Minutes The Minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

School The Clerk read a letter from the National Association of Parish Councils stating that the local education authority is responsible for ensuring that there is adequate conveyance for school children, but in practice, this is done through the headmaster of the school concerned.

Proposed by Mr. Ridder, sec. Mr. Drane that L.T.E. be thanked for acceding to P.C.'s request for double decker bus at 3.48 p.m. and asking for an assurance that this conveyance will be put on every winter. Carried.

The Clerk read a correction from L.T.E. stating that bus would run from Warlingham, & not from Wallington, as previously stated.

Minutes of the proceedings of a Parish Council Meeting, held at The School, on Mon. Feb. 5th, 1951

Present Mr. Weatherly (Chairman), Mrs. Hodgson, Miss Knight, Messrs. Beagley, Drane, Ridder, with G.R.D.C. representative Mr. Hodgson & the Clerk.

Apology An apology for absence was received from Mr. Geary.

Minutes The Minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

'Bus Time Table The Chairman drew attention to the fact that a new time-table came into force on Feb. 7th. Prop: Miss Knight, sec. Mr. Drane, that confirmation be sought from L.T. Executive, that 3.48 p.m. School 'Bus would still run into the village. Carried.

Diversion at Firsdale A letter from Godstone R.D.C. was read, asking details regarding a requested diversion by Mr. Goodall. The Clerk was instructed to give the necessary information.

Pond The Clerk read the report sent by Godstone R.D.C. regarding the meeting of Messrs. Geary & Ridder with the 2nd^{members} representing Godstone R.D.C., Mr. Moulding & Mr. Okey. appearance of the green. Consideration might be given to the desirability of filling in the pond (provided there were no insuperable difficulty due to fact that surface water from the nearby road is drained into the pond), or, alternatively, that the pond should be provided with concreted sloping sides instead of vertical sides as at present.

Regarding the rails along parts of the N & S sides of the green, it was agreed that these were in a dilapidated condition. The fence on the N. side separates the green from a Tarmacadam footpath, the G.R.D.C. representatives held that as there was an adequate kerbstone it did not appear necessary to retain this fence.

Minutes of the proceedings of a Parish Council Meeting, held at The School, on Wed. March, 7th, 1951.

Present Mr. Weatherly (Chairman), Mrs. Hodgson, Miss Knight, Messrs. Beagley, Drane, Geary & Riddler, with G.R.D.C. representative Mr. Hodgson, & the Clerk.

Minutes The Minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

School Bus The Clerk read a letter from L.T. Executive stating that the bus on route 403 which formerly left Wallington for Tatsfield, "The Ship", at 3.48 p.m., was, as from Feb. 7th retimed to leave at 3.56 p.m. arriving at Tatsfield at 4.30 p.m. This was now part of the 3.15 p.m. journey from Wallington.

Road Gritting The Clerk read a letter from Surrey C.C. stating that the recent severe weather heavily taxed the resources of C.C. & that every endeavour had been made to concentrate on major roads, consequently the gritting of roads of minor importance had to be deferred. It was decided that this matter should be left for the time being.

Notice Poster Boards

Wire Netting Only one estimate was received, that of Mr. Edwicks for £2.10.0. After discussion, it was decided to ask Mr. Edwicks to quote for 3 screens, of solid wire frame, instead of a wooden one.

Housing A letter from G.R.D.C. was read, saying that the Council had in mind the erection of a small number of houses at Tatsfield, & it was possible that the Surveyor would be in a position to submit

a scheme within the next month or so. The Council had compulsorily acquired a small area of land in Westmore Road for this purpose.

Audit

The Clerk reported that the Books had been examined & allowed by the Auditor on 23rd Feb.

The Auditor had asked that the P.C. should pass a resolution agreeing to the payment of expenses incurred by Clerk in taking Books to Audit.

Proposed by Mrs. Hodson, sec. Mrs. Knight that the payment of these expenses be allowed. Carried.

Election Expenses The Clerk reported receipt of new scale of election fees & expenses.

Path at Westmore Green A letter from Mrs. Thomas, 40, Westmore Cottages was read, drawing the attention of P.C. to bad state of footpath leading from the Swedish Houses to Lusted Lane, & the roadway leading from Swedish Houses out to Westmore Rd.

Annual Parish Meeting 1951

Minutes of the Proceedings of the Annual Parish Meeting held at The School, Wed. March 7th, at 8 p.m.

Attendance Eighteen people, including 7 Parish Councillors.

Minutes The Minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were read & confirmed.

Summary The Chairman made a report of the year's work, &

3 Years Work paid tribute to the happy co-operation between the Parish Council & the Godstone District Representative, Mr. Hodgson.

Polling Station Mr. Drayes asked for the reasons for removing the Polling Station to The Hall. The Chairman gave these reasons.

Condition of The Green Mr. Drayes complained of the "disgraceful condition of The Green." The Chairman assured Mr. Drayes that the P.C. was doing all it could to rectify the matter, & promised to approach Godstone R.D.C. again.

Main Drainage Mr. Malyn Knight asked what prospect there was of the village getting Main Drainage. Mr. Hodgson, G.R.D. representative assured him that Tatsfield was at the top of the list, and, at the moment, he did not think that the cuts in capital expenditure would interfere with the scheme, plans of which would be completed in a few months.

Ditch Old Lane, & Signpost Mr. Burgess drew attention to the overflow of water from the ditch in Old Lane, & asked whether a signpost could be put up which would prevent people who wished to go along Rickets Hall or to Biggin Hill, from coming down Old Lane. The Chairman promised the attention of the P.C. to these matters.

Waste Paper Mr. Burgess also asked about the collection of paper. Mr. Hodgson assured him that waste paper would be collected now.
