Present Minutes of proceedings Parish Council meeting held at School, July 2nd, 1951,

Apologetic Apologies for absence received from Mr. Bradley & Mr. Deane.

The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

The Chairman gave a report of the meeting he attended as P.C. delegate. It was agreed at this meeting that all graves intended for a considerable time should be levelled, no headstones were to be removed, paths were to be re-laid, trees treated, & a hedge set up. The estimated initial cost was £200, with a yearly expenditure of £50. Fourteen collectors would shortly begin the work of collecting the money.

A letter from Godstone R.D.C. was read stating that the 3 trees cut down did form part of a group which is included in the Tree Preservation Order recently made by R.D.C. The Order not having yet been confirmed by the minister, no person or planning authority has any power to prevent an owner from felling his trees. The owner of the group in question did however consult R.D.C. who saw no objection to the felling of the 3 trees provided the remainder of the group was preserved. The owner had indicated that he would not object to the confirmation of the Order so far as it related to remainder of group.

The Clerk read a letter from Sec. of Commons
 Open Spaces & Footpaths Preservation Soc. drawing attention to the fact that last year's subscription had not been paid.

Dogs The Clerk read a letter from Godstone R.D.C. stating that the Council was not aware that permission for the establishment of breeding kennels for dogs in the district had been given, asking further particulars. The Council could not control the barking of dogs, but if a householder had reason to suffer in consequence of a number of dogs being kept in any specific place, he had the right of action in the courts against the owner of the dogs. The byelaws relating to the fouling of pavements by dogs had not been adopted in R.D.C. owing to the difficulty of enforcing it.

Tree Preservation The Clerk read a letter from Rodstone R.D.C. informing
Order the Parish Council that the following woodlands & groups
of trees in the Parish were now confirmed for
preservation under Section 28 of Town & Country Planning
Act 1947

- 1) Group of trees - in garden of Springfield, Ricketts Hill
- 2) " " " - near S. end Crown Rd
- 3) Woodland area - on W & E sides of Approach Rd
- 4) " " - on E. side Tatfield Park Farm, & extending
from Rap Hill for 300 yds N.
- 5) " " - on W. side Westmore Green & extending from
Lusted Lane 300 yds S.
- 6) " " N. side Tatfield Green
- 7) " " W = Crown Rd
- 8) " " W side Church Hill, midway between
Church Cottages & School
- 9) " " N. side Tatfield Green adjoining N. side
of woodland area No 6 above

It was decided that the Chairman should see
the map at Council offices, Oxted, indicating the
above areas.

Tatfield It was agreed that a further letter be sent to Godstone
Green R.D.C. regarding the state of the Commons. Complaints
from adjoining houses had been received, of seeds from
the weeds falling into the gardens.

Allotments Mr. Brapley drew attention to the bad condition of
Allotments 1 & 2. After discussion, it was
agreed to ask the Horticultural Society to advise its
members that 2 allotments were vacant, also ^{to notify} W.I.
members, & to display notices ^{of the vacancies} to this effect on the
Parish Council Notice Boards.

Footpath Mr. Gray said that he had received a complaint that
Bunge Corner the footpath at Funge Corner was obstructed by briars etc.
It was agreed that members should see the path, &

The matter had been brought up at a Parish meeting & signs warning of a dangerous hill had been asked for, but nothing had resulted from the request.
