V.L.H.C. report Apologised for Mr. Slatter not attending as he had flu.

During 1971/2 sundry improvements had been made, but were really saving up for the extension work. Mr. L. Brown had replaced Mr. F. Gilmore as P.C. rep. Mr. B. Mansfield joined in July but left in February. Mr. Slatter was the Chairman, Mrs. Brenda Softley, Secretary, Mrs. Slatter Booking Sec. and Treasurer, Mr. Green P.C. rep. and Mr. S. Jupp, Mr. Topwell and Mr. Wilmet. There was one vacancy. The stage curtains and fittings had been completed and a new notice board had been placed in a better position. The tidying up of the frontage was due to Mr. H. Tappell and many thanks were given to him. He had also done a lot of odd jobs in the hall including removing the step from the kitchen to hall which had meant lowering the door.

The hall bookings were up, but income down due to the lack of the Youth Club. The hall is used for a variety of organisations including S.C.C. day hair clinic, the Registrar, Doctors surgery, Kindergarten, Badminton Club, 2 or 3 nights a week, Sports & Social Club, there had been 6 dances and discosques, 5 wedding receptions and 5 Jubilee sales. There was an excess of income of about £240 which would be put towards the extension and redecoration, there would be some inconvenience to users while this was being done, and the V.L.H.C. apologised in advance for this. Costs continued to increase and it would be necessary to review the letting fees which had not changed since January 1970.

Mr. Softley thanked Mrs. Slatter for her report.

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S.C. Representative's Report Mrs Dunn reported that most of the items mentioned in the minutes had been completed during the year. Next year the most important item for Farnesfield was the building of the one bedroom flatlets for Old People in Coopeys. The Ministry grant had now been raised and building was going ahead as soon as possible before rising costs caught up with the grant again. Rates for the coming year, were 84p in the £ which was an increase of 10.5. the new rate was 73.5 in £, 82.4 being the Council Rate. The rate was .6 of new penny and street lighting .5 of new penny. Increase of 1p covered only the increase of cost of living, replacement of vehicles and labour. Other plans such as main drainage were as far as ever away. Possibly something may be done next year.

Mr. Joffley thanked Mrs. Dunn for her report and asked the meeting for any questions before coffee was served.

Resolution for V.M.C. asked for. About ten meetings a year and applicant needed to be fairly active and willing to do odd jobs for the Committee and hall.

Bus shelters, telephone kiosks, Inns, shops, garages, workshops counted as 5

15 marks are awarded for the absence of litter, and attention should be paid to the number of litter bins available. School children could help enormously in collecting litter. 10 marks awarded for general appearance, particular

note around the Village Sign and entrance to Village.

Exterior of Village Hall counted even if not actually entered for competition and it was important to arrange availability of key if entering the hall.

Particular attention to outside of hall was drainage, general appearance, weeds car park etc. Good if the hall is well used.

A report was given afterwards to help in future competitions. Village organisations help a lot e.g. the VI It was recommended that advertisements should be kept to a minimum.

Mr. J. Macfarlane then spoke on Education and School Transport. 2-1/2p

He thanked the Council for being asked to speak, as not many Parishes in his area had asked for his help. He had had some very good correspondence from Sir G. Howe MP

from Farnesfield Residents on the Flounders report and Farnesfield becoming a first school. There would be about 30 children travelling to Middle School in

Warrington in September and about 80 the following year. There was statutory obligation for the County to provide transport. If public transport available that would be used, otherwise a coach would be arranged. He said he was a

representative on S.C.C. Education Committee and Chairman of Schools Committee. Selection was being abolished but the decision to close Whyteleafe which was

later reversed, confused the issue.

Mrs. Pothie, Chairman of Schools Managers Committee said that one problem was the crossing of the road in the afternoon, after school to meet public transport

bus to Farnesfield, one child had been knocked down during the year.

Dr. Hendon, PC said that if children missed the bus they had to hang about Warrington for the next one and he suggested a through bus to Farnesfield.

Mr. Jupp asked if parents still had a choice of schools, as he would prefer to have children educated in Oxford, but the move seemed to be towards Warrington.

It was confirmed that Oxford was pretty full taking children from other areas such as Lingfield.

It was suggested that portable buildings be used until the building

progress for the schools was completed. This would be costly when extra buildings

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was going to be provided anyway. It was reported that the Middle School at Chelsham would not be ready this year, and the date was put at 1974. It was confirmed that only in special circumstances would children from one county be sent to schools in another, as it was more expensive to educate a child in another county. It was suggested that Totterfield should stay a first and second school, but it had been recommended by Flewson report and by teachers that children could not be educated from first to second schools in the same schools without major alterations to existing schools such as Totterfield. Bigger schools more economic. It was confirmed that the SOC had no plans for nursery education. Several parents thought it was wrong to move small children out of their natural environment to be educated, and that the authorities did not realise the problems involved. Also that the change of education programme had not been publicised enough so parents had not realised what it actually entailed. It was confirmed that children who were unwell would be cared for and mother informed before sending them home. Mrs. Dunn asked that parents in future should be asked for their opinions before major changes in education were brought into force.

Mr. MacFarlane could not answer several questions fully and said he would look into them and let the PC know.

Mr. Softley thanked Mr. MacFarlane, and asked for a new nomination for the Village Hall Management Committee 10-10pm

The PC felt that the time had come to locate a playing field for the future, near to the village centre, and had ~~made~~ made sure a site had not proposed to be used for any other purpose. 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Westechan Interchange The Chairman introduced Mrs. Wrigley to speak to the meeting on the subject. It was pointed out that little information had been studied in support of the proposals and Mrs. Wrigley would speak for the ~~East~~ Resistance Group who were completely against the interchange.

The FC had felt that a Public Inquiry was necessary to obtain the full story.

Mrs. Wrigley reported to the meeting on this subject on behalf of the Interchange Resistance Group explaining that a feeder road would affect the jobs of about 12 Parishioners due to the possible closing of a sand pit which produced white sand for colouring. A Public Inquiry was asked for, and for as many people as possible to write to the South Eastern Road Const. Unit to oppose the interchange. This would affect the B 2024 and possibly the Village too, apart from using many acres of farmland unnecessarily as there were other interchanges at Dunton Green and Godstone. It was suggested that a Public Inquiry could be refused on grounds of lack of support.

It was proposed by Mrs. Slatter and seconded by Mrs. Dethlefs that the FC object to the Westechan Interchange proposals and seek a Public Inquiry. Passed.
