Finance

The Clerk reported a balance of

Lighting

At Vincent on behalf of the lighting
Committee reported that the lamp at
the white house has been removed to
the opposite side of the Road & the
one from Lucia Rd to a position on Pagnuill
Rd mid way between the Ship Hotel &
the Post Office.

The Chairman said he had received a
letter from the Revd G. H. Menden asking
whether a lamp could be placed outside
the Parish hall. After discussion the
Clerk was directed to write the Revd G. H. Menden
regretting the Council's inability to grant his
request owing to the small number of lamps at
the Council's disposal.

Insurance

The Chairman said they would remember at the
last meeting he raised the question of insurance
in regard to the contractor for carrying out the lighting.
He had since looked up the point & found that

The Council was not legally bound to insure him, at the same time if the man put himself in the position of his duty, they would not hold him to suffer whilst employed by them & he suggests that it be made a condition of the contract that the man insure himself & anyone employed by him against accident.
