GRAYTON LANE. Mrs. Dunn reported the receipt of the Chairman's letter and pointed out that Town Planning Dept. were aware of our views and that the Public Health Dept. were interested in the site license. Mrs. Dunn confident that the representation she had made was the right one.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL AT WATSFIELD ON 24th MARCH 1970.

PRESENT: All members of the Parish Council, the RDC representative, 22 parishioners, members of the Press, and the Clerk.

The minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting of 1969 were read and signed.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT.

Before offering the report for the past year the Chairman, Mr. E. C. Cooke particularly certain points.

The first being the death of Mr. Stroud, the RDC representative at the time of the 1969 Annual Parish Meeting. In his year of office we had established a very good working relationship and looked forward to its continuation over the full three year term for which he was elected. To our deep regret it was not to be.

After a contested election, Mr. Stroud's daughter, Mrs. Heather Dunn was voted in his place. On the past year's showing we have recognised her to possess an independence of mind which we all respect even if, as a Council, occasionally take a different point of view. We value her regular attendance at Parish Council Meetings.

There was a change in the appointed Clerk to the Parish Council and Mrs. Armargis was appointed to succeed Mrs. Crofts who resigned after seven years loyal work.

Another appointment of note was the arrival of P. C. Seabrook who had already shown a very commendable interest in Village affairs.

The Chairman then gave a report on the year's activities:

- a) Junction of Shipfield Close and Paynesfield Road - we have accepted not very happily the recommendation to leave the alignment of the road undisturbed.
- b) Crossways/Vesture Road Drainage - the linking up of the drains system has been started and we hope the result will be satisfactory.
- c) Unmade roads - the RDC engineer and his team had addressed a public meeting in July which was well attended and seemed to clarify some problems. It is understood that Paynesfield Road will be made up (with one footpath) but that there is still some uncertainty as to the scale of lighting to be provided and this we are taking up with RDC.
- d) Rates - by careful budgeting we have been able to reduce the Parish rate to 5d (including lighting) - a reduction of 1d.

The largest element of expenditure is the loan and interest for the Village Hall purchase. To which, in this coming year, must be added the cost of external repairs and decorations.

ANNUAL PARISH BUSINESS 1970 (contd)

- e) Village Hall - the AGM of the Village Hall Management Committee will take place on 22nd April and the Parish Council applaud the continuing successful Management Committee.
- f) Planning matters - occupy quite a proportion of our time but we can only offer advice to the RDC which they can ignore if they wish.
- g) Lighting - the light switches modified to provide lighting on dark winter evenings.
- h) Snow clearance - RDC road teams congratulated for prompt service.
- 4) Dogs - a) regular of fouling of pavements in designated roads now into force on 1st Feb. 1970.
b) no further action taken on the control of dogs Order.
- 2) Public Transport - further restoration of seats made by London Transport were a lost cause.

The following new matters have occupied us during the past year:

- a) Caravan site at the rear of Concord in Paynefield Road - the RDC have repeatedly deferred any decision and the matter is still under consideration.
- b) The Road Report - this report has far reaching recommendations and the Parish Council have kept in close touch with the Surrey Association of Parish Councils concerning the details. Mr. Borney has been our representative on this body and put in a good deal of work on this subject.
- c) Car park and public lavatories - we have made representations to the RDC for both these amenities and will continue to press for action.
- d) Road and Traffic problems - because of the traffic hazard at the junction of Paynefield and Westmore Roads a suggestion has been made to the Divisional Highways Officer for signs placed on the road surface indicating right of way and "give way".
- Unsettled Hall Lane has been the subject of discussion and the Police report criticised the poor state of the road verges. Unfortunately we are told that no money can be found for the improvement of this road.
- e) The RDC has decided to spend nearly £1,000 on the making up of the approach road serving Whitewood Cottages. We question the wisdom of spending this money to make a 60-ft-wide, which can only feed into an unmade road.

Council Meetings. Mrs. Gipton had had to resign and move to Oxford where the R.D.C. had provided a renal dialysis unit for her use, which was now working satisfactorily. Mr. Horney had missed several meetings through ill health and so had Mr. Cooke. Other members had been present at all meetings apart from Mr. Gilmour once, and Mr. Dickenson and Mr. Softley once.

Commons Registration. Two or three years ago the greens and the memorial garden had been registered, but nothing in the past year.

Telephone Kiosk. To be removed to a site near the bakery in the hope that it will less likely be used as a shelter.

Street Lighting. Paynesfield Road. It had been recommended that two additional lamps be placed in this road, but this had not yet been done.

Pond. The P.C.C. has kept the pressure on for repairing and tidying the pond and its' surrounds.

Bus Services. There had been discontinuance orders on some services, but only strong local feeling could make it worthwhile to put a case to the R.D.C. and it would come out of the rates anyway.

Flowden Report. Mr. Gilmour to report.

Parish Clerk. Thanks to Muriel Arneigie for her 18 month's work as clerk.

Redcliffe Ward Report. The P.C. hope that parish councils will be listened to more in the future, as a result of this report, which would make changes in local government.

Public Toilets. Difficult to justify in village of this size but pressure is put on the R.D.C. when they are granted to other parishes, and one must keep in mind that we are still paying for the Village Hall.

Crime Prevention. Sgt. Hailer gave a lecture on 15th March

Crime Prevention which was poorly attended. There had also been complaints about lack of police coverage in the village as the local police constable had been away a lot lately.

Tidiness of Village Milk crates and abandoned cars had been taken away which helped to keep the village tidier, and which was the aim of the T.P.S.

Footpaths committee consisting of Mr. Cooke, Softley Roper and Hornay. Some had been walked, and they were in fair condition. Obstructions had been moved on Nos 21 and 13a.

Rubble A year ago the P.V. had been told that there was no possibility of acquiring rubble for the filling in of private roads. This needed clarifying by the E.D.C. and the P.C. had been told recently that rubble could be obtained on occasion.

Footpaths, pavements: These had been improved in Crossways and Painesfield Roads, with Westmore road still to do.

Westmore Stern Drain. Work satisfactory, reseeding of grass on green also done.

Whitwood Cottages. The road had been tarmaced and posts were up for the lamps, making one spare lamp which was to be placed outside the Village Hall.

Nuisances by Dogs Arrangements were being made to erect notices.

Residents Association The P.C. gave £10 towards cost of hiring vehicle to take rubbish away.

Village Hall, Exterior Decorating. This had been done well, the interior had yet to be done. Thanks to V.M.H.C. for their hard work as it was difficult to find support. Two nominations were required to fill vacancies.

Repair of Road Signs Some had been repainted. The trial lines at the junction of Westmore and Painesfield roads seemed to be quite successful.

Right of Way Westmore Green. Confirmed that Mr. Wedgwood had license to use green to get to the cottage, The End.

Derelict Cars Removed by E.D.C.

Playground. Position arranged by P.C. R.V.C. and Carnival Association unsatisfactory and people nearby had complained. So the site had been moved to a more central position taking out two trees in the process. Carnival Association had provided money for the Playground.

Council Houses There had been complaints last time about the painting. This year E.V.C. had asked tenants for colour preference for rendering on exterior walls.

Drains Ship Field Close This had been sorted out.

Caravan Site not to be further developed as a caravan site. Possible permission for two houses on Painesfield Road side. Not entirely satisfactory as P.V. wanted to keep it rural because of possibility of development of whole valley.

Westmore Green. Barrier posts still at entrance to footpath to stop vehicles going on green.

The Vice-Chairman concluded by saying that the P.C. might appear to take a long time getting things done, but the P.C. had to be pushed all the time and it got done in the end. He thanked the public for coming and said they would be welcome at the public monthly parish meetings.

Any Other Business

V.M.C. Mr. Slatter said there was an increasing use for the Hall, and there had been many improvements during the last few years. This last year the Hall had been re-wired allowing for more light and heating for the stage area, a notice board had been put up, hanging curtains for stage and Hall itself, and the Exterior had been painted.

There are nine meetings a year, three of which are open meetings to enable the public to air their views and make suggestions.

Mr. Slatter thanked the members of the Committee for their support and to Mrs. Shrub who did the cleaning of the Hall.

There were vacancies for two members to join the committee but no one offered a nomination.

School Managers Report Mr. Gilmour reported that the school would be an eight year old school from 1972. The Governors were Mrs. Crowther, Rev. Lewis who were elected by County Mrs. Dohie and Mrs. Hassell. There were at present 126 pupils. The garage store place had been completed and the Pavilion was now used for woodwork and handicrafts in good weather, and it was hoped to get heat and light in soon. Mrs. Young was absent but Mrs. Davis was in charge of her class for the rest of the year. There had been fire drill in October, and a talk by the police on handling fireworks on October 21st.

Mrs. Tapcell, who had been cook for 30 years had been presented with a watch and clock at her retirement.

The F.T.A. had organised a spring social evening instead of having it in the autumn.

School meals were being provided from Warlingham.

E.D.C. Report Mrs. Dunn said that most of what she had to say had been said in the Chairman's report, but that the council houses in Lusted Hall Lane were being re-wired and having structural alterations done for new bathrooms and toilets. Kamsley Road was being put on mains water and in the future, Approach Road and Parkwood Road. The hedges had been removed by the S.C.C. along the Westernham Road and new hedges had been planted where the road was going to be widened. Drainage had been planned at Westmore Green between Whitewood Cottages and Rose Cottage to alleviate saturation of water which collects there in wet weather. This was last years decision.

Public Queries

Complaints about the cutting down of trees in two plots in Kamsley Road and a Dormobile abandoned. The P. Constable asked if the owner of Tanglands was known as there had been theft of the lead and piping and vandalism in the castle and its grounds.

Mr. Willmet proposed a donation of £10 towards Gain re: Getwick extension, seconded by P.C. Seabrook. All in favour.
