Litter Baskets A letter from Godstone R.D.C. concerning litter baskets was read, & it was agreed that the proposed warning notices should be reduced to a minimum.

Coronation Seat, between Ninehams Rd. & Maesmawr Rd. The Clerk was instructed to find out whether the electric light pole half way up Ship Hill was on the road, or inside private property. Mr. Hodgeson said he would find out whether there was any possibility of placing the seat on the road verge near this spot.

Proposed Dr. Stanton, sec. Mr. Hodgeson that a Siamese Chair seat 6ft long, price £10-17-7 with the inscription E 1953 R be purchased from Messrs. Wm. Wood, Taplow, Bucks. Carried.

The Clerk said that she had been informed that the new price of the seat would be £11.15.10 It was agreed that the Chairman should pay this £ from the money vested in the Chairman of the Parish Council.

Goatsfield Rd. The Clerk read a letter from Godstone R.D.C. <sup>saying</sup> that Goatsfield Rd. is a private road and, as the frontagers did not appear to desire to have it made up under the Private Streets Works Act, the only alternative appeared to be for the frontagers to agree amongst themselves to execute repairs at

Their own cost in proportion to frontage or some other agreed basis. If this were done, the Council would be willing to contribute a proportion of the cost in relation to their frontage or on such other basis as might be agreed. It was agreed that the Clerk send a copy of this letter to Mrs. Hemmant.

Trees at The Ship & on Ricketts Hill

The Clerk reported that the trees at The Ship, & some along Ricketts Hill had been lopped.

Air Raid Shelter

The Clerk reported that the site of the air-raid shelter would be sown in early spring, after being graded out.

The Chairman reported that two members of the W.I., two from the Horticultural Soc., two from the Residents Ass., but none from the Working men's Club, had attended the meeting held at The Bakery, Dec. 28th. The suggestions made were that the roundness of the pond should be disguised by projecting stone work, one or two trees planted, & perhaps a small rock island made to one side.

Commons A letter from the Commons Pres. Soc. was read, including a copy of the letter they had received from Godstone R.D.C. The R.D.C. had said that Tatsfield Green was extremely difficult to manage with a grass cutting machine. The Council went to considerable expense each year in keeping the grass cut & bushes etc. Trimmed on all their commons. There was difficulty in always obtaining sufficient labour for their requirements, however.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Secretary of the Commons Pres. Soc. drawing his attention to the 1st para of the Parish Council's letter on Sept. 6th 1955, where it was said that the Parish Council had offered to obtain labour & machinery to pull out the bushes they thought unnecessary, & at their own expense.

Additional Precept Proposed by Mr. Ridder, sec. by Dr. Sturton that the rating Authority be asked for a precept of £60 for the financial year 1956-57.

Matters arising from Minutes The Chairman first dealt with matters arising from the Minutes. He drew attention to the 1) Main Drain Map on the table, showing the proposed main Drainage Scheme, which was now before the Ministry. Regarding Tapfield Green, the Chairman said that he had had a talk with the Deputy Engineer Surveyor about the suggestion that local volunteers labour, & possibly plant, could be organised to carry out the work of clearing the undergrowth etc. on The Green. As a result, the matter had been brought before the appropriate Committee, who had authorised that the suggestion be given a trial on a limited area of The Green, subject to the work being undertaken under the supervision of the Surveyor. The Chairman said he would welcome volunteers.
