The owners of these two properties later raised their objections to the proposed footpath on the grounds of their privacy and security. # 5 "Support Our Shops" Week (3-9.4.95)

(Wendy Maddison declared an interest and it was agreed she should contribute to any discussion but not vote). The plan of campaign put forward by Bob David on behalf of the 4 shops met with general approval, with the proviso that permission was given for the series of posters on the Greens and Approach Road under special circumstances and should not be viewed as setting a precedent. It was noted that the week was expected to cost f510 to mount; it was hoped to obtain a f380 grant from Surrey's Training and Enterprise Council and f80 from the shops, leaving a balance of f50, which the Council agreed to contribute.

6 Report on Village Facilities

Ken Munday presented a detailed paper, as previously circulated to Councillors, on village facilities and future requirements. This had arisen from a meeting in November called to discuss communal facilities in the light of both National Lottery funds and the approaching millenium. Questionnaires had been sent out to representatives of 41 organisations and 33 had replied (80% response rate). From these it appeared that the Village Hall and Furze Corner facilities, even with planned improvements, could not fulfill all village requirements and it was agreed that a small group of relevant local professionals, together with other interested parishioners and a TDC planner should discuss the over-all situation and possible solutions, under the chairmanship of the TPC Chairman. In the meantime the urgency of the Scout predicament would be pursued; a register of resources could be compiled and held by the Parish Council for general use, and other recommendations would be examined in due course. Chairman thanked Ken Munday, and also Bob David, for the hard work put into the report, particularly over a holiday period.

### Proposed Tennis Courts

The case for siting proposed public courts at the L-shaped field had been put by the newly formed Tennis Club committee, and the case for including in facilities at Furze Corner by Councillors Maddison and Wood (both papers having been circulated in advance. Arguments were again put forward from both sides but it was proposed by the Chairman and agreed that the matter could not be separated from the question of village facilities in general (as at Minute 6 above) and would therefore have to await that decision. In the meantime it was suggested the Tennis Club should continue to gather information and estimates of cost (including multi-purpose courts, ie also for netball, etc).

The Chairman reported that a meeting had been held with SVSC's Steve Andrews, TDC's Vince Sharp and TPC, Hall and Scout representatives to understand the current situation better. It seemed that the most hopeful scenario for the Hall was for TDC's Community Projects Funding of £17,000 to be made up by f8,000 from the Village Hall Capital Crants, for use in Feb/Mar 1996 to be matched by f25,000 on a priority list from SCC's 1996/7 budget, which could then finance work in April 1996 (having been agreed in Dec 1995) It was agreed that it might be helpful to write to TDC with an assurance that the work could be phased so that a viable extension shell was in place without recourse to SCC funds should these in the end not be forthcoming. Details to be ascertained by Roland Payne, Vill Hall Co Chairman and Brian Drury, Architects. It was noted that the whole unfortunate situation seemed to have arisen because SCC had been surprised by an increase in tripartite grant applications and had implemented stricter criteria than usual in order to sort out priorities; for which Steve Andrews had expressed regret. Noted that Scouts' Noted that Scouts' application was also on SCC's priority list for 1996/7.

It was also reported that the Hall committee hoped to install a new heating system during the summer, due to problems with the current card payment system and dampness.

# Planning

Applications as at Appendix A had been recd at Tandridge, -- several of which led to discussion:

94/1182 Botley Hill Farmhouse - marquee at rear. It was agreed to write to TDC expressing concern over how a temporary structure at a Grade II listed building in the MGB could be prevented from becoming a permanent feature.

b 94/1139 & 1140 Manor House, Ricketts Hill. There were no objections to the structural alterations proposed but it was suggested that 1.8m high fencing was excessive protection for a slow growing yew hedge and would detract from the open setting which the Grd II listed Manor House had always enjoyed on Ricketts Hill. In addition it would add to the difficulties already experienced in turning almost blindly out of Manor Road into Ricketts Hill. There were further problems with insufficient turning space into the Manor Road side entrance and an "unneighbourly" area of fencing.

The Vice Chairman proposed that, interviews having taken place, the post of Clerk to the Council be offered to Mr John Sandiford upon the terms and conditions set out in the contract to be agreed between the two parties and that appointment be subject to satisfactory references. The resolution was seconded by Amrit Biswas and unanimously Mr Sandiford was then welcomed to the meeting. The Chairman paid tribute to the work of the retiring Clerk over the past six years and this was echoed by Amrit Biswas who said how much he had valued her help and advice during his period as Chairman.

#### 5 Highways and Rights of Way

Church Lane speed limit: Chairman had received a reply from SCC Highways about his traffic calming suggestions outside the school, to the usual effect that extra limits or changed priorities could not be introduced to areas with no accident record.

Golf course footpaths: SCC RoW officer, Martin Fry was b continuing his negotiations with Mr Goldsmith but felt that the proposed new route across the course and out at the Approach Road was now not feasible; he was concentrating on gaining acceptance for the car park diversion and the new link between FPs 26 and 23.

Verges: TDC to be asked if contractors could take more C care near the Green verges along Lusted Hall Lane and the service road by Nos 2-6. A suggestion was received that the verge should be cut back by the Village Sign.



# 6 Village Appraisal recommendations

a Village centre: Although piecemeal measures were being taken to improve the appearance of the village centre, it was thought worthwhile trying again to obtain a professional overview via a number of organisations suggested by Steve Andrews and Bob David. If possible this could feature in some way at the APM.

# NOTE FROM CHAIRMAN CONCERNING GRATUITYTO RETIRING CLERK

As requested at the last TPC meeting, I have considered this matter and the cheque presented to Mrs Gulley when she retired after 8 years' service was £150.00. Her final salary was £690 pa.

There are two ways of looking at the matter:-

- 1. The payment to Mrs Gulley was equivalent to 2.72% of £690 (final salary) multiplied by 8 (yrs service). In the case of Eileen Pearce, this would be 2.72% of £1716 multiplied by 6 which would result in a figure of £280.00
- 2. The payment to Mrs Gulley was 21.74% of her final salary of £690 and in the case of Eileen Pearce this would be 21.74% of £1716 which would result in a figure of £373.00

These figures should be considered and a decision can be taken at the meeting with a minimum of discussion.

Parish Walks (ref 13a): Thanks were expressed to David Wood and Tony Erbes for the production and printing of the Parish Walks, copies of which were selling very well. Receipts from Walks, copies of which were selling very well. the sale of Parish Walks would be collected by David Wood and accounted for to the Clerk from time to time.

Applications as at Appendix A had been received by Tandridge and the following discussion took place:
