Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting duly commenced at & held at The School, Tatsfield on Wednesday 24th March. 09.

Mr A. Denton. in the chair

Financial

The clerk reported a balance of £9.14.7 on the Income a/c & £3-0-8 on the Lighting a/c all bills for the year being paid including an expenditure of £9.16.9. as agreed with the Vest Committee on a scheme for the Regulation of the Greens.

Lighting

The chairman brought up the question of the lighting of the parish asking for a motion on the matter.

Mr S. Haines Wickins proposed that a sum of £20 be voted, which was seconded by Mr G.H. West.

Mr F.H. Keeble opposed the motion suggesting that the lamps be sold & the money so raised be expended in providing benches on the greens for the convenience of visitors.

Mr D.S. White strongly supported the motion as a means of developing the parish.

Mr W. Lestor pointed out that the lamps were all on the grass roads, & not as they ought to be on the foot paths.

After some further discussion the proposal was put to the meeting when it was carried by 9 votes to 4.
