The Chairman referred to the Co-opting of Mr F.C.
Cooke as P. Councillor and to the resignation of Mr
K. M. Leslie bringing the fact of a vacancy to
the notice of the parish. He explained the change
from month to month of the dates of Mts of the P.C.
A Reference was made to the 'get-together' meeting of
P. Councils & R.D.C. members.

He reported the termination of the tenancy of the 2 acres
of allotments as from Sept. 30th '61. Reference was
made to the turning down by the G.P.O. of a request
for a Public Telephone at School X Roads. He
also explained the effort made to have a clause
inserted in Building Permits to the effect that Building
contractors should make good all damage done to roads
during building operations.

Mr G. W. Smith gave a brief report on the Primary School
file's work. He referred to the continued high standard
of education and was pleased to note the increased
interest in the Hort. Socy file's work.

He further reported on accommodations. The no. on
Roll at the commencement of term was for the first
time 100, this fact making alteration in accommodations
a factor to be considered in the near future.

Mr Hodgson further reported that he and Dr Sturton had had an interview with the R.D.C. Clerk & other officials regarding the leasing of the Church Hall. He said further that until more definite and detailed information had been received the matter remained in abeyance as far as the P.C. was concerned.
