Painting of Council Houses As the Surveyor had recently introduced varied colours in the re-decoration of Council Houses, it was thought that this scheme would be adopted when it came to the repainting of houses in Tatsfield.

Footpath School - Village The County Divisional Surveyor said in a letter that his Committee had instructed him, as & when suitable hard material became available, to form the foundation for an extension of the F/P on Ship Hill so far as possible within the existing highway limits.

Absence

An apology for absence was received from

minutes Mr. Knight

Re-instatement The Minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed of roads.

The Clerk read a letter from the Engineer-Surveyor saying that the roads were to be cleared up, & the reinstatement of the trenches would be to leave them in a state no less satisfactory than they were before the execution of the work of main drainage. A certain amount of work had been done, &, pending the Contractor's arrival to carry out final works, instructions had been given for continued maintenance to provide a reasonable surface.

(making up
to standard
for adoption)

A letter from the County Divisional Surveyor said that it was impossible to suggest a figure of probable cost for the repair of roads to such a standard as would enable them to be adopted by the County Council as highways, unless surveys, & very full investigation were first undertaken. It was probable

that the cost would work out at something like £2-10-0d to £3 per foot of frontage. Repayment to the Council can normally be spread over a period of ten or 15 years.

In the case of Old Lane, it would appear that there is only necessity for the construction

of a path fronting the various properties, the owner of common land could not be called upon to meet Private Street Works charges.

The Clerk said that she had been unable to discover who had paid for the S. end of Ricketts Hill Rd. which had common land on both sides, or of the S. end of Old Lane, both now adopted by S.C.C.

The Clerk said she had been informed by the Clerk R.D.C. that negotiations were still in progress. It was agreed that R.D.C. be asked for a copy of any minutes relevant to the matter that could be read at the A.P.M. in March.

Rates

The Clerk said that she had been told that no arrangement for paying rates such as employed by SEEBoard could be made. Quarterly payment of rates could be accepted in special cases.

Cats' eyes

Bedlestone Lane Mrs. Dotlie asked whether cats' eyes could be used on the stretch of road between Bedlestone Lane & Tabfield Road, when next this part was repaired. The Clerk was asked to bring the matter to the attention of the Highways Dept.

Parking of Mr. Leslie said that vehicles were still being parked at the end of the cinder Westmore Green path, thus causing some tearing up of the green. The Clerk said she would speak to the police on the matter.
