1 Election of Officers 1994/5

The current Chairman, Mr Biswas, thanked all members for their support over the past two years and especially Ian Mitchell for his guidance earlier on. However, for personal reasons he felt unable to stand again for either Chairman or Vice-Chairman and called for nominations for the post of Chairman for the coming year. Mr Ian Mitchell was proposed by Mr Payne, seconded by Mrs Player and returned unopposed. Mr Mitchell then took the Chair, thanking Mr Biswas for his service to the Council and to the village over the past two years. Nominations for Vice-Chairman were invited: Mrs Boadella was proposed by Mrs Maddison and seconded by Mr Biswas; Mr Payne was proposed by Mrs Player and seconded by Mr Wood. On being put to the vote, Mr Payne became Vice-Chairman by 3 votes to 2.

4 Matters Arising

could be taken; Ship Hill layby would continue to be monitored as any partial restriction would necessitate long legal action; it was agreed to leave any tidying-up of Approach Road laybyes until the next Clean-Up day as re-claiming of the areas as verge was not considered appropriate; it was felt that further discussion could take place over a possible layby near the Scout Hut as use of the area around the hut would not sufficiently alleviate the parking problem; it was agreed that SCC be asked to go ahead with white-lining the road edges around Westmore Green as an initial attempt to discourage erosion, the situation could then be monitored for effectiveness. Mr Hitchcock was surprised at the number and size of the Tourist Board "Reptile Zoo" signs and would be investigating but it was decided not to request any removal of the B2024 sign to any other position. The offer of a village sign just before "Waylands" was accepted (design as at bottom of Ricketts Hill, incorporating twinning information). Mrs Ripley to pursue the possibility of an HGV traffic count on Lusted Hall Lane, Clerk to send earlier traffic count figures.

Centenary Plans

A number of ideas had been discussed by the Land & Property Group who recommended a planted container on the old bus shelter plinth, preferably an old granite horse trough; a larger replacement noticeboard for school crossroads; publication of the Tatsfield Walks pack, and the setting up of a Tatsfield history project. Mr Biswas had hoped to investigate some leads on a horse trough in Cornwall but this had proved impossible over the bank holiday. Mr Payne would continue to investigate and Mrs Boadella offered to follow up a possibility in Tatsfield. Mrs Maddison to see if Mr Doug Marner would be interested in design of the noticeboard. Clerk and Mr Wood to finalise texts of Walks.

8 Village Appraisal Report

The Report had been officially presented to the two sponsoring bodies, the Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council on 13 April and at the Annual Parish Meeting on 18 April. The Chairman said it was now up to the Council to consider the 32 recommendations specifically aimed in whole or part at the Parish Council, bearing in mind that action with funding implications needed to be planned by the time next year's budget was considered in December and also that the present Council ended its term of office next May.

Considerable discussion ensued over the continuing role or otherwise of the Village Appraisal Committee, flexibility over numbers, and monitoring, advisory or active role. The debate was opened up to the public and mention was also made of the original aim of such appraisals that action did not end with the production of a report; whether continued funding would lead to an incipient bureaucracy; responsibility to the 73% participating villagers; and general "over-complication" of the problem.

In conclusion, Mr Payne proposed that, as far as the recommendations aimed at the Council were concerned, the Council should view the Village Appraisal Committee as an advisory body and should seek its co-operation in future action. As far as other recommendations were concerned, the Committee was naturally free to determine its own policy. This was seconded by Mr Biswas and agreed.

It was noted that action was already in hand over a number of recommendations, such as funds to the Not So Young Club, improving the floor surface of the Village Hall, Parish Constable scheme, and SVSC/Rural Action help for the shops. Mr Wood was asked to liaise with the Playingfield Association over a joint meeting to consider the future, and also to liaise with Bridleways Association and embryonic Ramblers Club over the possibility of a footpath watch. Other matters would be timetabled on to each month's agenda.

9 Property and Land Management

Stile and fencing in Kemsley Wood had been vandalised and bikers were again using area. It was agreed that Mr Taylor's offer of repair should be gratefuly accepted and account for necessary materials paid. Clearance of dead trees also needed and possible replacement of stone markers - Mr Wood to organise volunteers with chainsaws who could remove any wood they cleared.

PROPOSED LAND MAINTENANCE SCHEME.

The following proposed actions are listed in suggested order of priority. Refer to the attached listand plan for area reference numbers.

- 1. Westmore Green, Tatsfield Green and woods (areas 11,12&13): Monitor maintenance by T.D.C. which is generally satisfactory. Specific consideration of pond maintenance will be needed. Review possible schemes for visual improvement of area around pond and in front of shops in cosultation with Downland Project and others.
- 2. Hall and Surgery carpark (area 14):
 Continue present maintenance arrangement. Annual cost:#150
- 3. Hayes Pasture, Maesmaur Corner and "L-shaped Field" (areas 1,3&15):
 Continue present 3 times per year attention plus hedge cutting by T.D.C. D.W.U. Clear heap of debris from Maesmaur corner and consider any input from Downland Project.

 Annual cost:#620
- 4. Shaw Triangle (area 2):
 Clear undergrowth and dumped tree branches around planted trees.
 Needs attention once per year. D.W.U. to quote.
- 5. Kemsley Woods (area 16): Clear undergrowth fallen trees etc. to 3ft width on each side of footpath to allow regeneration of local flora and improve convenience of path, subsequent attention annually. D.W.U. to quote. Fence maintenance to be carried out as needed.
- 6. Beech Avenue (areas 4&8): Clear encroaching growth of trees where it impedes passage. Clear 3ft on each side of path where it passes through area 4 to encourage growth of wildflowers. D.W.U to quote.
- 7. Kemsley Road (area 6): Clear undergrowth at side of road , D.W.U. to quote.
- 8. Ninehams Road (area 10):
 This area suffered major storm damage. Only action which might be economic would be to cut back undergrowth beside the footpath.
- 9. Barnfield Road (area 9): May need some minor clearance to safeguard trees planted here.
- 10. Areas 7 and 17 are considered to need no immediate action.

Conclusion:
We underspent on land maintenance during the last financial year and in the light of reactions shown in the Village Appraisal, would be justified in spending up to our budget for the current year. This would allow the expenditure of about a further #600 which should cover most of the cost of items 4-7 above. We would have to

should cover most of the cost of items 4-7 above. We would have to defer lower priority items to the next financial year. In the longer term we could consider employing someone on a part time basis for minor maintenance to trees and paths on Parish land.



The Chairman welcomed those present to the meeting which had been called to discuss the one item - the possible purchase of land at Furze Corner.

Aims 1

Mr Wood reiterated the aims of any purchase: to help expand the sporting and leisure facilities at Furze Corner for the benefit of parishioners and to encourage more youngsters to take up sports. In this, the Parish Council recognised the enormous self-help contribution being made by members of the Playing Field Association in the construction of a new clubhouse. It was hoped that augmented facilities would increase the use and popularity of Furze Corner.

Playing Field Association

Mr Bigwood said that about £9,000 had been spent by member clubs on the new clubhouse to date and that more needed to be raised to provide both male and female changing facilities. This meant that there was no possibility of the Association being able to purchase any more land at present. However, good use could be made of any land made available to the Association, particularly Lot 55. It was noted that the present site totalled 5 acres, for which the Association paid TDC about £5-600 pa. Clearance and use of any extra land would attract grant more easily than clubhouse-type facilities, yet these were also vital in increasing the popularity of the site (viz: recent BBQ and Barn Dance which had attracted nearly 200 people, mostly villagers).

Private session

It was then proposed by the Chairman and seconded by Mrs Maddison that the meeting go into private session to discuss details of possible purchase.

Chairman reported that it had not been possible to conclude a pre-auction sale and that it was understood the 2 lots would now be taken together. 10% of purchase price would be required at the auction either in csh or banker's draft, with the balance due within 28 days. NatWest Bank had been advised of the situation. Advice had been taken from NALC that an independent valuation was needed and that auditors would not be happy to see the Council go much more than 20% above this. Mr Paul Leslie had therefore been consulted and given a valuation of £7,000 for Lot 3 and £3,000 for Lot 55; £12,000 thus appeared to be the Council's upper limit for both plots.

It was proposed by David Wood and seconded by Liza Player that the Council be prepared to bid up to and including £12,000 for both Lots, 3 and 55, together. approved, 4 votes to 1.

If the lots were taken separately, it was proposed by Margaret Boadella and seconded by Wendy Maddison that up to and including £8,000 could be bid for Lot 3. This was approved 4 votes to 1.

It was further proposed by Amrit Biswas and seconded by David Wood that up to and including £4,000 could be bid for Lot 55. This was carried unanimously.

Amrit Biswas, Margaret Boadella and Wendy Madison were available to attend the auction starting at 11.00 am the following day, Monday 25 July, and it was proposed by Amrit Biswas, seconded by Wendy Maddison and approved unanimously that Margaret Boadella represent the Council at bidding.

This concluded the business of the meeting.

It was agreed to support the suggestion that the sign off Ricketts Hill be amended to read "Access to Kemsley Road only", with the possible addition of "No through road". It was noted that Bridleway 614 extended from Ricketts Hill down to the junction with Kemsley Road and on to Beech Avenue (not up to the metalled section of Paynesfield Road). Clerk to write to TDC/Scc.

5 Land sale at Furze Corner

It had been noted that two plots of land at Furze Corner were up for sale by auction on Monday 25 July; both were adjacent to the playing field and if acquired by the parish would afford scope for the development of sports facilities and parking at the field. Clerk had made various enquiries from which it had been ascertained that TDC, who owned the playing field, were in no position to buy further land; that TPC could bid at auction if it wished and that the Playing Field Association was eager to expand but had no funds for land purchase itself. The apparent unpopularity of the Furze Corner location was noted from the Village Appraisal but it was felt this could in part be attributed to the lack of facilities; it was also noted that 62% of respondents had wanted more money spent on recreation. It was therefore agreed in principle that the Council do its best to acquire the two plots of land. The questions of budget and strategy were deferred to closed session at the end of the meeting.

6 Local Government Reform

The Commission's draft recommendations had now been published, in which 5 unitary authorities were recommended for Surrey, one of which would be Tandridge linked with Redhill/Reigate and the southern parts of Mole Valley, inc Dorking. Retaining the status quo was mentioned as an "alternative structure". Costs were cited, as given by SCC/TDC but not independently by the Commission. It seemed that Parish Councils would enjoy an enhanced role whatever the outcome. Council was in agreement that it continued to favour the "status quo plus"; Chairman to draft submission letter and circulate in advance of September's meeting so that it could be submitted by the 19 September deadling.

M25 widening - Junctions 5-7

2 Matters Arising

a Centenary trough (ref 2b): Base now completed and it was hoped that trough would be in place shortly.

b Village centre (ref 2c): Roland Payne suggested a number of sites for tree planting around W Green and the possibility of part hedging the Maesmaur corner site - enquiries to be made about accomplishing the planting under the National Tree Week scheme. It was thought on balance that a low box hedge around the play area would only lead to problems, painting the fencing green might be considered instead. Clerk reported on a site visit and discussions with Keith Masters (TDC) over siting of litter bins. It was agreed to try to standardise on the wooden slatted models, these to replace metal/plastic ones by pond seats and at school crossroads; bins on old bus shelter site and in Ricketts Hill wood to be removed; three bins by bus shelter and shops to be retained and renovated; new bin to be sited on Ship Hill at end of Shipfield Close gardens.

c Clay pigeon shooting (ref 2d): A reply had been rec'd from the DoE indicating that the law had been strengthened in some respects but pointing out that during consultation the majority view had been against any additional controls. Chairman to discuss with TDC.

d Parish Magazine (ref 2e): Churches had now met and Chairman was due to meet Revd Corke 12.10.

e Land at Furze Corner (ref 2g): David Wood said he would endeavour to get some concrete information about future land use at Furze Corner and liaise with PFA before November Council meeting. Clerk to draw up a list of those who might be interested in attending a meeting to discuss future recreational use of both the playing field and the Hall field.

Highways and Rights of Way 4

Paynesfield Road/Ricketts Hill link: Following up further enquiries from Mr Jordan had proved difficult: SCC Highways had the unmade part of P Rd listed as private street/road (the former being deemed open to the public unless evidence brought forward to the contrary; while the latter had a public right of access only); it was agreed to ask for the "No through road" sign near the junction with Johns/Crossways to be resited so that it was easily visible.

Playing Field sign: Regulations in force from 1.8. that original request was not permissable; agreed to ask for direction sign saying "Tatsfield playing field" to be sited before the telegraph pole coming into the village at Furze Corner.

Footpaths on golf course: Clerk reported from TDC Planning that, contrary to previous belief negotiations over the alternate of FP21A to FP21 and appropriate signing were still ongoing and linked with hope that a FP could be dedicated inside hedgerow from Church car park to FP23; we would be kept informed. It was agreed that the question of a stile from FP22 (Clarks Lane Farm) on to golf course land was not at issue and that a written request should go to Mr Goldsmith, with copies to SCC and TDC.

SCC also to be asked to place a sign on FP570 indicating correct direction from field (off Ricketts

Hill) through woods to Kemsley Road.

Pavement repair: Work in Paynesfield Road would be undertaken within the month. d

Duck signs: These had been stolen for the second time; e SCC had agreed to replace.

TDC Road signs & street name plate survey: Renovations f or resitings needed to be brought to TDC's attention.

School traffic dangers

A delegation from the school's PTA raised the question of traffic speed along Ricketts Hill/Church Lane, sight lines at the crossroads, lack of pavements at key points, and obstruction of footpaths in the vicinity by nettles and unclipped hedges. Fears about accidents were rising because of the increase in school numbers and more pupils being unaccompanied because of the higher leaving age. It was noted that attempts had been made in the past to improve matters and that pavement access at the crossroads had been improved and the 30mph limit retained along Ship Hill. Chairman said he would write to the owner of the field opposite the school about the state of the hedges and the Clerk undertook to organise a meeting on site between PTA members and SCC East Area Highway Engineer.

6 Maintenance of unmade roads

David Wood reported on discussions which had taken place on this matter, noting a complaint from Denis Hayes that he had not been included in these from the start. It was now proposed that if residents of any road came forward with a self-help scheme for simple repairs (ie filling-in potholes), the Parish Council would look at each case on its merits before deciding upon any financial assistance. It was further proposed by Liza Player, seconded by Roland Brune and agreed that Council should consider a scheme for Payne and agreed that Council should consider a scheme for the possible allocation of funds in closed session at the end of the meeting. Publicity for the scheme to be decided at November's meeting after Clerk had checked any possible problems with SCAPTC.

Considerable discussion ensued on the possibility and merits of being able to waive the reduced Hall grant in favour of the Scouts but it was agreed that Hall users had been waiting for over three years, during which time capital grants had been suspended twice by TDC and that the present opportunity had to be used for the improvement of facilities for the larger number of organisations using the Hall. TDCllr also advised that the Grants Co might not be eager to reconsider their decision. It was further noted that as a result of a National Lottery cum Millenium Fund information meeting, a questionnaire was to be circulated around the village and findings reported to January's Council meeting

c Warden (ref 2f): Interviewee had not proved suitable; TDCllr to be asked about an earlier candidate.

Clear=Up Day (ref 2g): David Wood reported that there had been 8 volunteers altogether: Alison Mooney, Marion Randall, Ron Haywood, Brenda & Bob David and the Jay family; joined by himself and Councillors Boadella and Maddison. Cubs had undertaken some clearing-up work a few weeks earlier. About 12 bags of rubbish had been collected. Despite poor support, it was agreed to continue with Clear-Up Days, perhaps with better publicity and by approaching village organisations to send representatives along. Above volunteers to be thanked in the Parish Mag; Clerk to enquire about schedules for rubbish "spikers".

Post box theft (ref 13): PO was hoping to replace box opposite Manor House with same style in New Year.

2 Footpaths

Mr Fry outlined his responsibility for the 350 miles of footpaths, bridleways and BOATs in the Tandridge area; this covered maintenance of surfaces of RoWs on request (SCC did not automatically maintain every RoW, and obstruction from hedge growth etc was the responsibility of the landowner);

There appeared to be 8 routes waiting to be investigated in Tatsfield and Mr Fry said he would have these listed and sent to the Council. As far as Park Wood Golf Course was concerned, Mr Fry said his understanding of the footpath situation had been the same as TPC's, however, he was meeting Mr Goldsmith on site in two days time and would keep TPC informed of the outcome.

It was not clear whether TPC could be assisted in maintaining footpaths on land which it only claimed but did not as yet legally own; Clerk to follow up. Chairman thanked Mr Fry for giving his time to explain matters so clearly to everyone.



5 Future of the Parish Magazine

A business plan had now been received from Revd Corke and the magazine working party and had been copied to all Councillors. The aim of the plan was to produce a magazine of similar format but increased content, delivered free 11 times a year to every home in Tatsfield. To this end it was hoped to treble advertising and to encourage many of

the village's 40 organisations to pay an annual contribution. Nevertheless a shortfall was envisaged and the Parish Council was being asked to make a grant of £480 for the year commencing April 1995 (the projected relaunch edition). Revd Corke and members of his team answered queries relating to advertising revenue, postage, travel, distribution and loss of subscription revenue.

A case was made for supporting only one edition each year, to contain updated Village Directory information, and to be delivered to every household. It was felt that this would also encourage subscriptions but would not overburden the Further Council budget. suggestions were for a questionnaire to go out to readers after the first year as a free paper; for a small ads page to raise revenue; to fund the Parish Mag now since the last 10 years usage could be considered free of charge; it was also noted that the Horticultural Society was offering £50 pa donation for the next 2 years in recognition of the magazine's publicity value.

It was finally agreed unanimously to make a contribution of f480 towards the production costs of the first year of the relaunched Parish Magazine.

6 Rebate of non-domestic rate

It was known that the proprietors of the Post Office had applied to TDC for remission on the above rate. It was generally considered that the PO was a "special case" amongst local businesses since it was vital for the paying of benefits and allowances and its presence sustained custom in the village. It was therefore agreed that the Chairman should write to TDC in support of their claim. "Support our local shops" campaign to go on next Agenda.
