Church on Wednesday, February 15 at 9.0p.m.

e. Village Directory (2e).

Consideration deferred till January meeting. Local organisations to be invited to provide details of officers and other matters of interest at the same time as invitavion is sent to meeting to be held on Fabruary 15 (see paragraph above).

f. Waymarking of Footpaths (2f).

Letter (23/11) from County Council said no formal decision had yet been taken and waywarks were not at the moment available from the Council. - Noted.

g. Parking, Westmore Green (21).

Letter (24/11) from Chief Technical Officer, District Council suggested that if the problem was mused by parking by local residents it might best be solved by a personal approach to those concerned. Following a report of the depositing of quantities of earth at the spots concerned and the expression of concern that adequate pedestrian facilities were retained the Chairman agreed to investigage the position with Mr. Hoskins, the Clerk formally to acknowledge the letter of November 24.

h. Willage Hall 2m).

The Chairman reported letter (23/11) from Surrey Valuntary Service Council, whose views had been sought regarding new constitution. The Council asked for a sight of the deeds and these were handed to the Chairman who undertook to deal with the matter.
