Management Committee Chairman's report

Mr. Godard, Chairman reported that the end of the first phase had been reached and that they were now working under a different constitution. New people have been elected. Mr. Blatter who was bookings secretary had done a lot of work and he was most grateful for her help as honorary assistant secretary and minute secretary. Mr. Blatter had served as treasurer for 27 years and he would like to put on record that both Mr. & Mrs. Blatter had not missed a committee meeting and that both were willing to continue with the good work. He would like to mention two other members, Mr. Lewis Russell and Mr. F. C. Cooke. Mr. Russell is not able to carry on owing to other commitments, but his experience in the past had been invaluable. Mr. Cooke was the Parish Council's representative and he had been a great help in his difficult job as liaison officer. Mr. Saffley had brought humor and enthusiasm to the meetings but owing to other commitments would not be able to carry on. His expert advice on many subjects would be missed. Mr. Harry Austin, who helped with the building projects was willing to continue. Mr. A. Clarke had carried out his task of writer with great good humor and he was grateful to him and sorry that he would not be able to continue. Mrs. Gange, representative of the Women's Institute was carrying on. Mr. Hopper, who had recently retired, had found that everything had been arranged on his, but he was unfortunat and willing to continue to serve. This is just a rough sketch of those who had helped.

The Hall Management Committee was working under a new constitution. There were to be seven members on the new committee, a representative from the Parish Council and six others to form an executive committee. There were to be three open meetings each year when representatives of all village organisations would be welcomed.
