Road.

The chairman said that he, with Mr Brown, Mr Keeble and Mr Hitchcock had viewed the proposed road and asked for expressions of views.

Messrs Brown and Hitchcock expressed themselves in favour of the new road, while Mr Keeble thought the scheme too costly.

On being put to the meeting - Messrs Brown, Duddy, Hitchcock, Ward, Smith and Dr Hoffman voted for - and Mr Keeble against.

Stiles.

Mr Keeble called attention to the condition of the stile, at Paynesfield, belonging to Messrs Alder & Collyer.

It was decided to ask Mr Vincent to see to the matter.

The chairman referred to the condition of the footpath <sup>at Ship Hill</sup> leading to the Church, and it was decided to communicate with Mr Vincent on the matter.
