Tree opposite Lockspound Miss Knight said she had been asked to bring before the Council the matter of a dangerous Tree opposite Lockspound, Ricketts Hill. The Clerk said she would investigate.

Beech Trees
opposite The
Rectory

The Clerk said that she had phoned the Surveyor about the cutting down of some Beech Trees opposite The Rectory, these being scheduled in 1937 & 1947 for preservation. In a written reply the Surveyor said that expert advice had been obtained, and the Trees had been found unsafe, so that no alternative decision had been possible.
