The fees charged were thought by strangers to be low. They had negotiated a greatly improved lease with the Donkey County Council. There was £26 to be collected and as far as a single bad debt had been incurred.

Mr. Bentley reported that he had attended all the meetings of the School Managers. The school buildings were in good heart and new toilets in the main building were being provided for the younger children. The school had been provided. The P.T.A. was supporting the school well and a cinematograph had been provided. He was very satisfied with the standard of teaching and that had had their fair share of seven supervision. The general toilets had been improved by the provision of hot water. A new school was not on the cards at the moment, but when it did happen it would be on the same site. The roll was between 150 and 140. New glasswork had been provided so the hall could be used as a hall and not as a classroom as hitherto. The playing fields were in good condition. Any large scale development would tend to surround the school but there was a close liaison between the County Education authority and the Planning authorities.

Mr. Bury asked whether street lighting could be brought to the unmade roads. It was suggested that a referendum be proposed on the interest of the parish as a whole was involved Mrs. Gifford suggested a questionnaire from the Resident's Assoc. Mr. Chambers thought it was a good idea. Mr. Bury said that people complain to him of the state of the roads and we have what we buy that the conditions are. Mr. Gough suggested that facts should be collected. Mr. Haines thought the residents' assoc. might sound its members. Mr. Cooke suggested that the R.E.S.A. be approached for a comprehensive report of adequate lighting of the village. Mr. Chambers agreed with this suggestion. Mrs. Elster suggested lights at strategic points, road junctions and across roads etc. Mr. Bury thought that the cost would be prohibitive and it would turn a rural area into an urban one.

Mr. Hayes that horse riding was still taking place on the commons and he asked whether the R.L.C. would take action. Mr. Haines said that this is a continual problem. The P.C. were asking the R.L.C. to put a stile on Path 15 near Cedar Gate which would help to prevent riders coming on to Bisketta Hill. Residents should ask riders to get off ~~the commons~~ the commons and greens and it was the same with car parking. Mr. Bury suggested that more bye law notice boards should be erected.
