- b) Street lighting including special measures for winter morning lighting.
- c) Proposal to re-site telephone kiosk to overcome continual problems of damage and vandalism.
- d) Snow clearance.
- e) Meeting with the Police Authorities.
- f) Application for Bye-law on fouling of pavements by dogs.
- g) Action taken with various bodies as a result of the reduction public transport service.

Mr. Austin, Chairman of the Village Hall Management Committee then spoke of work done by the Committee and was followed by the Treasurer of VHM Committee who reported on the substantial increase in bookings of the Hall. The Warden of the Hall (Mr. Slatter) referred to his resignation.

Mr. Godard proposed a vote of thanks that was seconded by Mrs. Griston and carried unanimously that a warm vote of thanks be given to the VHM with especial mention to Mr. & Mrs. Slatter
