Mr.Harvey reported attendance at a meeting of N.A.P.C. on 10th January at Biggin. At this meeting a public relations pamphlet for newly qualified voters had been discussed and also a questionnaire regarding the "free one fifth" in rating. Mr.Harvey reported that Mr.Justy had been elected as the new Chairman, that a subscription fund for Calabria on his retirement had been opened, and that the annual N.A.P.C. dinner would be held on 10th May, cost 30/- per head.

T.B.C.I. Mr.Smith had submitted a very full report on the external repairs etc. Copies of this would be made available.

INTERTHORPE ROAD. Mr.Biggingsale reported that although this road had been made up for nearly 12 months the residents were pressing for the adoption by the HBC. HBC have section 40 hand and agreement but will not adopt until the defects are made good by the developer. Because of this Shipfield Close does not get the benefit of snow clearing or road cleaning.

WESTWOOD GREEN. The Croft. Mr.Pencher concerned about the bad surface of the path beside the Croft. Clerk to write HBC.

CREATOR SITE. Mrs.Dunn reported the receipt of the Chairman's letter and pointed out that Town Planning Dept. were aware of our views and that the Public Health Dept. were interested in the site licensee. Mrs.Dunn confident that the representation she had made was the right one.

DEVELOPMENT: Biggin Hill. Mrs.Dunn was awaiting town map from Bromley - this would be available when passed by the Ministry. Information available was that the Green Belt would be preserved and only in-filling to be allowed.

PAYNTFIELD ROAD. Mrs.Dunn had no further information regarding the making up but mentioned the question of street lighting - frequency of placing and positioning.

PAINTING OF COUNCIL HOUSES. Following complaints from tenants Mrs.Dunn had spoken to the Housing Manager who had taken action on the bad workmanship and agreed that it was a bad time of the year for external painting. It was unlikely to occur again as HBC in future are employing their own painters.

PRESIDENT: All members of the Parish Council, the EDC representative,

Before offering the report for the past year the Chairman invited Mr. E.G.Cooke particularly certain points.

Another appointment of note was the arrival of P.C. Seabrook who had already shown a very commendable interest in Village affairs.

The Chairman then gave a report on the year's activities:

- a) Junction of Shipfield Close and Paynefield Road - we have accepted not very happily the recommendation to leave the alignment of the road undisturbed.
  - b) Grosvenor/Westmore Road Drainage - the linking up of the drains system has been started and we hope the result will be satisfactory.
  - c) Unsatisfactory roads - the EDC engineer and his team had addressed a public meeting in July which was well attended and seemed to clarify some problems. Mrs. Young was absent but Mrs. Davis was in charge of her class for the rest of the year. There had been fire drill in October, and a talk by the police on handling fireworks on October 21st.

Mrs. Tapcell, who had been cook for 30 years had been presented with a watch and clock at her retirement.

The P.T.A. had organised a spring social evening instead of having it in the autumn.

School meals were being provided from Warlingham.

R.D.C. Report Mrs. Dunn said that most of what she had to say had been said in the Chairman's report, but that the council houses in Lusted Hall Lane were being re-wired and having structural alterations done for new bathrooms and toilets. Kemsley Road was being put on mains water and in the future, Approach Road and Parkwood Road. The hedges had been removed by the S.C.G. along the Westerham Road and medium new hedges had been planted where the road was going to be widened. Drainage had been planned at Westmore Green between Whitewood Cottages and Rose Cottage to alleviate saturation of water which collects there in wet weather. This was last year's decision.
