Minutes of the Meeting held on Monday 13 January 1997 in the Parish Room, Tatsfield at 8.00 pm.

In attendance: Mr John Sandiford (Clerk), Mrs Tina Fry Councillor), Philip Clark (Parish Constable) and 3 parishioners.

Apologies: Mrs Margaret Boadella (due to illness) and Mrs Stephanice Ripley (SC Councillor).

1 Minutes The Minutes of the meeting held on 9 December 1996 were signed as a correct record.

2 Westmore Rd Recycling Container: It was noted that the container had still not been removed from the road. It was agreed that Bob David would indicate to Hilary Vale that the container must be removed from the road immediately either by the Contractor taking it away or by Mrs Vale moving it on to her own land. Ian Mitchell indicated that there had been several complaints about the parking of a horsebox in the unmade part of Westmore Road. It was agreed that he would investigate the matter.

14a Environmental Clearance Weekend: Bob David reported that he had written to TDC indicating that the Parish Council was not happy with the current arrangements and much preferred the previous arrangement when open skips were sited at three different locations. A reply had been received indicating that the comments were noted. It appeared that the refuse collection vehicle had collected some 5 tons of rubbish which was a surprisingly large amount in the circumstances.

3 Planning Matters a Applications as at Appendix A were noted and the following matters were discussed:-

96/1141 Tatsfield CP School: Eileen Pearce reported that, having inspected the site and considered the matter, she did not consider that any objection should be made but that the question of the height and colour of the Play Wall should be the subject of comment to ensure that the impact on the neighbourhood was kept to a minimum. The Clerk had written TDC accordingly.
96/1136 2 Sunny Bank, Old Lane: Eileen Pearce indicated that she considered that an objection should be lodged to this application on the grounds that it was visually intrusive, that it was outside the village development core, that it would create a precedent, that it might take the property into a larger category and that the height of the building was disproportionate to the width of the plot. Considerable discussion took place when contrary views were expressed. After the matter was put to the vote, it was decided that no objection would be lodged.

96/999 Bransgore, Ship Hill: This application having been refused, it was understood that it was hoped that enforcement



action to remove the fence already erected would not be necessary and that agreement would be reached by the owner and TDC as to some alternative fencing.

12 Westmore Road: It was noted that this property was up for sale.

b Park Hill Golf Club: It was agreed that the Clerk should write to TDC asking for a report on the present situation. c Planning Councillor: Ian Mitchell.

4 Finance

a Budget 1997/98 (Finance Committee): The Chairman indicated that a Paper had been circulated to all members at the request of the Finance Committee. This paper recommended a Budget for 1997/97 and the precept for coming year. The Chairman therefore proposed that the Budget for 1997/98 as set out in Schedule A attached and as recommended by the Finance Committee be approved and that the precept for 1997/98 be £17,500.

After certain aspects had been clarified by the Chairman and the Clerk, the proposal was put to the vote and there were 4 votes in favour with one abstention. The Chairman therefore declared the proposal carried and the Clerk was instructed to notify TDC accordingly.

b Payments: as at Appendix B were approved.

- a Gorsey Down: Bob David reported that he had written as requested to Mr Harrison and he had placed a copy in circulation for members to see. He did not anticipate any response until late summer. b Old Lane/Georges Rd R of W: Denis Hayes reported that he had written to SCC Rights of Way Group indicating that the matter was to be held in abeyance pending further developments. c Dog Fouling: Bob David indicated that he had had complaints about this matter and considered some action should be taken to encourage dog owners to ensure that their pets did not foul public areas. The Clerk indicated that legislation did now exist enabling TDC to make regulations and impose penalties. It was agreed that Bob David would take the matter up with TDC with a view to suitable notices being displayed in affected areas. d Road Signs: Bob David indicated that he considered that the advisory road signs in the village were inconsistent and badly in need of review. It was agreed that Bob David would put forward specific suggestions which could be put to SCC for consideration and, if agreed, action.
- 6 Council Aims & Objectives
 a Future of L-shaped Field: Tony Erbes indicated that the working party had not as yet met and he would endeavour to arrange a meeting in the near future.
 b Millennium Meeting 20 Jan: Invitations had been sent to all local organisations but there had so far been little response. Denis Hayes agreed to place notices on local notice boards to remind parishioners of the meeting. He indicated that the Titsey Estate were very interested in participating and its representative would be attending the meeting. David Wood agreed to arrange refreshments prior to the commencement of the meeting.
- 7 Notified Items: a Policing in Tatsfield: Philip Clark reported that he had stopped several cars in Ricketts Hill Road which appeared to be exceeding

40 mph and he felt that this acted as some deterrent. The reconsider meeting held by Neighbourhood Watch had revealed shortcomings in communication all round. From a crime point of view, he was pleased to report that the Christmas pariod had been quiet. He would shortly be moving to latsfield and this would enable him to patrol for short periods much more easily than was the case at present.

a Management Committee Report: Bob David reported that at its last meeting the Committee had received a full report on the ACRE grant application. The Committee had agreed to make an application to TDC for a community grant to help fund the purchase of equipment for the Hall. Village Hall: by WH Building Committee: Fan Mitchell reported that NDC had now given full approved to the carry-over of its grant into 1997/88. Formal agreement from SCC would not be forthcoming until February but no difficulty was anticipated, Tenders had now been received and were being considered. The ACRE loan application, had been approved in Frinciple and the detailed application was required to be submitted by 20 Jan. The Clerk indicated that formal confirmation of the amount to be contained by the passes. confirmation of the amount to be contributed by the Parish Council in total was required to accompany this application. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to the VH Management Committee confirming that the Council would contribute \$61, 150, some of which had already been expended in the current year.

Property and Land Management:
a Ground Maintenance: The Clerk reported that the wayleave in favour of Nynex had not yet been completed. Despite the fact that Nynex had previously indicated a desire to complete the matter quickly, they did not seem to deal with matters very quickly. It had been made clear that until the wayleave was satisfactorily completed and the consideration paid, they would not be allowed access to Westmore Green.
b. Tree Survey: Elleen Pearce reported that the only trees available from TDC were specimen trees for which there were no suitable sites in the village. It was agreed that a registration

Further sapplings could be ordered at a later date, c Tatsfield in Bloom. Bob David reported that he had written to TDC as requested at the last meeting. The Committee was due to meet on 22 January to discuss plans for this coming year.

d Property Markers: Eileen Pearce promised that She would report

Tatsfield Church as the highest church in the area was suggested as a possibility. Ian Mitchell asked that members should consider the matter and let him have suggestions.

2 Matters arising:

a Westmore Rd Recycling Container: Bob David reported that the container had still not been removed. Both he and Mr & Mrs Vale had contacted Papersave to ask for its immediate removal. It was agreed that Bob David would write Papersave demanding the immediate removal of the container.

b Road Signs (5d): Due to illness, Bob David had been unable to

deal with this matter as yet.

c Dog Fouling (5c): For the same reason, Bob David had been unable

to deal with this matter.

d Community Grant for Salt bins (14b): The Clerk reported that he made enquires of TDC and had been told that an application could be made but details of exact numbers & locations of bins, costs, etc were required. The TDC Officer felt that such an application had a low chance of success as it would set a precedent for the whole district. The Clerk pointed out that there was no money allocated in the Budget for such a scheme and, if successful, money would have to be found to fund the scheme. As applications had to be lodged by 10.00 am that day, the Chairman indicated that, in order to preserve the position, he had submitted an application for a grant of £500 indicating that the Parish Council would make a similar contribution. The application could be amended or withdrawn as it would not be considered by the TDC Committee until May. After discussion, it was agreed that the matter should be discussed at the next meeting.

e Road Sign - Paynesfield Road (14e): It was noted that the "unsuitable for Vehicles" sign had disappeared but it was not clear how this had come about. Ian Mitchell and Bob David undertook to investigate and report back.

f Surrey Hills Celebration Map (10d): Ian Mitchell indicated that a meeting to discuss this matter was taking place at County Hall on the evening of 13 Feb which would be attended by a Parish Councillor.

Highways and Rights of Way a Ricketts Hill Road verges. It was noted that the erosion of verges was getting worse and various possible remedies were suggested. The Chairman indicated that he was awaiting a definitive opinion from NALC about the legality or otherwise of rosdaide posts or bollards and it was agreed that the matter should remain on the agenda until the next meeting when it was should remain on the agenda until the next meeting when it was hoped more information would be available.

b Tree View, Ninebams Rd: The Chairman reported that he had recently visited Mrs Entwhistle with her request that branches of a beech tree growing on land claimed by the Parish Council which were overnanging her property should be removed. He explained that the tree in question was a mature beech tree, two large branches of which overnang part of her property at a height of 20-40 feet. He had spoken to the TDC Tree Officer who indicated the tree was not subject to a TBO and consequently was not within his jurisdiction. He had indicated that Mrs Entwhistle had the right to lop the branches at the point, where they crossed her boundary but had no right to enter Rarish land to do this without consent it was agreed that expert advice was needed and the Clerk was it was agreed that expert advice was needed and the Clerk was requested to write Jon Allbutt and ask him to inspect the tree and report back

Council Aims & Objectives a Future of L-shaped Field: Tony Erbes indicated that there was

likely to be a meeting shortly and a report would be submitted to the next meeting.

b Celebration of Millennium: The Chairman had circulated a report on the recent meeting and it was agreed that Denis Hayes, Rijeen Pearce and Margaret Boadella would meet to discuss the suggestions made at the meeting in order to make some recommendations to the next Council meeting.

A Policing in Tatsfield: Ian Mitchelf indicated that David Wood, Iony Erbes and himself had not as yet met to discuss matters. Philip Glark had moved that day into Tatsfield and this would make it a lot easier for him to perform his duties. He would be shortly be given some feedback on internal police discussions which were presently taking place which could affect the local situation and then a meeting of the group would take place. He also commented that he felt that the recent high profile appearance of a police car outside the Post Office had certainly achieved its objective in ensuring the safety of the Post Office staff and deterring any possible nobbery.

b. Tatsfield History Project: Eileen Peace reported that 3 Panish councillors would shortly be attending a meeting at County Hall to inspect relevant information held by Surrey Record Office. Two History walks had been organised for April.

c. Future of Oxted Hospital: Bob David indicated that a consultative document was to be published shortly and he had arranged for a copy to be sent to the Parish Council. He felt that this was a matter which could directly affect the village and its inhabitants. It was agreed that the matter should be discussed further once the consultative document was available.

a Management Committee Report: her David reported that the Chairman had submitted an excellent report of the up to date position with the ACRE Grant application to the Management Committee at its tast meeting. He also reported, that an application had been made for a SDC Community grant for the purchase of equipment for the Village Hall. A large window at the rear of the Hall had been broken, probably by a football, and this had been temporarily boarded up.

b VH Building Committee: Bob, David reported that an ACRE

remedy this if another application was submitted. Steve Andrews had indicated that the Tatsfield application was the only Surrey application as no other village could obtain the necessary funding. He would put his full weight behind a further application.

It was noted that whilst it was possible to submit alternative concurrent applications (ie for both the full scheme and for Phase I only), ACRE did not consider this advisable.

Bob David then went in detail through the courses of action which were available. These could be summarised as follows:-

- 1 The full scheme previously submitted could be amended to meet the criticisms and then re-submitted for consideration in the second round of applications. Funding for this would be similar to the present grant application.
- 2 Submit a reduced scheme (Phase I) which would include a new Hall floor and a full and complete extension at an estimated cost of £157,000 (including professional fees). The ACRE grant could be as much as £60,000 and a decision was expected by the first week in August.
- 3 Ignore ACRE completely and proceed with a full Phase I. Funding for this would have to be by way of a loan obtained, possibly, by either the VHall Management Committee or the Parish Council and also other grants and sources of funds eg local fundraising.

A number of points were clarified and, after a full discussion, it was agreed that the recommendation of the Building Committee be accepted. The Clerk indicated that he thought that difficulties might arise in reclaiming VAT if loan finance was taken out by the VHall Management Committee and it was agreed that this aspect should be investigated urgently. The Clerk was also asked to prepare a cashflow projection based on the building commencing on 1 September 1997. It was also agreed that Bob David would make suitable enquiries of the Public Works Loan Board to ascertain how quickly loan sanction could be obtained. It was also agreed that the Building Committee should take all necessary steps to apply for all possible sources of funding, including a revised ACRE application.

After discussion, it was agreed that, as any decision on the revised ACRE application would not be available before early August, users of the VHall would be able to continue using it up to the end of July. The VHall Management Committee would notify all users to that effect immediately.



a Payments: as at Appendix B were approved.
b Capital Grant Funding 1997/98: Bob David reported that a grant application had been made in respect of the installation of central heating to the Village Hall.

7 HIGHWAYS AND RIGHTS OF WAY.

a Ricketts Hill Road verges: Bob David reported that he and the Chairman had met Surrey Highways on 6 May and it was now clear that if the Parish Council owned land immediately adjoining the highway, it was free to do as it wished to protect the verges. would be liable, as was always the case, for its actions. If land concerned was common land, then there were certain possible restrictions which were not onerous. Surrey Highways were to put forward some suggestions for consideration as to the type of bollard which might be suitable and it would then be for the Parish Council to consider what it wished to do.

b Road Signs: Bob David reported that he had informed Surrey Highways of the decision reached at the last meeting not to have signs. It was agreed that Margaret Boadella, Tony Erbes and Bob David would undertake a review of all road signs in the village and make recommendations generally on their effectiveness or otherwise.

c Tree View, Ninehams Road: The Chairman summarised a report which had now been received from Jon Allbutt. This recommended that auger samples should be taken which would enable a proper evaluation to be made as to the health of the two trees involved.

His report also indicated that Mrs Entwhistle had indicated would like to have any branches from these trees for burning on her stove and she also would like permission to gather fallen wood for the same purpose. It was agreed that the Chairman would deal

c Future of Oxted Hospital: A summary of the Consultative Document had been circulated to all members as had the views of the Save Oxted Hospital Group. After discussion, it was agreed that Bob David would write indicating that the Parish Council considered that (1) all the present facilities provided should be preserved and, wherever possible, improved; (2) Oxted Hospital should continue on a refurbished or new basis; (3) an attempt should be made to raise the necessary funds from sources other than central

The visit had been one of the most successful to date and congratulations were due to the Committee for its efforts. b Shopping Week (4b): Bob David reported that arrangements were well in hand. In an endeavour to focus attention on the shops and after consultation with shop-owners and local vets, it had been decided to run a Children's Pet Competition on the second Saturday.
