The Clerk reported on a discussion he had

that he was prepared to reinstate the
fencing if its present whereabouts could
be ascertained; he also said there might
be a difficulty caused by the fact that

one side of the road but that a gap might be left in the fencing as a temporary measure to overcome this; finally he asked if the legislation in respect of the Green Belt and the Town + Country Planning Act affected the development of the estate plans i.e. whether roads like Hillside Rd could in fact be built round as planned. After discussion on the question of the existence of rights of way on estate roads, Mr. Geary proposed that the position of Hillside Rd as a right of way be dealt with by the Footpaths Committee as part of the general question of rights of way & in regard to which a number of queries raised by the RDC had still to be answered. Seconded by Mrs. Laslett.

Mrs. Goundrey:

were read and confirmed.
The Clerk read a letter from Mrs. Goundrey
advising that he was resigning as R.D.R.
Mrs. Laslett proposed that a letter of
acknowledgement be sent, expressing appreciation
and thanks for the work he had carried out
Seconded by Mr. Ridder. Agreed.

F.P. Committee Report:

Mrs. Geary proposed that the R.D.C. be
asked whether they would be prepared to
accept certain well-used roads as rights
of way in the same way as they were
prepared to accept Chestnut Avenue, the
roads in question being of the Goatsfield,
Maesmawr and Ninems Road type.

Seconded by Mrs. Laslett. Agreed.

Mrs. Laslett reported a complaint she had
received regarding obstruction from
overgrown hedges to footpath 20x. This
obstruction she had personally removed
but she reported that the stile situated
at the point of intersection of the F.P. 20x
with the County boundary needed a bar
replacing. It was agreed that Mr. Robison
should be requested to do this.

The chairman raised the question of the
untidiness of Westmores Green. After discussion

Westmore Green which included the bad state of the railings round the pond. Mrs. Laslett proposed that the RDC be asked if repair of the pond railings is included in the present Green's programme and to report that the letter box needs replacing and resiting on a tree adjacent to the coach stop. Seconded by Mr. Geary. Agreed.

Notice Boards The chairman raised the question of the repair of the Parish Council notice boards and the provision of a new one at the Ricketts Hill end of the village. After discussion it was agreed to defer a decision until further information regarding the powers of the P.C. in this respect were available as a result of a search through the minutes.

Signposts Mrs. Laslett suggested that consideration be given to the signposting of Footpaths in the Parish on the lines of the signs erected in the Biggin Hill area. It was suggested that the latter were erected under Kent C.C. arrangements and that the SCC would have to ^{decide on} consider this and the related question of street signs.

Village Pond Mrs. Kidder pointed out the danger of the pond to children falling in. In its present condition with only part of its bottom covered by water, children were playing in the mud and running the risk of drowning. Whether it was the intention of the RDC to fill the pond in or allow it to fill again with water was not known but a reply to a letter on this question was awaited. After

further discussion, Mr. Riddler proposed that the RDC be asked to consider the erection of a low fence round the pond to prevent toddlers from falling in. Seconded by Mr. Geary. Carried

(Mrs. Laslett abstaining)

Clearing of Greens. Mr. Riddler expressed appreciation of the work done in clearing up the greens, but asked if it was necessary to damage trees when burning off the grass. The chairman said he understood that further work on the greens, including lopping of trees, would be undertaken shortly.

Food parcels Mr. Geary raised the question of who will undertake the distribution of the gift food parcels now that the RDR had resigned. He proposed a letter be written to RDC asking if the Parish Council may arrange distribution under the circumstances.

Seconded by Mr. Riddler. Agreed.

Minutes of last meeting The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

Pond & Greens The Clerk reported an acknowledgement to letters written Rights of Way to G.R.D.C.

Pond A letter was read from G.R.D.C. informing the P.C. that "it is the intention to allow the pond to refill naturally, the work of clearing being complete."

Village Greens The Chairman reported that he had seen the clerk to G.R.D.C. who gave an assurance that the greens would be put into complete order soon, as at Broadhang Green S.

Food Parcels A letter was read from G.R.D.C. stating that "in the event of there being a further distribution of gift food, the suggestion of the P.C. would be carefully considered. The distribution had been in the hands of the District Nurse, who had usually collaborated with the Rector, & who had also been asked to collaborate with the Chairman of the Parish Council." Mr. Little said that during his Chairmanship of the P.C. he had thought that the Nurse was in a better position to distribute these parcels. He thought that as the number of parcels was diminishing, there was no object in forming a committee at this stage, if no complaints had been received.

Notice Boards The question of Notice Boards was deferred to the next

meeting, until the Clerk had taken possession of the minute Books, and made a search.

Footpath at "Franklyn" Limpfield. The Clerk read a letter from Mr. Ashton, Granville Rd., (No 1) Ricketts Hill. (No 1 on Footpaths Map). Mr. Little, the present owner of "Franklyn" said he had enquired into the exact position of this footpath, & had been informed that it was on the N. boundary of the property. On checking up with G.R.D.C. he found that this was in agreement with the marking on their map. Mr. Geary drew attention to a remark on the Schedule (1933) of Public Footpaths that there was an "unauthorised diversion" of No 1 Footpath. After further discussion it was agreed that the Clerk should search the Minutes for further information on this diversion.

S.A.P.C. A letter from Oxted Parish Council was read, announcing that a meeting would be held at the Old Hospital, Oxted, to consider the formation of an Area Committee for Godstone Rural Area, & inviting Parish Councillors to represent Tadfield. Mr. Little said that as he had not the time necessary to devote to the Association he had resigned from the Executive, & suggested ~~to~~^{The P.C.} support the forming of an Area Committee in Godstone Rural area. Discussion among Parish Councillors lessened the work of the Executive, & talkes were given by various officials which gave P.C.s clear idea of how to work together.

S.C.P.C. An invitation to a Conference of Parish Council Clerks to be held in the Masonic Hall, Dorking, Sat: Oct. 8th was read. Proposed by Mr. Little, secy Mrs. Laskett, that the Clerk attend, & her expenses be paid. Carried.

If not, Mrs. Little proposed, sec. Mr. Ridder that the S.C.C. Highways Committee be asked to provide a guard rail at the School exit.

NOVEMBER 1949

Minutes of the proceedings of a Parish Council meeting held at the School, on Monday, Nov. 7th 1949

Present Mr. C. Weatherley, chairman, Mrs. Laslett, messrs. Geary, Little. Ridder & Clerk, Miss Kelly.

Minutes of The Minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

Food Parcels The Chairman said that the new G.R.D.C. representative, Mr. Maynard, would probably have something to do with the Scheme, in the place of Mr. Gowdry.

Notice Boards. The Clerk read the minutes on this subject from the P.C. meetings of Jan. 1934, Feb. 1934, Dec 2nd 1935, & March 1934. Proposed by Mrs. Laslett, seconded Mr. Little that "in view of the desire of residents on that side of the village, the G.R.D.C. be asked for permission to erect a P.C. notice board on the green, opposite the Manor House.

Agreed.

Footpath

No. 1 Before discussing this matter, the Chairman read the (Franklyn) local Govt. ruling whereby "any member having a pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or proposed contract or other matter, & is present at a council meeting at which the contract or other matter is the subject of consideration he must, at the meeting ... not take part in the discussion or vote thereon etc.."

Mr. Ridder thought the wording "pecuniary interest" was in this matter vague, & Mrs. Laslett recommended that the Council proceed with the business.

The Clerk then reported on her search through the Minutes, & read the relevant passages from the meetings of March 25th 1902, Nov 1902, March 1903, July 1903, June 1903,

July 1933, Sept 1933, Oct 1933, Feb. 1934

Mr. Geary said that he had spoken to the Chairman of the P.C. in Feb. 1934, & had verified that Col. Wyatt had been asked whether he had any objection to the position of the footpath as shown on the Footpaths map, then newly drawn up, and Col. Wyatt had declared that he was not interested in a diversion.

The members of the Council then examined various maps showing Footpath No 1. After further discussion

it was decided that the Footpaths Committee should complete the list of Footpaths that they were drawing up, &

Mr. Ridder proposed, sec. Mr. Geary, that "the diversions & 'stopping up' of footpaths 1, 3, 6, 8 & 12 as mentioned in Minutes Feb. 1934, should be gone into by Footpaths Committee, & the matter raised at the next meeting." Agreed

Division of Green Line Coaches. Mr. Ridder enquired whether there was any truth in the rumour that the Green Line Coaches were to stop coming into the village. Mr. Weatherley promised to ascertain the true facts, as did Mr. Maynard, G.R.D.C. representative.

Footpaths. Mr. Geary brought forward matter of footboards missing on several stiles in village.

Mr. Ridder proposed, sec. Mr. Beagley, "that Mr. Geary provide the Clerk with a list, & that the Clerk write to persons responsible for their maintenance."

Carried.

Footpaths Committee Report on diversions. The Clerk read Mrs. Laslett's statement on her findings with reference to Footpaths 1, 3, 6, 8. In her view there was still a diversion in 1, 3, & 6, & she thought the P.C. should do everything possible to preserve the footpaths of the village.

Mr. Weatherley, Chairman, said that the initiative for making a diversion should come from the owners of the land over which they passed.

Mr. Geary, the other member of Footpaths Committee, agreed with Mrs. Laslett's findings in regard to Nos. 1 & 3, but disagreed about No 6. He remarked that a landowner could sometimes offer a more "convenient" path, e.g. over drier land etc. The footpath as described by Mrs. Laslett had not been used for more than 40 years, & that in a High Court Case Justice Coke had ruled that a footpath could be acquired

by 40 years' usage, & correspondingly lost after 40 years' non-usage.

^{Mr. Geary,} He showed plans indicating the original straight footpath, running along W. side of Share at Kent-Surrey boundary of plot 7 to 13.

The late Mr. C. Geary had protested when this path became an encroachment on his land. Mr. Geary had provided a new path, running from stile on Kent-Surrey boundary direct to Park Wood Rd, along Plot 19 of Estate map.

He reported that the footpath at Finsdale now ran through the unfenced plot belonging to Sir Samuel Joyce Thomas.

Proposed Mrs. Laslett, sec. Mrs. Ridder, that "the owners of the land through which footpaths 1 & 3 ran be asked to restore the footpaths to their original position, and the Clerk be asked to write Footpaths Preservation Soc., enquiring whether non-usage of a path for 40 years constituted a loss to the parish of that footpath.
