The Annual Parish Meeting was held at 8.30.p.m. on March 26th 1962.

Dr. Sturton paid tribute to the late Mr. Hodgson and said how tirelessly he had worked for the village both as a Rural District and a Parish Councillor. As the R.D.C. elections were due in May it was not possible to co-opt another member to the Parish Council in his place. Mr. Hassall had resigned through ill health and Mrs. Crofts had taken his place as Parish Clerk. The Parish Council had met regularly and the attendance had been high. The meetingshad been fixed for the 3rd Monday in each month apart from August. The Parish Council had done their best to give consideration to the planning reports sometimes with success. The future meetings of the Parish Council were to take place at the Tatsfield Primary School. The R.D.C. had been approached in regard to the condition of the unmade roads and a meeting in the near future was to take place with the Highways and Bridges Dept. Several additional road signs had been erected and one to indicate the narrowness of Rag Hill was to be erected by Park Farm. The "Upper Paynesfield Road" sign was to be replaced by "Paynesfield Road". There had been complaints of horse riding on Tatsfield Green and the R.D.C. were to be asked to erect notices. Twenty four litter bins had been ordered. The overcrowding at the school would be alleviated by the provision of a new classroom to be erected during the Easter holidays. An extra electric lighting standard had been erected in Westmore Road. The Parish Council had again asked the R.D.C. for their assurance that main drainage in Ricketts Hill would be in the 1964 programme.

Tatsfield Church Hall

The School continues to flourish and the promise of additional accommodation in the form of a new classroom by Easter would relieve the overcrowding. Mr. Groves had left at Christmas to take up an appointment in Bedfordshire and Mr. Pratt was the new Headmaster. Mr. Cooke proposed a vote of thanks to the School Managers and it was seconded by Mr. Pennoons
