Minutes of the Proceedings of a Parish Council Meeting held at The Village Hall on Monday, March 2nd, 1959

Present

Dr. Stanton (Chairman), Mrs. Dothee, Miss Knight, Misses Hodgson, Leslie & Smith, with the Clerk.

Minutes

The Minutes of the last meeting were read, & confirmed.

Village Sign In a letter the Surveyor said he would look into the matter of condensation, & give it the necessary attention.

Bus Shelter An inspection of the condition of the bus shelter was also promised in the same letter.

Cinder Path The Clerk said that she had been told that the cinder path would be retained, and the northern end widened, to allow vehicles to turn, without going on to the green.

National Parks A communication from S.C.C. was examined, giving the date of the first review as 1st Jan. 1959. The Parish Council was invited to submit particulars, before 9th April, of any changes. The Clerk was instructed to tell S.C.C. that 2 F/Ps were being claimed, & asking whether anything further were required at this stage.

Allotments A letter from Mr. Wilkinson was read, in which he asked, on behalf of Mr. Peltier, whether he could take over as many vacant allotments as would cost up to £5 p.a. to rent. The Clerk was asked to write Mr. Wilkinson, telling him that the whole matter of the Allotments was under consideration, and the Parish Council could not yet give a reply to him.

Playing Fields

The Clerk of R.D.C. wrote to say that the land at Fung Corner had not yet been leased to the Council, although the legal formalities were in progress. A considerable amount of work would then have to be carried on depending to a great extent, on the weather. He therefore thought the Football Club should be informed that, although there was every prospect of their securing the field next season, it would be advisable for them to make their preliminary fixtures, away from home, & to depend on the field rather later in the season. The Club was instructed to pass on this information to Mr. Dean.

Caravans in

Taynorsfield Rd Mrs. Dotline said she had been asked whether any restraint could be placed on the number of caravans at Lower Concord, and whether the R.D.C. would allow other caravans to take the place of those who had obtained houses. The Clerk was asked to find out from R.D.C. what the situation was at this site.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Minutes of the Proceedings of the Annual Parish Meeting held at
Bakery, Wednesday, March 18th, 1959

Present Eighteen Parishioners were present, including seven Parish Councillors.

Chairman Dr. Stanton was in the chair.

Minutes The Minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were read & confirmed.

Chairman The Chairman reported upon action taken upon matters arising from Minutes.

Chairman's report The Chairman gave a Summary of the year's work.

Report Mr. Hodgson made a short report upon the Primary School. He said the quality of the Teaching at the School was excellent, & the atmosphere happy. Successes in the 11+ examination were up to the average in the County. A great advantage was the low number in classes, about 25, as compared with a more normal 40. Extensions were being planned, & various improvements. The School managers were always pressing for amenities. He thought the Parent-Teacher Association was most effective. £80 had been raised by their efforts, & he referred to the excellent dramatic performances of the Christmas Nativity play, "Toad of Toad Hall".

Revision of Definitive Map The next item on the advertised Agenda was the Revision of the Definitive Map. The Chairman asked whether there were any additions required to be placed before Survey C.C. Proposed by Mr. Sutton, seconded by Mr. Simpson

that the F/P leading from Westmore Green to Greenways should be added to the revised map.

In favour 14. Against 2.

Proposed Mrs. Dethie, seconded by Mrs. Hall that the F/P leading from Greenways to Goatfield Rd. through the plot adjacent to "Antediluv", should be added to the revised map.

Mr. Simpson said he found the gritting of main roads during the late icy weather, rather inadequate. Others disagreed, & the matter was not pursued.

Old Lane

Mr. Hayes asked for a ^{further} report on what had been done about his complaint at the condition of Old Lane, after the recent laying of main drainage. The Chairman proceeded to give an account of the efforts made to have something done to the road, and this lack of success.

Strong feelings were expressed in the discussion that followed. Proposed by Mr. Hayes, seconded by Mr. Ferroussat that "Godstone R.D.C. be called upon to re-instate Old Lane to its former condition before the laying of main drainage. If the result were unsatisfactory the Parish Council to take up the matter with Surrey County Council for an independent report"
